## PARLIAMENTARY BUREAU: CONSIDERATION OF SCOTTISH STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS

### MADE AFFIRMATIVE INSTRUMENTS

1. Parliamentary approval of the regulations requires to be given by 17 and 20 June 2021, respectively.

2. As Session 6 committees are yet to be established, the Bureau is invited to consider lodging a motion suspending Rule 10.1.3(a) and Rule 10.3.3 (which require consideration by the DPLR Committee) and recommending that the regulations be considered by the Parliament. The Scottish Government would then lodge motions seeking the Parliament's approval of the regulations. If the relevant committees are established to allow committee scrutiny to take place then the standard scrutiny arrangements will apply.

# Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Restrictions and Requirements) (Local Levels) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 24) Regulations 2021 (SSI 2021/211) – approval by 17 June

#### Purpose

3. To adjust the travel restrictions between Scotland and parts of the Common Travel Area to address increased prevalence in some areas. The regulations came into force on 22 May 2021.

### Health Protection (Coronavirus) (International Travel) (Scotland) Amendment (No. 11) Regulations 2021 (SSI 2021/212) – approval by 20 June

### Purpose

4. To limit the exemption of seafarers and inspectors and surveyors of ships from the requirement of entering at designated ports and complying with a managed self-isolation package. The regulations came into force on 25 May 2021.

### OTHER INSTRUMENTS

5. Consideration by the DPLR Committee requires to be given no later than 22 days after these instruments were laid.

6. As Session 6 committees are yet to be established, the Bureau is invited to consider lodging a motion suspending Rule 10.3.2, which requires consideration by the DPLR Committee, in respect of the instruments listed below. As these are negative or 'not laid' instruments they do not require the Parliament's approval and no additional further action is needed. Once the relevant committees are established to allow committee scrutiny to take place then the standard scrutiny arrangements for future instruments will apply.

### Decision
