Culture Counts Mission

Our mission is to work with members to:

- promote the public benefit of the arts, heritage, and creative industries
- protect the eco-system of the arts, heritage, and creative industries for our common future, through administration and policy change
- demystify the operations of Government and Parliament; allowing more people from the arts, heritage, and creative industries to influence policies that impact on them.

Summary of Recommendations

- 1. Legislate to allow local authorities to introduce Transient Visitor Levy schemes, to be used to support local arts, heritage, creative industries, and visitor attractions.
- 2. Introduce a % for culture scheme from all Scottish Government infrastructure projects as soon as possible. This is an SNP manifesto commitment and should be realised as a matter of urgency.
- 3. Increase the culture budget by 20%, to meet the ambitions of young people, improve skills infrastructure, ensure fair work, carbon reduction and to ensure that improvements in equality, diversity, and inclusion are realised.
- 4. Invest in a <u>leadership scheme</u> to ensure that people from diverse backgrounds are heard at an early stage in the design process across Scottish Government policy-making and strategic thinking.
- 5. Provide financial support to manage the decrease in ticket sales due to the cost-of-living crises and to invest in audience development schemes to mitigate against Covid-19 habit change, provide financial support to manage the increase in energy prices.
- 6. Introduce a fully funded apprenticeship scheme to support 10-20 apprenticeships in live events technical staff, which is a major current skills shortage.
- 7. Ensure that Creative Scotland and Historic Environment Scotland are invited as Statutory Consultees onto all Scottish Government Infrastructure Projects.
- 8. Explore the possibilities (within the review of the Community Empowerment Act) of leasing more venues to cultural organisations on 'peppercorn' rent agreements. This would allow for vital improvements

- particularly in town centres in terms of both the day and night-time economies.
- 9. Support local authorities to drastically reduce or remove rates (ie. taxes place on cultural business) for arts, heritage, and creative industries organisations, allowing organisations to viably repurpose empty buildings in high streets across the country.
- 10. The Community Wealth Building Bill should explore the possibility of a nationwide policy, where any contract under £15k goes to the local anchor network or community interest company to source a delivery partner, and not out to competitive procurement.
- 11. Scottish Government working with the Centre for Cultural Value should host a Cultural Value Summit in 2023/24. There is a need to improve understanding of cultural value at local level.
- 12. In direct response to Brexit and in support of creative people across the nation: the Scottish Government should invest in an 'Office for Cultural Exchange' safeguarding international touring, festivals, and residencies.

Inquiry Questions

1. How are budgetary decisions supporting the recovery of the sector from COVID and what should be the Scottish Government's priorities in supporting recovery through Budget 2023-24?

The spending review does not support the recovery of the culture sector from Covid-19; however, the spending review is not the budget, and we hope that the budget will support the sector to recover from Covid-19.

In budget years 2020 and 2021 the Scottish Government and the UK Government worked well together to support the sector to avoid mass job losses and general destruction.

We did not avoid all problems though, for example we now have a major skills shortage of technical staff to cover live events and performing arts; and organisations and venues have a major lack of reserves and will struggle to get through winter 2022 without support. Ticket sales are down due to the cost-of-living crises and energy prices are set to increase again in 2022.

In terms of the future and looking towards 2023/24, it's important to consider the budget landscape in the lead up to 2023/24. The following events provide a background to where the sector will be starting from in April 2023.

 real terms cuts due to inflation at national level, non-inflationary budgets or less from 2012-2022 (Scottish Government Figures)

- real terms and severe cash cuts at local level, 13.8% cuts 2012-2019 (Audit Scotland figures)
- lack of reserves due to impact of Covid-19, (closure or reduced capacity for 24-30 months)
- habit change, audiences not returning post Covid-19 (<u>Centre for Cultural Value</u> Research)
- decrease in access to EU markets due to Brexit, January 2020 (loss of access to live touring EU markets). In 2019, 45% of the creative industries service exports markets went to the EU. (Creative Industries Federation)
- major increase in energy prices
- cost of living impact on ticket sales (Federation of Scottish Theatre)
- shortage of live events and performing arts technical staff since 2021 (Various venues inc Fife Culture Trust, SECC, National Theatre Scotland)

Real Terms Cuts (National)

On the national level it's important to remember that most parts of the sector received standstill budgets for the decade in the lead up to both Brexit and Covid-19. National Performing Companies being the worst affected. This creates an imbalance on the production of culture. It's important to have a balance of both production and distribution of culture within the overall eco-system.

<u>Local Cuts</u> At the local level, Audit Scotland reported a 13.9% reduction in investment in culture between 2014 and 2019 (see budget inquiry evidence 2021). The local cuts are more obvious than the national, for example libraries operating on reduced opening hours; community centres closing and almost no opportunities for young people to take part in things like local authority (or ALEO) produced summer arts programmes. Some summer arts programmes still exist, though across the country they are few and far between and are nowhere near level with opportunities for participation in sports.

Reserves

There are issues with reserves across Scotland. Many venues and organisations had to use up their reserves throughout Covid-19 closures. This fuelled the skills shortages as the pipelines closed. Energy prices in winter 2022 may force some venues and organisations to close for good, unless government support comes through.

Brexit

There are still issues with accessing the EU marketplace. As far as we know arrangements for bilateral work visas have been arranged for 24 of 27 EU countries, though there is still a major issue to be resolved in terms of access to work permits, and both are required for touring. Work permits and visas are costly and time consuming to arrange. The ideal scenario would be for the UK

Government to enter into a bilateral agreement with the EU for arts, heritage, and creative industries workers to be able to move freely and to work for up to 6 months at a time.

There are also several in-bound issues for festivals which remain, for example the Home Office holding onto passports for too long, curtailing artists ability to apply for visa's they need for other events. The application is costly and processing times are too long and at times up to four weeks more than advertised.

Energy Prices

Energy prices for organisations, particularly those with buildings are a major issue. Due to the energy price increase swimming pools have already closed in Scotland and that's before the price increase which is set for October. Most are already paying +50% on what they were paying last year, and many will see a further 33% hike in October.

Skills Shortage

Covid-19 shut down live events though continued to allow film and tv to operate. Therefor live events technical staff went to film and tv and the pipeline to train new technical staff for live was cut off.

The sector now has a major shortage of live technical staff. One local authority can only operate a fifth of their venues at one time, due to the shortage of live technical staff.

Scottish Government should introduce a fully funded apprenticeship scheme to support 10-20 apprenticeships in live events technical staff, which is a major current skills shortage.

What should be the Scottish Governments priorities?

Rebalancing Investment

To actively support the rebalancing of the major decline in cultural investment at local level, it is vital that (as set out in the SNP Manifesto) the Scottish Government introduce a % for culture scheme as soon as possible. The Scottish Government should also legislate to allow local authorities to operate a transient visitor levy as soon as possible.

Scottish Government should ensure that Creative Scotland and Historic Environment Scotland are invited as Statutory Consultees onto all Scottish Government Infrastructure Projects. This would ensure that the potential for the cultural economy to improve bids is realised and not overlooked.

The Community Wealth Building Bill should explore the possibility of a nationwide policy, where any contract under £15k goes to the local anchor network or community interest company to source a delivery partner, and not out to competitive procurement, or not to private companies based out-with the area, whose sole purpose is their own singular economic growth.

Increase the culture budget by 20%, to meet the ambitions of young people, improve skills infrastructure, ensure fair work, carbon reduction and to ensure that improvements in equality, diversity, and inclusion are realised.

Provide financial support to manage the decrease in ticket sales due to the cost-of-living crises and to invest in audience development schemes to mitigate against Covid-19 habit change, provide financial support to manage the increase in energy prices.

Equality, Diversity, and Inclusion

Invest in a leadership scheme to ensure that people from diverse backgrounds are heard at an early stage in the design process across Scottish Government policymaking and strategic thinking.

Skills Shortages

To rebalance the skills shortage caused by Covid-19, introduce a fully funded apprenticeship scheme for live event technicians. Approx cost £350k to £500k for 10-20 x 1-year fast track apprentices. National Companies, the FST, event and festival sector could house apprentices throughout 2023/24 working closely with Skills Development Scotland who already have an apprenticeship scheme framework for the role set up: https://www.apprenticeships.scot/browse-frameworks/modern-apprenticeships/creative-and-cultural/employer-creative-and-cultural/

Understanding Cultural Value at Local Level

Scottish Government working with the Centre for Cultural Value should host a Cultural Value Summit in 2023/24.

There is a need to improve understanding of cultural value at local level. For example: Arts and Culture organisations are eligible to apply to deliver on Mental Health and Wellbeing targets via the Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund, though they are being overlooked at local level.

In some cases, local delivery partners such as third sector interface organisations do not always understand why they would invest Mental Health and Wellbeing funds into cultural organisations to achieve outcomes. The value of sport is well understood

though culture less so, there is also occasionally an assumption that arts and culture should be treated differently than other third sector organisations and that they should seek funding elsewhere and not apply into general third sector funds.

There is an urgent need to improve the understanding of the value of culture at local level.

Support for Organisations, Venues and Freelancers

Organisations and venues will require financial support to manage the decline in ticket sales due to the cost-of-living crises, audience Covid-19 habit change, and will also need financial support to manage the increase in energy prices.

Venues in receipt of support should where possible provide space for freelancers (who will need somewhere warm to work every day) through the winter months.

The Community Empowerment Act Review should consider the fact that local authorities can often not afford to asset transfer potential cultural venues because they need to borrow against the capital. Scotland needs to explore leasing more venues to cultural organisations on 'peppercorn' rent agreements. This makes vital improvements particularly in town centres in terms of both the day and night-time economies.

Rates relief for arts, heritage and creative industries needs to be drastically reduced for most organisations to viably repurpose empty buildings in high streets across the country.

Support for Cultural Trade and Exchange

In direct response to Brexit and in support of creative people across the nation: the Scottish Government should invest in an 'Office for Cultural Exchange' safeguarding international touring, festivals, and residencies.

Inquiry Question 2

Despite an increasing recognition of the established health and wellbeing benefits of culture, the Committee has previously heard that this had not led to transformational change in terms of both a cross-cutting approach within Government and increased budgetary support for culture across a number of spending areas - what needs to change to embed culture and health and wellbeing across government and the public sector.

Please note:

The Arts in Education Recovery Group should be consulted on arts and education cross policy working. They may not have had capacity to respond to this inquiry and as such should be considered to give evidence as the discussion continues.

Likewise, the Arts, Culture, Health and Wellbeing Network should be consulted on cross policy working between arts and health.

Part 1

What is arts?

The culture sector is keen to work with health and education, though how we get there has always and continues to be an issue.

One Third Sector Interface (TSI) that we spoke to who distribute national health and wellbeing funds locally approx. £132,000 annually, told us that arts organisations are not eligible to apply because they "have a special pot just for arts which is distributed by the local arts council" approx. £8000 annually.

We were very concerned about this as it seemed that the local TSI had decided to treat arts and culture separately, unable to see their own bias and ignoring the eligibility guidelines.

However, the interesting part here is that when we received our Freedom of Information Request detail (see Annex 2), this TSI did fund arts projects. Around 20% of the projects they funded were arts projects. Possibly what we mean by arts organisations and what TSI's understand to be arts organisations are different things?

Part 1 b

Glasgow City Council changed their investment criteria (Sept 2020) for third sector organisations, which cut off arts and culture organisations working in the city. This ill-thought-through decision was realised (due to arts and culture organisation campaigning) and has now been remedied. The Communities Fund now aims to aims to tackle poverty and inequality through:

- Building the skills, capacity and resilience of individuals and communities
- Supporting activities and services that will enable and empower communities to become involved in the social, economic, and **cultural life of the city**

Arts and culture organisations managed to fix this, this time, but they do not have the capacity (particularly post Brexit and Covid-19) to deal with the lack of knowledge around cultural value on an ongoing basis.

Part 2

Business Models

Those who work in health and education are largely employees with permanent contracts; whereas those who deliver arts and culture are usually in precarious work, working contract to contract.

Sometimes that simple fact is a huge barrier, for example there is sometimes an assumption from health and education that the culture sector is funded in the same way that they are. Essentially health and education don't understand that culture don't have any money!

At an arts and health meet-up I once heard the phrase 'all the arts and culture do is talk about working with health, but they never actually do anything'. That's because we can't do anything until we're commissioned, we don't have people on a permanent contract ready to deliver, it needs to be commissioned. Some Health Board staff know this (particularly those who are artists who happen to work in health), though others don't. Are Health waiting for Culture to make them an offer, and Culture are waiting for Health to make them an offer?

ALISS: To support the development of understanding and learning about each other, Arts and Culture Organisations, either directly or through their community partners depending on how activities are accessed - need to ensure that their activities are visible on ALISS A Local Information System for Scotland.

Arts, heritage, and creative industries organisations can ensure that the cultural offer that they do have is further assessable to communities by being visible to people in Scotland by adding their information to ALISS – A Local Information System for Scotland – a web-based resource for community assets. online database of activity.

Any organisations or individual can add information to ALISS without being members of Health and Social Care Alliance Scotland. Uploading information about services, groups, activities, and resources is free and it allows Community Links Workers and other health and social care professionals to direct people towards activities to support their health and wellbeing.' https://www.aliss.org/#

Part 3 Stakeholders, Connections and Understanding

To improve connections and general understanding between arts, heritage and creative industries and the health sector; Scottish Government working with the Centre for Cultural Value should host a Cultural Value Summit in 2023/24. There is a need to improve understanding of cultural value at local level. Council leaders should be invited, to help to avoid the situation that happened in Glasgow from happening again.

There are several organisations involved at local level, for example:

Cross Policy Work Areas

As above we referred to the Mental Health and Wellbeing Fund, though other key cross-over areas to consider include:

- SG Reshaping Care for Older People
- SG Scottish Attainment Challenge

Inquiry Question 3

The Scottish Government's independent Advisory Group on Economic Recovery in the wake of COVID-19 recommended that Ministers should in relation to the creative sector seek "ways to increase public and private investment across the sector to allow it to recover and compete" – can you provide examples of where this is happening or ways in which it should happen.

The recent decision to decrease the culture and business fund by 33% goes entirely against the advice of the Economic Recovery Group. Arts and Business Cuts https://www.insider.co.uk/news/arts--business-scotland-chair-27365321

The Scottish Government have invested in Scotland Food and Drink and have also invested in Screen Scotland; though there are many other areas of the creative industries who could deliver major economic results and we hope to see some of that ambition within the work of the new International Hubs and within the Cultural Diplomacy Strategy.

In direct response to Brexit and in support of creative people across the nation: the Scottish Government should invest in an 'Office for Cultural Exchange' safeguarding international touring, festivals, and residencies.

Scotland has an international outlook and to support and protect that part of our culture, our people need to interact with the international community. We currently

share ideas internationally through our world-class network of festivals and residencies. For example: Margaret Atwood Residency at Cove Park; Arundhati Roy at Edinburgh International Book Festival. The combination of Brexit and ill-considered immigration policies threaten our reputation and ability to share in international learning and development. The 'Office for Cultural Exchange' would support the cultural sector to ensure that we are able to host, and share ideas with the most talented, innovative, artists, thinkers and activists from across the globe.

Scotland is a small marketplace and the livelihoods of many creative freelancers as well as organisations depend on finding audiences beyond our shores. 45% of the current UK creative industries service exports go to the EU, we need to be able to work in the EU, upfront costs and administrative costs of visas, work permits, local taxes and vat could exclude us from competing in an EU market. The 'Office for Cultural Exchange' would support the cultural sector to compete in an EU market by supporting the sector to navigate the new relationship.

The strength of Scotland's cultural reputation brings us a voice in international dialogue far beyond our size. The Office for Cultural Exchange would support the cultural sector to connect with individuals, organisations and institutions across Europe and target countries, making Scotland an attractive partner for European Partnership Projects and for wider global collaborations.

Inquiry Question 4

The Committee has previously agreed with COSLA that a 'whole system' approach is essential to the spending review and that this is consistent with an outcomes-focused and collaborative approach; our view is that it is only through such an approach that the necessary funding can be freed up to ensure that sufficient cultural services are available to meet the increased demand arising from cultural prescribing – what progress has been made in moving towards a whole system approach, what are the main barriers and how do we overcome them;

The issue covered above around the lack of understanding of the value and impact of the culture sector may also be alive and well within COSLA.

For example there is support for sports, for example the following consultation briefing: https://www.cosla.gov.uk/ data/assets/pdf_file/0021/24942/COSLA-PA-Contribution-Briefing-V8.pdf

We asked for a similar version for culture and were told that there is no capacity for this. Sport and Culture have the same status within the National Performance Framework and within the Improvement Service the understanding of value is there. Though it seems that bias and self-selection of what's important is playing a part within COSLA.

It would be interesting to investigate if a potential lack of board diversity is playing a part in the preference for sports over arts, heritage, and creative industries. The detail

of who is on the board of COSLA is not available on the website. The detail of who is on the Community Wellbeing Board is not available on the website.

It's understood that budget cuts are impacting on local authorities, which is why we recommend TVL and % for culture schemes. We don't understand why the policy can't be aligned with sport though.

Inquiry Question 5

The Committee's view is that it is essential that, wherever practical, multi-year funding for the cultural organisations the Scottish Government supports is passed on to the groups and individuals being funded who should, where appropriate, also receive a multi-year settlement – what progress has been made in moving towards multi-year funding, what are the main barriers and how do we overcome them.

Creative Scotland have now launched their new funding framework. It's too early to say if this will be successful and inevitably there will be teething problems. There is currently no solution to the fact that there is not enough money to fund the level of ambition that applicants have.

Increasing the national culture budget by at least 20%, would go some way to creating an atmosphere of ambition again in the sector and would go a long way to achieving results in EDI, Fair work, and Carbon Emissions, which without increased investment are near impossible. With no new increase in investment, it will be very difficult to bring in new entrants to the sector, which may create a skills shortage in around two years' time.

Scotland's spend on culture as a percentage of GDP is one of the lowest in Europe (Scottish Government Stats + Audit Scotland Stats / Eurostat) and this does need to change if ambitions for the country are to be realised, and the health and wellbeing of the nation improved. Culture is not an add on or a choice, it's a necessity and the basis of how people connect and belong in their communities.

Culture is a wide variety of opportunities to connect and belong and this is a fundamental part of good health and wellbeing.

The arts, heritage and creative industries deliver across a range of activities, from artists working in hospitals, the protection of the historic environment, to successful tv, film and games industries.

The arts, heritage, and creative industries have been on standstill budgets for over a decade, and I hope that a policy of slow decline is not set to continue. The Spending Review is not a budget and I envisage that what is outlined is the minimum intended spend over the period.

The real-term cuts over the previous decade have already had a major impact on the sectors ability to make improvements in the areas of carbon reduction, fair work and equality, diversity, and inclusion. When investment in the sector is systematically reduced, ticket prices climb and cut off those who cannot afford to participate; both in terms of workforce and audiences.

The workforce will attract those with an interest which is developed in younger years. If half the population are cut off from experiencing the culture sector, they're not going to be attracted to it. The sector then misses out on the huge benefits of a diverse workforce. A diverse workforce in the culture sector is a necessity, declining diversity threatens the entire sector's ability to innovate and compete.

The Spending Review seems to show a disconnect between where Scotland wants to be in policy terms and the reality on the ground.

For example, Cuts to business support, while prioritising a culture of entrepreneurship within the Scotland's National Strategy for Economic Transformation. We have a Community Empowerment Act; though there has been little improvement in community ownership, as local authorities need buildings to borrow against the capital. We aim to improve our town centres, though we're applying unaffordable business rates, discouraging potential entrepreneurs from setting up and delivering for communities. It's a struggle to understand who Scottish Government envisage, or hope is able to succeed and prosper in this environment?

There's a slightly unclear pathway to the Scotland we all want to see. The key to moving past Thatcherism is encouraging people to connect with each other; to take collective responsibility and to feel a sense of belonging in their communities. That's what the arts, heritage and creative industries are; opportunities for connection and belonging.

There are three key areas to the arts, heritage and creative industries that are vital to maintain a minimum eco-system throughout a time of financial hardship. For example, investment in:

Production Writing screenplays, curating exhibitions, designing computer

games, classes, clubs, and workshops, creating productions

Distribution Festivals, events, trade shows, exhibitions, touring

Infrastructure Buildings, theatres, cinemas, libraries, museums, galleries,

networks, support organisations

All rely equally on each other. There is devastating declining investment in all three of the above areas at National level and at Local level. To mitigate against that the sector will need support to create new income streams and to work in partnership with cross-portfolio areas of Government. There are a range of benefits to working with the arts, heritage, and creative industries to achieve outcomes; outlined here.

It is now vital that Scottish Government prioritise:

% for Arts Scheme % from Scottish Government infrastructure projects to be

collected and placed in an endowment fund to be redistributed

to enable arts and culture activity

Transient Visitor Levy Enable local authorities to introduce TVL and to encourage ring-

fencing income for arts and culture

Cross Policy Working Take a strategic approach to Cross Policy Working, mapping out

where arts, heritage and creative industries can deliver on outcomes across Justice; Social Security; Health; Education and Economy. Ensure culture is not overlooked and is included in criteria guidelines for investment and are listed as statutory

consultees.

The sector is light on its feet, creative, innovative, and full of people who love to collaborate to make things happen, who are empowered by working closely with their communities.




What sector do you work in?


How many staff work for your organisation? (Write '1' if you're a freelancer/sole trader)


Increased energy prices are impacting our operations

What are the projections for this financial year?

Data

The service charges we pay with our office rent are increasing from £3945 to £9075 per year. Fuel cost increases of 40% have had to be included in our budget for 2022-23

Our energy prices have doubled since April and we are now in a new three year deal on these rates. The main disadvantage above the increased pricing is the environmental sacrifice we had to make as when we were researching new suppliers, with greener tariffs being high or our agenda, we could not find a supplier to commit to a price at the time we needed it.

The projections are showing a 58% increase in gas prices and a 74% increase in electricity prices. This is crippling given that the sector is just getting back on it's feet after covid.

As an independent production company at this point we do not know how the energy price increases will impact - we don't own a venue and rent an office where energy bills are included. However, we do have major concerns on the knock on affects in the future and how these price increases will affect venues that we work with - increased rental prices, venues staying open etc. which will have a detrimental impact on our capacity to deliver work.

The impact is going to be in the charging of equipment that is currently being used for a project, as well as the cost of fuel.

I primarily work from home and have on average a 30% increase in costs, this is not in isolation as the cost of food has also increased. I'm seriously considering that my career currently is not sustainable given the rise in energy costs.

We budgeted for 50% rise in energy prices in 2022/23. Time will tell if this is an underestimation. One of our buildings is impacted as we pay utilities. Our main building energy is included in our rent. We are on year 2 of a 5 year lease in that building.

My studio rental includes all utilities and increases by 17% from 1 June to cover the cost fuel rises. I expect the cost of materials, shipping and maintenance to rise by a similar amount.

Income rates are being lowered, or held at stand still as the organisations I work for are struggling to cover costs. Current offers of work see approximately a 25% decrease in day rates, which have also largely been at standstill for I excess of a decade. As a freelancer, increasing fuel rates are impacting considerations around taking contracts. Being rurally based with a limited travel infrastructure, I am reliant on driving to work but many contracts are now being offered with rates inclusive of travel meaning fuel rate increases are directly passed on to the freelancer. Working from home is also becoming increasingly complex in terms of keeping the heating on.

As we are a small organisation, we are very flexible with our staff regarding place of work. The majority of our staff have a hybrid structure of office and home working. Where the office work has energy covered, I wouldn't be surprised if our rental will go up in price, as the venue will not be able to support the increase in prices for all rented units. In regards to home working, we can not have our staff working in poor conditions when it comes to heating and electricity. They need sufficient energy supplies so that it doesn't impact the work. For example, more electricity is used during the day as their computers are plugged in, lights are used, as well as home facilities. We currently pay a home working allowance but this has not increased since the energy prices went up. We would therefore need to provide a higher work from home allowance. As a small charity, this may not be sustainable for us.

Prices are set to rise by 40% so will have to become more efficient elsewhere to make up for it.



What are the projections for this financial year?

Data

I mostly work at home and have already started to feel the impact of the energy bills - not sure how we will realistically stay warm in the winter.

We can't be specific due to the nature of our programming budget but on average theatre performance fees have increased by £127. Based on the average annual performance numbers that would add an extra £10,160 in fees. We would have to reduce performances to around 67 from 80 thus reducing cultural activity in rural communities quite significantly

£50k per annum for electricity my new site. Triple what we were expecting. Scottish Power not open to negotiation rates and being charged £1.02 per kwh!

The cost of everything is going up and unless this is reflected in extra funding there will have to be compromised artistically to absorb this.

Energy prices are having no direct impact on our work as we are all working from home. I don't know what impact it is having on the staff, but I haven't had any comments from them. (We pay the £26/month allowance for working from home as permitted by HMRC). As we move back into an office it may increase the price - up to now we have recieved free office accommodation but this is unlikely to continue.

Unknown, but I suspect that the increase energy prices are going to hit home soon. I'm a ceramicist using an electric kiln and the price increases will see an increase in how much it costs to fire my kiln, which has a huge knock on effect you every other part of my making practice. I suspect there will also be another price increase in studio fees because of it too at some point.

The energy bills have increased by over 200%, nothing like the 54% often quoted, and this is echoed by and across other people and businesses we work with, meaning our monthly cashflow is affected by a proportionate decrease, meaning our project, funding, sponsorship and budget forecasts written months ago are also seriously affected and essentially worth far less than anticipated, especially when crossed against fast rising travel costs due to lack of trains. Also shocked to learn via Accountant that there is zero change post price cap removal in the Tax / Energy situation for home workers, it all means we're far worse off than even this time last year in real terms.

So far, this year my Energy prices have doubled.

Materials on projects paused by the pandemic have moved the viability of the delivery of each project. Material costs have gone up y at least 10% - more in some areas.

We are anticipating a 300% increase in gas prices and 100% increase in electricity prices from 1/7 and 1/10 respectively when our existing deals expire, amounting to approximately £150,000 additional costs in a full year.

Spaces for Creativity

A report from Creative Lives January 2022







Executive summary

Local creative groups are crying out for suitable venues

Creative Lives is a registered charity established in 1991, that champions community and volunteer-led creative activity.

In late 2021, as indoor creative activity was starting to resume after the restrictions of the Covid-19 pandemic, Creative Lives conducted a survey to gather evidence about the issues facing creative groups and venues in the UK and Ireland.

The survey captured a transition point of activity: of the groups that were gathering again, just over half (51%) of the creative groups were back meeting indoors, with 42% in a mix of remote and in-person, and the remainder meeting entirely remotely (6%) or outdoors (1%).

We found a wide array of issues as creative groups started to reconvene after the restrictions of the pandemic, but the overall picture is that local creative groups are struggling to find suitable venues in which to meet. Groups reported difficulties finding large enough venues with adequate ventilation; restrictions on their activities or participant numbers; and finding accessible venues at a reasonable cost.

To help address these difficulties and create an environment that is more supportive of community-based creative activity than before the pandemic, Creative Lives will be embarking on a new phase of work to support restarting local creative activity, including publishing guidance for venues; offering micro-grants; sharing case studies demonstrating innovative use of public space; building new alliances and piloting new initiatives that open up public spaces to creative groups.

Introduction

The importance of appropriate community venues is a perennial issue for voluntary creative groups. In order to practice their creativity together, people need affordable and suitable places to meet, to rehearse, to practice and to perform.

Creative Lives has made 'Opening up more public spaces for creative cultural activity' one of its <u>three strategic priorities</u>, and we explored the issue in our 2019 report '<u>Common Ground: Rewilding the Garden</u>': identifying 'space' as one of the three requisites for supporting local creative cultural activity.

With this survey, Creative Lives attempted to build a picture of the prepandemic and current needs and concerns for creative groups and the spaces they occupy. We also wanted to hear about exciting and innovative uses of different spaces for creative cultural activity.

The following report presents an overview of our findings and assessment of the current situation. It is important to note that the survey was live during November and December 2021, during which pandemic restrictions were generally low and many creative groups were reconvening in person. Most responses came in before concerns about the Omicron variant resulted in new restrictions.



Overview of responses

The purpose of the survey was to ascertain the pre-pandemic and current needs and concerns of creative groups and the spaces they occupy.

We received just under 200 responses to the survey from creative groups and venues across the UK and Republic of Ireland.

80% of the responses were from creative groups and 20% from venues, although a total of 15 creative groups reported owning their own venue.

Creative groups reported taking part in a hugely diverse range of creative activities, from singing, music, drama, crafts, writing and visual arts to photography, film, digital creativity, circus, comedy and hip hop. This diversity of artform was reflected in the range of activities hosted by the venues.

According to the survey, 51% of creative groups were back meeting indoors, with 42% of respondents operating in a mix of remote and in-person. 6% of respondents reported meeting entirely remotely, and just 1% meeting outdoors.

Although only 1% of the groups reported currently meeting entirely outdoors, many reported previous difficulties in convening outside, particularly in the warmer months, with adverse weather and finding suitable facilities (such as toilets) being the most commonly cited issues. Securing appropriate permission was cited by 23% of respondents; with health & safety concerns also reported by some.

Inevitably, what the survey doesn't fully capture is the creative groups who have closed or are still in abeyance since the start of the pandemic, although many comments testify to the difficulties:



We have practically had to stop singing as it is too difficult online and it's too cold to be outside. It's a real heartbreak as we had kept the group going through thick and thin for a number of years!

Creative groups and venues - Before the pandemic

Prior to the Covid-19 pandemic, creative activity took place most commonly in community centres, church halls, schools, arts centres, libraries and pubs as well as members' homes.

Creative groups are distinctive as the majority don't own their own buildings (just 10% of respondents to our survey owned their own space), but meet in a wide range of venues managed across the public, private and voluntary sectors. The diversity of different venues cited by creative groups (which also included museums, working men's clubs and farms) testifies to their flexibility and adaptability. Our biennial <u>Big Conversation surveys</u> have previously found that creative groups were characterised by remarkable positivity, resilience and determination.

The following issues were cited as the most important criteria for choosing a venue for creative activity:

- 1. Physical accessibility of the building
- 2. Location, suitable travel and parking
- 3. Availability of appropriate equipment and flexible opening times
- 4. Affordability

Using the same criteria, we also asked what were the main challenges in finding a suitable venue:

- 1. Storage options
- 2. Suitable travel and parking
- 3. Flexible opening times and appropriate equipment

But of course many groups reported that finding any venue at the moment was extremely difficult.

Creative groups and venues - Current issues

Prior to the pandemic, creative groups were already experiencing difficulties in finding venues due to cuts to public funding resulting in the closure of public buildings, and commercial hire rates (across sectors) exceeding the budget of many groups.

We wanted to establish an understanding of current hire costs, so our survey asked about the approximate hourly hire cost groups currently pay, and the average cost across all nations was £22 per hour, with a range from from 'free' to £100.

We also wanted to explore the nature of the relationships between creative groups and their venues, so asked if creative groups received any additional support from their venue. Many groups reported 'no', but this was by no means a single view, as others reported highly supportive relationships with their venues, that provided help with publicity and advertising (e.g. mention in a newsletter, social media); and help with set up, equipment, tables etc. Many groups mentioned friendly venue staff as a key benefit.



The council says they can't afford the additional cleaning costs but we can see a very real cost to our young people's mental and physical welfare.



But the majority of creative groups reported recent difficulties in finding a suitable venue, giving a picture of the numerous issues in restarting creative activity safely across the nations:

- We heard that some creative groups have ceased because venues aren't available, with others reporting that many venues haven't reopened yet.
- Many groups reported moving venues when previous venues were closed or no longer suitable.

- One of the most commonly-cited problems was finding big enough venues to enable social distancing and appropriate ventilation - with some groups reporting that they had to split into two in order to continue safely, and others having to turn away new members once they reached venue capacity.
- Many groups were experiencing restrictions to participant numbers and opening times, as well as restrictions on the activities that could take place.
- Some groups reported that many participants and audiences were still uneasy about returning to indoor activity, making regrouping unviable.
- And some reported frustrations with the changing guidance from governments.

We also asked what one thing would make the most difference to your group's ability to find and use the space you need? The top answer, unsurprisingly, was reasonable cost. The next thing most commonly requested was sufficient storage space and access, both in terms of public transport and free parking, and accessibility of the venues. Creative groups also expressed a need for flexible opening hours, as well as flexibility more generally for the different requirements of creative groups. Some groups expressed a desire for their own space.



We need continuity - a place of our own that would become a hub of activity.

It's clear that the pandemic and its attendant restrictions have had a devastating impact on creative groups' ability to reconvene in person: an impact that is continuing with the difficulties in finding suitable venues. The restrictions have meant that previous activities have needed to change. For example, large rooms with open windows and doors, combined with the need for face coverings, have made hearing others clearly a near impossibility.

The view from the venues

We invited venues where creative groups meet to share their views about the current levels of in-person and indoor activity.

The venues that responded host a diverse range of artforms, and the majority offer accessible entry, storage and flexible opening times, as well as equipment and catering.

37% of the venues reported that users have fully returned since restrictions eased, with 58% reporting partial return, and just 5% reporting that no groups have returned.


We asked venues about issues that might prevent activity from restarting. Responses mirrored those of the creative groups: lack of space limiting numbers; sufficient ventilation; and limitations on activity due to the current guidelines. Some venues cited problems due to staff shortages, and anxiety from participants about returning to in-person activity.

A large majority (95%) of venue respondents reported that they would like to attract more creative groups to their venue.



We encourage an exchange of ideas and have residential accommodation for groups on site.

Conclusion and next steps



We'd like venues to have a specific community agenda where they are encouraged to help those providing genuine community-building activities.

The importance of involvement in community-based creative activity cannot be overstated, and the loss of communal arts practice during the pandemic was profound.

There are numerous proven benefits to individuals of participation in creative cultural activity - such as improved health, wellbeing and social connection - and research (e.g. <u>Connected Communities</u>: <u>The role of grassroots arts activities in communities</u>) has enumerated the benefits of creative activity to venues and communities. These include grassroots arts activities generating a considerable amount of economic activity and value; rendering a community more aesthetically pleasing; contributing to a sense of identity and community cohesion; and improving community image and identity.

The <u>UCL Covid-19 Social Study</u> has shown that for some demographic groups, there has been a considerable increase in the risk of loneliness during the pandemic. We know from our biennial surveys of creative participation (e.g. <u>Big Conversation 2018</u>) that the primary reason for joining a creative group is to connect with others, and that involvement in communal creative activity is hugely beneficial for improving social connection and reducing loneliness.

While many creative groups responded imaginatively to the pandemic restrictions by meeting remotely, there is now an urgent need to facilitate the restarting of creative activity in person - safely within national guidelines. There is also an opportunity to build on the increased interest in everyday creativity that occurred during the national lockdowns. The availability of venues is one of the most important conditions that will help more people and communities realise the manifold benefits of shared creative activity.

With 'Spaces for Creativity' already one of our priorities, Creative Lives will embark on a new, solutions-focused phase of our work. Over the coming months we will:

- Publish a short guide to help venues host creative groups in a way that
 promotes mutual benefit. The venue requirements for most creative
 groups are modest: accessible, affordable and flexible, and this survey
 would suggest that venues would like to attract more creative activity to
 their spaces.
- Offer microgrants to local creative groups to assist with the costs of restarting in-person activity (e.g. <u>Reviving local creativity in Kent</u>, <u>Microgrants in Scotland</u>, <u>Cheshire West Microgrants</u>), and share interesting and innovative examples of public spaces used for creative cultural activity.
- Build new alliances through networks, and pilot new initiatives that open up public spaces to creative groups.
- Advocate for a policy environment that enables community-based creative activity to rebuild and thrive, and that does not adversely impact the ability of people to practice their creativity together."
