

Update on the NPF Indicators in development

Indicator	Status
A positive experience for people coming to Scotland	Draft Indicator and measure now developed, with data up to 2019. Currently in the process of final approval for the indicator and bringing it to publication.
Public services treat people with dignity and respect	A question that may be suitable for inclusion in the Scottish Household Survey (SHS) is currently under review. The earliest that data is likely to be available is in 2023, if question is included in the SHS fieldwork for 2022.
Trust in Public Organisations	Data is currently being collected through a question in the Scottish Household Survey (SHS). The first round of data was collected in 2020 and will be published as part of the SHS data in 2021. However, the SHS data from 2020 is not appropriate for use as a baseline for the national indicator, due to the change required in SHS fieldwork methodology during 2020 as a result of the pandemic. Further work, to be led by the Chief Statistician, will be required to understand the effects of the changes in this methodology and their suitability for reporting in the NPF
Confidence of children and young people	We are working with Local Authorities to implement the Health and Wellbeing (HWB) Census in the 2021-22 school year. The first HWB Census was due to take place in the 2019/20 school year. However, due to school closures caused by COVID-19, planned pilots in both the 2019/20 and 2020/21 school years were abandoned.

International Networks	This indicator is near completion. We are currently in the process of finalising the indicator and bringing it to publication before the end of 2021.
Indicators with no performance arrow	
Contribution of development support to other nations	This indicator incorporates the International Networks indicator, and will be completed when that indicator publishes.
Educational Attainment	Data could not be collected for 4 sub-measures of this indicator due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the requirement for school closures. School leaver

	<p>attainment data, which informs the remaining 3 sub-measures of this indicator, was assigned differently to previous years, being based on teacher assessment. As a consequence, it was not possible to provide a performance arrow for 2019/20.</p> <p>It is also likely that there will be no performance arrow for this NPF indicator for the 2020/21 school year due to the decision to not collect data from S3 pupils, in order to limit the burden on secondary school staff already dealing with other pressures.</p>
Child Social and Physical Development	This indicator was showing no performance arrow until 23/9/2021, when as part of a planned update, the definition of the indicator was changed to bring it up to date, in line with Public Health Scotland publications and enable an appropriate assessment of performance.
Loneliness	This indicator was published in 2019, and currently has one data point. As a result, there is no other point to make a comparison on performance with.
