On 24 January 2023, Maree Todd, the then Minister for Social Care, Mental Wellbeing and Sport provided the Committee with a progress update on the Scottish <u>Becoming</u>

<u>Breastfeeding Friendly</u> (BBF) recommendations as part of a response to a wider inquiry about Perinatal Mental Health.

The BBF report was published in 2019. Scotland's breastfeeding programme and policies scored highly in the report, and it contained eight recommendations where effort to improve the enabling environment to support breastfeeding could be improved. A review of progress against these recommendations was conducted during 2022 and 2023.

As previously mentioned, Ms Todd reported the details of this review to the Committee in her update letter and, at that time, and committed to a further review of progress against the recommendations and to publishing this in 2024. Subsequently, a decision was made to merge the BBF recommendations into the development of the breastfeeding strategic framework, as a foundation to that work, rather than creating a standalone report.

I am pleased to inform the Committee that, in June this year, we published the <u>Breastfeeding</u> and <u>Infant Feeding Strategic Framework</u>. The eight themes within BBF have now been incorporated into the six strategic goals set out in that framework, which will be delivered through the six core components.
