1st September 2021

2 MSPs, 42 Non-MSPs

An initial meeting to re-establish the Cross-Party Group on Cancer which included a brief overview of the ambition for the group in the current session and the election of officer bearers. Following this, the group was joined by Gregor McNie from the Scottish Government's Cancer Policy team who provided an update on the implementation of Recovery and Redesign: An Action Plan for Cancer Services.

1st March 2022

2 MSPs, 66 Non-MSPs

The group was joined by the Cabinet Secretary for Health and Social Care, Humza Yousaf MSP, who updated on the impact of the Covid pandemic on the NHS and cancer services. The CPG agreed to write to the Cabinet Secretary with questions submitted by attendees which had not been taken at the meeting. This was followed by presentations from the Scottish Mesothelioma Network on their work, and from Breast Cancer Now on a secondary breast cancer audit for Scotland.

6th June 2022

4 MSPs, 47 Non-MSPs

The meeting began with a session led by AbbVie, the Blood Cancer Alliance, and CLL Support who presented the report 'Improving Blood Cancer Services in Scotland'. In the next session the Clinical Lead for the Scottish Adult Neuro-Oncology Network (SANON) provided an update on brain / central nervous system cancer. The meeting finished with an introductory presentation from Cancer Card which included a short demo of their new online support hub.

14th December 2022

3 MSPs, 40 Non-MSPs

The meeting included the AGM with the remainder of session led by the Roy Castle Lung Cancer Foundation with a focus on lung screening and early detection. This session explored clinical, research, charity and lived experience perspectives on how we can improve management of and outcomes from lung cancer in Scotland. The group also looked back on the 2022 Scottish Cancer Conference.
