Minutes of Previous Meeting: 12 September 2023

Members approved the minutes from the last meeting.

Time for Reflection

Alasdair MacCallum, Gaelic Development Officer at the Scottish Parliament, told the group about what Time for Reflection is, why it exists and is important. He told the group that Time of Reflection had previously been delivered in different languages and that two of them had been in Gaelic so far.

The group was told that it was an aim in the Scottish Parliament's Gaelic Language Plan to have at least one Time for Reflection be delivered in Gaelic each session. He encouraged MSPs to make nominations for delivering a Time of Reflection in Gaelic this session by contacting TimeforReflection@parliament.scot with the name and contact details of the person they are nominating.

Gaelic Convention on Climate Change

Murdo MacSween provided an introduction to Climate Hebrides and told the group that they had received funding to launch a Climate Hub based in the Outer Hebrides and that their first event had recently been held. The event was held in South Uist and the meeting was held through the medium of Gaelic to encourage local people to take part in the process. It was noted that the feedback they received from the meeting showed that a lot of people had attended because of this provision.

An overview was given on how the meeting was delivered to ensure that it would be open to everyone in the community. The group was told about Climate Hebrides' draft plan for Just Transition and their goals for 2045, the time when Scotland aims to reach net zero. Mention was made of the main areas in the plans, the situation as it currently was and some of the recommendations that came as a result of the event.

Murdo MacSween told the group that the 'Ideas to Action' fund was soon to be published and provided further information of the type of projects that will be funded and the different funds available. This would be open until the end of February 2024 and info@climatehebrides.com should be contacted for further information.

A question was raised about what kind of events could be organised with this funding and Murdo MacSween replied that, as it is a new fund, they were open to all applications and that decisions would be made according to whether it met the objectives of the fund.

AOCB

Professor Rob Dunbar invited members of the group to events by the Council of Europe taking place in Glasgow on the 13th and 14th of December.

Alasdair Allan told Members that the National Gaelic Schools Debate would be taking place after the meeting.

Claire Cullen informed the group that the Scottish Languages Bill was now live and that they were looking forward to working with stakeholders and receiving feedback.

Ealasaid MacDonald, CEO of Bòrd na Gàidhlig, told the group that she had written to the University of Aberdeen and that it would send a strong message if a letter could be sent on behalf of the cross-party group. Members agreed to this proposal.
