The Drug & Alcohol Misuse CPG has a stronger focus on care and services, and the Health Inequalities CPG has a specific focus on preventing and reducing health inequalities.

It is proposed to hold around three or four meetings per year. Topic areas may include international perspectives; corporate influence;

marketing and promotions; and reviewing progress on delivering change. Priorities will be discussed with members.
