1. Welcome, introductions and apologies

Bob Doris MSP chaired the meeting welcomed attendees and invited attendees to introduce themselves in the chat.

3. Matters arising from previous session:

3.1 Bereavement letter

Bob Doris sent a letter to Jeane Freeman on 06 January 2021 voicing the group's support of improvement of bereavement support in Scotland. No reply has been received yet, but Bob Doris' office is seeking an update.

3.2 Strategic Framework for Action: 5 years on

Bob Doris sent a letter to Jeane Freeman on 08 January 2021 outlining the main points from the group's discussion relating to the Strategic Framework for Action (December 2020).

The group were updated that the SNP Manifesto prior to the election included the following commitment:

"We will appoint a new National Clinical Lead for Palliative and End of Life Care for Scotland, who will be responsible for overseeing a national strategy for palliative and end of life care that takes a whole system, public health approach."

What the National Care Service could and should mean for people living with serious life-limiting illness

Heather Frail, Support Choices in Perth and Kinross, bringing a service-user perspective.

Linda Riley, bringing many years of lived experience

Annie Gunner Logan, CEO, Coalition of Care & Support Providers in Scotland Subsequent discussions raised the following issues:

- The importance of giving control to the people who need care.
- The importance of co-production and co-working with the NHS so that services are joined up.
- It is important that the National Care Service isn't 'one size fits all' care needs to be responsive to people's individual and changing needs.
- There can be problems with self-directed support and the lack of choice it enables.
- The importance of people being included of society regardless of the degree of support they need.
- Many people voiced support of the idea of a National Care Service.
- The need for process for self directed support to support the provision of palliative care.
- The complexities and conflicts that are likely to arise given the massive (but worthwhile) task of establishing a National Care Service.
