
Shop

Our exhibition explains the role and history of the Parliament and how Scotland's citizens can get involved.






Travelling the Distance

The Mace

The symbol of the Parliament's authority, it bears the words "There Shall be a Scottish Parliament", the opening line of the Scotland Act 1998.

Presiding Officer's Desk

The Presiding Officer or Deputy chairs debates, ensuring parliamentary business is completed correctly.
