***[S5M-02451](#) Daniel Johnson: Magic Breakfast**—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of the report by the Education Endowment Foundation, *Magic Breakfast*, which is an extensive study involving over 8,000 pupils of the effects of before-school breakfast clubs; notes that the findings suggest that the impact of breakfast clubs are positive, leading to two months' additional progress in educational outcomes, improved behaviour of children, and even improved outcomes for those children who did not attend the breakfast club; understands that this builds on a growing body of evidence into the effect of breakfast clubs on attainment, poverty and hunger, and notes the calls to expand the provision of breakfast clubs in schools and communities in Edinburgh Southern and across the country.

***[S5M-02445](#) Gordon Lindhurst: The Future of Edinburgh's World Heritage Site**—That the Parliament recognises the significance of the contrast between Edinburgh's medieval Old Town and its Georgian New Town and its designation as a World Heritage Site in 1995 by UNESCO, recognising both its historical and architectural importance and efforts to conserve it since 1970; notes that the site is one of five across Scotland; understands that, according to Invest Edinburgh, the city attracts around four million visitors per year, many of whom visit the historic attractions within the World Heritage Site, such as Edinburgh Castle, St Giles Cathedral and the Real Mary King's Close; further understands that the site is a major factor behind the £1.32 billion that is generated through tourism for the local economy each year; recognises that a World Heritage Site is selected based on it having cultural, historical, scientific or other significance and its future preservation is seen to be in the collective interests of humanity; notes the prevailing development plans within Edinburgh's World Heritage Site, such as the decision over the old Royal High School at Calton Hill, and the need to develop Scotland's capital city for the future in order to enhance the performance of its economy; recognises that Edinburgh City Council, Edinburgh World Heritage and Historic Environment Scotland are involved in reviewing the Management Plan for the World Heritage Site (2017-2022), which aims to co-ordinate action to protect and enhance the outstanding universal values of the site and to promote its harmonious adaption to the needs of contemporary life; further recognises that members of the public were recently consulted on the review through a survey, the results of which were published on 1 November 2016; understands

that the results show that, while awareness of the World Heritage Site was rated highly, there was a lack of understanding regarding what it meant and its associated benefits; notes the calls for action at all levels to raise awareness and custodianship of the site and the protection of the historic built environment for current and future generations, and further notes the calls on all those with influence over Edinburgh's current and future planning developments to fully recognise the importance of Edinburgh's World Heritage Site.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

***S5M-02465 Jenny Marra: Ryehill Police Station**—That the Parliament notes the consultations being conducted by Police Scotland into the future of 58 police stations around Scotland; understands that the proposed consultation on the future of Ryehill police station in the west end of Dundee was not on the published list but that the consultation on this station is due to start in January 2017; believes that it is misleading that Ryehill was not included in the list of stations under consideration; understands that closure of the station will be one of the options included in the consultation; further understands that Police Scotland has confirmed that the option of sharing facilities with other public bodies such as the council is not possible in the Ryehill building because of space constraints; notes that Police Scotland has indicated that, if Ryehill is to close, police officers for the west end community won't be based in that area but in the neighbouring council wards of Lochee and Maryfield; believes that this is not the level of service that local residents expect and deserve; considers that, if Ryehill closes, visible policing in the west end would effectively cease; understands that, for this reason, there is strong local opposition to the consultation and potential closure of Ryehill police station, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government and Police Scotland to drop the consultation and keep Ryehill open.

***S5M-02454 Emma Harper: Ending the Illegal Puppy Trade**—That the Parliament notes the reported concerns about the illegal puppy trade and the view that this business is a blight on animal welfare that must be tackled; understands however that the trade is big business in Scotland, with thousands of dogs being brought into the country each year from Ireland in particular; further understands that the Scottish SPCA and activists in Stranraer have been attempting to disrupt such activity at the port of Cairnryan; believes that the animals involved are bred and kept in horrendous conditions, which can lead to illness and death; understands that, as Christmas approaches, more people might be tempted to purchase a puppy; notes the Scottish SPCA's recommendation that people should try to rehome a dog in the first instance but that, if someone is intent on buying a puppy, then they should do so from a reputable and licensed breeder and insist on seeing the puppy's mother and, if possible, father, as well as its living conditions; notes that it also states that puppies should not be purchased in a public place, such as a car park, and that this should set alarm bells ringing if it is suggested by the seller; understands that, while reputable breeders do advertise with it online, the charity generally advises against buying animals via the internet and that searching the seller's phone number online could reveal whether they deal in multiple litters and breeds, and notes the view that tackling illegal trafficking through raising public awareness of it is one of the primary ways that Scotland can begin to disrupt this cruel trade.

***S5M-02410 Andy Wightman: Eviction of Tenant Farmers**—That the Parliament regrets the current situation for some tenant farmers in the Lothian region and across Scotland who it understands are facing eviction; considers that the tripartite mediation that it understands was promised by the Scottish Government during the passage of the Agricultural Holdings (Scotland) Act 2003 Remedial Order 2014 has not materialised; notes with concern the stress and insecurity that many tenant farmers, their families and employees are facing; notes the calls on the Scottish Government to ensure that mediation is provided, and further notes the calls on it to take action to stop all pending evictions.

***S5M-02464 Monica Lennon: Police Stations in Hamilton, Larkhall and Shotts**—That the Parliament is concerned about proposals by Police Scotland to close 58 police stations; notes that three of the threatened police stations are in Hamilton, Larkhall and Shotts in the Central Scotland parliamentary region; considers that such closures could adversely impact the safety of the public in the region and across Scotland; acknowledges that an estate review will include local consultation, and encourages people to take part.

***S5M-02463 Jeremy Balfour: Adoption Week Scotland**—That the Parliament commends Adoption UK in Scotland for facilitating the inaugural Adoption Week Scotland from 21 to 27 November 2016; notes that the week aims to raise awareness of the process of adoption in Scotland, dispel long-held myths and offer a real picture of who adoptive families are today; recognises that Adoption Week is an opportunity to celebrate these families and to thank them for the love and security that they offer the children who are now part of them, and considers that the week will provide an opportunity for people to learn more about the needs of adoptive families in Scotland and recognise the support that they require to help children achieve the best possible outcomes.

***S5M-02462 Alex Neil: Robotic-assisted Prostate Cancer Surgery**—That the Parliament celebrates the pioneering robotic surgery service for prostate cancer treatment that has been introduced at the Western General Hospital in Edinburgh; understands that this will be used to treat men from across Scotland and has been jointly funded by Prostate Scotland, the Scottish Government and the NHS boards that are members of the South East Scotland Cancer Network (SCAN); understands that the £1.4 million da Vinci SI Surgical System has already helped to save the lives of 50 men and will allow access to the most up-to-date surgical treatment, and commends the team at the hospital and everyone associated with the successful Prostate Scotland appeal, Blue Horizon.

***S5M-02461 Alexander Stewart: Proposed Police Station Closures**—That the Parliament is concerned by the news that Police Scotland is considering the closure of the police stations in Bridge of Allan and Tullibody as part of a review of its estate; believes that the number of people who use these facilities is far less important than the safe and reassuring presence that they provide to the local community, and hopes that Police Scotland will reconsider these proposals.

***S5M-02460 Richard Leonard: World Prematurity Day 2016**—That the Parliament recognises that 17 November marks World Prematurity Day 2016; congratulates Bliss Scotland on its campaigning for improvements to the care for premature and sick babies and for better support for families; believes that the charity carries out and supports vital research, helps deliver training for health professionals and promotes family-centred care; understands that, although almost 5,800 babies in Scotland are admitted to a neonatal unit for lifesaving care, the charity has identified services that are under pressure, including serious shortages of neonatal nurses and doctors, and a lack of support for parents; further understands the extra weekly cost to a family with a baby in a neonatal unit is £218 on average, as a result of loss of earnings, childcare for other children, travel and other costs, and asks the Scottish Government for its review of maternity and neonatal services to take into account what it considers the importance of improving facilities so that families can be kept together while their baby is undergoing treatment.

***S5M-02459 Ruth Maguire: Congratulating KA Leisure**—That the Parliament congratulates the North Ayrshire business, KA Leisure, on winning the Gold Award at the 2016 Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) Health and Safety Awards; recognises that the awards event, which celebrated its diamond anniversary in 2016, presents highly regarded and sought-after accolades to businesses and organisations that have shown commitment to accident or ill-health prevention; notes that the scheme is open to businesses and organisations of all types and sizes from across the UK and overseas; commends what it sees as this hugely impressive and well-earned achievement by KA Leisure, and wishes both the business and the RoSPA awards all the best for the future.
