***S5M-05455 Clare Adamson: Child Safety Week 5 to 11 June 2017, Safe Children: Sharing is Caring**—That the Parliament notes that Child Safety Week, the flagship annual campaign run by the Child Accident Prevention Trust (CAPT), takes place this year between 5 and 11 June 2017 and its theme is “sharing is caring”; further notes that accidents are a leading cause of death, serious injury and acquired disability for children and young people in the UK, that they account for three deaths every week and over 2,000 hospital admissions and that many of these accidents can be prevented; commends CAPT’s aim of securing a safer environment for children of all ages by helping families understand the risks, as well as the consequences, but most importantly, the simple ways that accidents can be prevented; further commends work undertaken in Child Safety Week in bringing together individuals and organisations around the UK to promote safety messages to families in a fun and engaging way and encourage parents and carers to increase confidence by sharing experiences and learning; congratulates CAPT and other organisations working in accident prevention on their outstanding dedication, in particular the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (RoSPA) which, this year, celebrates its centenary; notes RoSPA’s past successes from the Tufty Club in the 1960s and the introduction of the seatbelt law in the 1980s, to a successful campaign for moulded plugs in 1992 and EU-wide regulations on looped blind cords in 2014; further notes the new hazards for parents and carers to be aware of such as liquid laundry capsules, button batteries, hair straighteners and nappy sacks, and congratulates all those many organisations that continue to work tirelessly and collaboratively in the field of accident prevention and child safety. ***S5M-05452 Miles Briggs: Cleft Lip and Palate Awareness Week 2017**—That the Parliament is aware that the annual Cleft Lip and Palate Awareness Week, organised by the Cleft Lip and Palate Association (CLAPA), runs from 6 to 14 May 2017; notes that the week aims to raise awareness of a condition that affects three babies born in the UK each day and to raise funds for CLAPA; commends all those involved in the awareness week and wishes it every success in its aims; welcomes the positive work undertaken by various cleft charities, including CLAPA, SCALP (Scotland Cleft Lip and Palate) and other similar organisations; understands that there is continuing opposition by Lothian and East of Scotland parents and campaigners to the decision to centralise all cleft lip and palate surgical services in Glasgow and notes their particular concerns regarding the current transition period and how their views are being taken into account, and urges the Scottish Government to engage with all parents and campaigners, address their concerns and ensure that the best possible cleft surgery is available for all children in Scotland.

***S5M-05448 Christina McKelvie: Increase in Demand of Hamilton District Foodbank**—That the Parliament is shocked by the reported significant increase in numbers demanding the service of the Hamilton district foodbank from 2,667 in 2015-16 to 4,015 in 2016-17; believes that this increase in foodbank demand is inextricably linked to the continuing austerity agenda of the UK Conservative administration; notes the 2017 report, *Early Warnings: Universal Credit and Foodbanks*, published by Trussell Trust UK, outlining how austerity measures, welfare reforms and delays in processing universal credit claims have severely impacted on people, which it believes increases foodbank usage; is outraged that of the 4,015 recipients of aid in Hamilton, it understands that 1,424 were children; places on record its admiration for the volunteers and contributors of the foodbank who have collected over 46,676 tonnes of food from local schools, businesses and faith groups, and agrees wholeheartedly with the Trussell Trust's recommendation that “national (Conservative) Government must do more to make sure people are not thrown into crisis” as a result of welfare reforms.

***S5M-05447 Jeremy Balfour: Edinburgh City FC**—That the Parliament congratulates Edinburgh City FC on what it considers the team's successful first season in League Two; expresses delight at the announcement that the club has entered an agreement with the Spartans Community Stadium Limited, to use Ainslie Park Stadium for all home matches while its present ground, Meadowbank Stadium, is being redeveloped; notes that, if approved by the league authorities, this will see the team play at the home of Spartans FC for the next three seasons, and wishes the club well at the new venue.

***S5M-05446 Bruce Crawford: Fintry, the UK's First Smart Village**—That the Parliament congratulates the residents of Fintry on, it understands, it becoming the first “smart village” in the UK by using the latest technology to allow them to buy their electricity directly from renewable energy generators in the area; believes that a quarter of the 700 population is signed up to the project and it is predicted that a further 100 households, plus some businesses, will take part in the project to demonstrate how communities can sustain energy use from locally-based renewables rather than from large-scale sources; notes that the aim of the project, which has been awarded funding for the second year-in-a row by the Scottish Government, is to help cut energy bills and CO2 emissions; understands that smart meters have been given to villagers to help monitor electricity use along with a special renewable electricity tariff that helps them match their electricity use with the output of three nearby renewable generators, consisting of two wind turbines and an anaerobic digestion plant; believes that this approach could set a new blueprint for communities across Scotland to become more energy self-sufficient, and wishes everyone involved with the Fintry initiative the best of luck with the second and future years of the project.

Members' Bills Proposals

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
