*<u>S5M-08146</u> Lewis Macdonald: Aberdeen Aquatics wins Learn to Swim Aaward—That the Parliament congratulates Aquatics Aberdeen on winning the Scottish Water Learn to Swim Service Provider of the Year Award at the Scottish Swimming Awards; understands that Aquatics Aberdeen, which is part of Sport Aberdeen, currently provides lessons to 5,500 swimmers of all ages at 10 pools across the city through its Learn to Swim programme; recognises that Aberdeen Aquatics beat competition from across Scotland to take the top prize, and commends all the staff involved in delivering these award-winning swimming lessons.
