***S5M-14234 Dean Lockhart: University of Stirling Students Graduate in Singapore**—That the Parliament congratulates all of those who graduated from the University of Stirling's partnership with the Singapore Institute of Management on 4 October 2018; notes that the ceremony was led by the University's Principal and Vice-Chancellor, Professor Gerry McCormac, who conferred degrees on 63 graduates from BA (Hons) Retail Marketing and BA (Hons) Sports Studies and Marketing courses; recognises that the university's increasing international ambitions are reflected in strategic partnerships such as these, which promote excellence, innovation and teaching with a global impact; notes that the agreement between the university and Amity Global Institute will allow students in Singapore to continue to enrol on undergraduate and postgraduate-level degree courses; acknowledges the role that the university has in encouraging international students to study in Scotland with more than 120 countries represented on campus and more than 82,000 alumni from 150 countries; encourages the university to continue to reach out globally and attract

***S5M-14233 Gil Paterson: Heart Disease Breakthrough at Golden Jubilee National Hospital**—That the Parliament recognises the outstanding work and the success of tests carried out by University of Glasgow and the Golden Jubilee National hospital researchers, which it understands has resulted in a breakthrough in diagnosing hidden heart diseases, and believes that a study involving 151 patients with chest pain, which found no diagnosis using current tests, has allowed for new small-vessel tests to diagnose up to four times as many patients.

***S5M-14228 Liam McArthur: Dr Tracy Shimmield Appointed as Chair of ORIC**—That the Parliament congratulates the internationally recognised scientist, Dr Tracy Shimmield, on her appointment as chair of the new Orkney Research and Innovation Campus (ORIC); understands that Dr Shimmield will provide leadership to the ORIC board and is a key appointment in the multi-million-pound project; notes that Highland and Islands Enterprise is investing over £4.5 million, with £2 million coming from Orkney Islands Council, as they seek to support growing research and innovation activity, as well as the expansion of marine renewables companies in Orkney; believes that Dr Shimmield brings a wealth of experience to the role, being an executive member of the British Geological Survey and co-director of Edinburgh's Lyell Centre, a pioneering global research facility for earth and marine science and technology, and wishes her every success as she takes up her new role at ORIC.

***S5M-14222 Neil Findlay: Fast Food Workers Unite Against Exploitation**—That the Parliament sends solidarity greetings to striking workers from McDonalds, TGI Fridays and Wetherspoons, who are staging a national day of action to demand better working conditions across the hospitality sector, an end to zero-hour contracts and a £10 minimum hourly wage; understands that action will take place across the UK, including midnight picketing, rallies, meetings and demonstrations; notes that courier workers from UberEats will also strike across the UK to demand a minimum payment of £5 per drop; believes that this action is a result of the frustration at a UK Conservative administration that has created an economy where some companies feel that they can exploit workers while posting vast profits and avoid paying their share of corporate taxation, and commends members of the Bakers, Food and Allied Workers' Union, the GMB and UNITE for their stance.

***S5M-14221 Lewis Macdonald: SPFL Decision on League Cup Semi-finals Welcome**—That the Parliament welcomes the decision by the SPFL to reverse its plan to hold both League Cup semi-finals at Hampden Park on the same day; believes that the original decision, which was made without consulting ScotRail or Transport Scotland, would have made it impossible for Aberdeen fans travelling from the north east to get to Glasgow by train in time for kick-off; considers that this should be the last time a major Scottish football match is scheduled in a way which takes no account of the supporters of the clubs involved, and, to ensure that as many fans as possible are able to attend these great occasions, calls on the football authorities to guarantee that, in future, there will be full consultation with the Scottish Government, Transport Scotland, ScotRail and other transport providers, as well as those responsible for policing and public safety, before any such matches are scheduled.

***S5M-14219 Rachael Hamilton: The Loneliness Experiment**—That the Parliament notes the findings of the Loneliness Experiment, which was completed by the BBC and, it understands, is the largest study of its kind, with around 55,000 participants from 237 different countries and territories; believes that it highlighted that the most likely people to feel lonely are 16- to 24-year-olds, with 40% saying that they felt this way; understands that this reflects similar surveys, despite common stereotypes depicting older people as being more isolated; believes that loneliness can impact on wellbeing, leading to mental health problems, such as anxiety or depression, and lead to lower levels of trust in others; notes that among the other groups that the study said are more likely to experience loneliness are people who believe that they face discrimination because they are disabled or because of their sexuality, and commends the BBC on this work.
