\*S5M-20270 Richard Lyle: The Showmen's Guild of Great Britain and Northern Ireland—That the Parliament joins the Showmen's Guild of Great Britain and Northern Ireland in celebrating its 130th anniversary; understands that the Guild was founded as the United Kingdom Van Dwellers Protection Association in 1889 in Salford; believes that its formation was a key moment in the recognition of showmen having a lifestyle that is a culture rather than an occupation, leading to the idea of travelling showmen being recognised as a cultural group; understands that the principal objective of the Guild has remained the same since its inception, which is to protect the interests of its members, travelling showmen who gain their livelihoods by attending funfairs; notes that it does so both through its code of rules for members and by using the legal and constitutional processes that exist; congratulates Philip Paris, who has become the first Scot to be named as the President of the Guild since Jack Cullis in the 1950s, and thanks showmen across Scotland, including in the Uddingston and Bellshill constituency, and the rest of the UK, on their contribution to, and the significant and important part that they play, in public life.

\*S5M-20282 Gil Paterson: First DCD Heart Transplant in Scotland Carried Out at the Golden Jubilee National Hospital—That the Parliament congratulates Phil Curry, consultant transplant surgeon at the Golden Jubilee National Hospital, on carrying out Scotland's first donation after circulatory death (DCD) heart transplant; recognises that years of research have gone into the procedure for using a non-beating heart for transplant and that this operation represents an important milestone for the Scottish National Advanced Heart Failure Service, and believes that DCD heart retrieval and DCD heart transplantation will be a new chapter in future heart transplantation in Scotland, increasing the number of heart transplants and giving recipients a lifechanging and life-saving opportunity.

\*S5M-20271 Alison Johnstone: Tackling Food Insecurity in West Lothian—That the Parliament understands that the most recent West Lothian Council Partnership and Resources Policy Development and Scrutiny Panel noted that "food poverty in West Lothian is growing and significant" and particularly impacts unemployed people, disabled people and households with children, especially single parents; further understands that, in 2018-19, the West Lothian Food Bank issued 2,925 three-day emergency food packs to 5,885 local people in crisis, a 41% increase on the previous year; considers that West Lothian Council and its third sector partners are taking steps to reduce food insecurity and ensure sustainability of food provision across the council area, including developing a West Lothian food network, working with Fare Share to ensure unwanted food is redistributed, holding a Food with Dignity conference in March 2020 to share good practice and develop a local food action plan, and creating an interactive map to aid access to advice and support; understands that these measures are being supported by £150,000 of council funding; believes that a right to food should be established in Scots law, and calls on the UK and Scottish governments to tackle the root causes of food insecurity in West Lothian and across Scotland.

\*S5M-20269 Lewis Macdonald: Importance of an International Treaty on Business and Human Rights—That the Parliament notes the recent negotiations during the UN Business and Human Rights Forum in Geneva on a binding treaty on business and human rights; acknowledges what it sees as the need for such a treaty to protect the rights of workers and communities to avoid businesses causing or contributing to adverse impacts through their own activities, and to help deal with the impact of such incidents when they do occur; believes that such a treaty should ensure that trade and investment can serve to support human rights rather than infringe them,

strengthen international cooperation to ensure that communities negatively affected by business activities can access justice, protect human rights defenders, whose activism often puts them at great personal risk, particularly women who face gendered attacks, and guarantee the right to consent by indigenous and affected peoples; recognises the positive contribution that international civic society has played in the treaty negotiations to date, including the work carried out by Scottish organisations, such as SCIAF, Global Justice Now and Scotland's International Development Alliance, and urges the UK Government to engage constructively in the treaty negotiation process.

\*S5M-20267 Fulton MacGregor: BEMIS Scotland and St Andrew's Fair Saturday—That the Parliament congratulates BEMIS Scotland and the diverse ethnic and cultural minority communities of Scotland that participated in the international celebration of St Andrew's Fair Saturday on 30 November 2019; notes that the multicultural celebration included events such as the Gypsy Traveller Gathering in Aberdeen, the Scottish Arab Women's St Andrew's Day in Glasgow, Syrians Celebrate St Andrew's Day in Dumfries, Africa Futures St Andrew's Day in Govan and the football event, the St Andrew's Multi-Cultural Cup in Glasgow, and believes that this reflects the diversity of modern Scotland and exemplifies a human rights-based approach to creating an inclusive and responsive contemporary national identity that responds to the multifarious nature of the cultural identities and community dynamics.

\*S5M-20265 Claudia Beamish: Lessons from COP25—That the Parliament notes the conclusion of the UN Climate Change Conference, COP25, which was held in Madrid; believes that COP25 failed to make progress on some key issues within the Paris Agreement, including on finance for loss and damage for developing countries already hit by climate change, or on long-term climate finance; stands in solidarity with representatives from countries most impacted by climate change and civic society who were temporarily ejected from COP25; considers that voices from the Global South, Indigenous Peoples and climate justice advocates, rather than those of richer nations and those multi-national companies that are failing to address the climate emergency, must be at the heart of climate negotiations; looks forward to the next UN Climate Change Conference, COP26, which is being held in Glasgow in 2020; is concerned that COP26 will be the fourth such meeting in a row to be held in Europe; calls on the Scottish and UK Governments to proactively support people from the Global South and those most affected by climate change to attend and be heard at the conference, and believes that Scotland must use the next year to further strengthen climate action ahead of COP26.

MINIMUM AGE FOR CANDIDACY IN SCOTTISH PARLIAMENT AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

# Power to reduce the minimum age for candidacy in Scottish Parliament and local government elections

- (1) The Scottish Ministers may by regulations make such provision as they consider necessary for the purposes of reducing the age at which a person can be a candidate for an election to the Scottish Parliament or to a local authority to 16 years.
- (2) Regulations under subsection (1) may modify any enactment.
- (3) Regulations under subsection (1) are subject to the affirmative procedure.

- (9) Where a person making representations in response to consultation under subsection (6) has not consented to the disclosure of representations, the Scottish Ministers must not disclose them under subsection (8)(b)(ii).
- (10) If information in representations made by a person in response to consultation under subsection (6) relates to another person, the Scottish Ministers must not disclose that information under subsection (8)(b)(ii) if or to the extent that—
  - (a) it appears to the Scottish Ministers that the disclosure of that information could adversely affect the interests of that other person, and
  - (b) the Scottish Ministers have been unable to obtain the consent of that other person to the disclosure.
- (11) Subsections (9) and (10) do not affect any disclosure that is requested by, and made to, a committee of the Parliament charged with reporting on the proposed draft regulations.>

Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court has ruled that some provisions of the Bill are outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament. The Bill cannot be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form.

#### **Legislative Consent Memorandums**
