***[S5M-17342](#) John Finnie: Children (Equal Protection from Assault) (Scotland) Bill**—That the Parliament agrees to the general principles of the Children (Equal Protection from Assault) (Scotland) Bill.

***[S5M-17341](#) Gail Ross: Sutherland Wildfire**—That the Parliament praises everyone involved in fighting the wildfires on the north coast of Sutherland, including the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, gamekeepers, farmers and locals; recognises the contribution of the community who provided refreshments and other assistance; commends SSE for getting the electricity back on as quickly as possible; urges Scottish Natural Heritage and other bodies to take measures to ensure that a fire like this cannot spread so easily in future, and further urges members of the public to exercise caution when lighting fires in the countryside.

***[S5M-17340](#) Mary Fee: Make Yourself Heard Campaign**—That the Parliament helps to raise awareness of what to do when people call 999 but are too afraid to speak out loud; understands that around 5,000 of the 20,000 silent 999 calls made daily are put through to an automated system, called Silent Solutions, which helps callers, such as domestic abuse victims, who are unable to speak to an operator; notes that when a person has not been able to signal that their call is an emergency by coughing after dialling 999, they will be put through to the operator; understands that if a person is in danger, they will be asked to dial 55; promotes the Make Yourself Heard Campaign, which has been launched by the Independent Office for Police Conduct, backed by a how-to guide, which is aimed at debunking the myth that a silent 999 call alone will automatically bring help; notes that campaign is being backed by the charities, Women's Aid and the National Police Chiefs' Council, and calls on all MSPs to help raise this with their constituents.

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***[S5M-17339](#) Alex Cole-Hamilton: International Day Against Homophobia, Transphobia and Biphobia**—That the Parliament recognises 17 May 2019 as international day against homophobia, transphobia and biphobia (IDAHOT); recognises the opportunity of the day to raise awareness of the human rights of LGBTI people; understands that 72 countries and territories still criminalise same-sex relations between consenting adults and that only 63 countries provide some form of anti-discrimination protection for LGBTI people, and considers that this is a day to celebrate diversity and to focus on justice and protection for all.

***[S5M-17338](#) Alex Cole-Hamilton: Taiwan Legalises Same-sex Marriage**—That the Parliament applauds Taiwan on being the first country in Asia to legalise same-sex marriage following a vote on 17 May 2019; recognises that policymakers debated three separate bills to legalise same-sex unions, with the most progressive of the three being passed; notes that, after a series of referendums in which the majority of Taiwan maintained that the definition of marriage was the union of a man and woman, Taiwan will now enact a special law for same-sex marriage; considers that there is still some way to go in the fight for equality but that the legislation provides the LGBT+ community with a legal definition, and hopes that the examples of commitment to marriage equality in Taiwan will act as a catalyst to encourage other jurisdictions to reconsider their position on same-sex unions and work towards future LGBTI+ equality.

***[S5M-17337](#) Stuart McMillan: New Digital Campaign Aims to Generate £1 Million for the Economy**—That the Parliament welcomes the launch of Must Sea Scotland, a new digital campaign that aims to generate £1 million for the economy by inspiring visitors to get on a boat in 2020 to enjoy some of Scotland's amazing places, islands and experiences; recognises that the campaign has been supported by £22,500 from VisitScotland's Growth Fund; notes that it will use 360 degree virtual reality videos of must-visit locations around Scotland's coast to encourage visitors from the UK to take to the water during the Year of Coast and Waters in 2020; understands that the campaign was launched at Inverkip's Kip Marina in the Greenock and Inverclyde constituency, and hopes that the campaign, which is led by Sail Scotland in partnership with the National Trust for Scotland, Diageo and CalMac, will boost tourism in Scotland and highlight the natural beauty that is often taken for granted.

***[S5M-17315](#) Neil Findlay: Fighting the Blacklist**—That the Parliament congratulates the more than 50 trade union members who have been awarded compensation totalling £1.9 million after major construction firms admitted that they had been unlawfully blacklisted and denied work; understands that this means more than £35 million has been paid out to over 1,200 workers who have suffered due to the blacklist; further understands that the eight firms that have admitted to their role in the blacklist and have compensated trade unionists are Sir Robert McAlpine, Balfour Beatty, Costain, Kier, Laing O'Rourke, Skanska UK, Vinci and Carillion, and calls on the Scottish Government to stop awarding public contracts to firms that utilise blacklisting.

Members' Bills Proposals

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
