***[S5M-22562](#) Mark McDonald: Potential Impact of a No-deal Brexit on Florists**—That the Parliament acknowledges the concerns raised by the British Florist Association and felt throughout the industry in response to the proposed tariff on cut-flowers entering the UK from 1 January 2021; notes that a tariff of 8% will be incurred if no deal is struck with the EU and that supplementary documentation and administration requirements, together with enhanced border checks, are expected to delay imports, which might result in decreased product quality; believes with regret that a no-deal scenario looks increasingly likely; considers that this will have a significant detrimental impact on businesses that are currently struggling to recover from the COVID-19 lockdown restrictions, and calls on the UK Government to expedite negotiations to protect the livelihoods of those working in the floral sector and other businesses as the end of the Brexit transition period approaches.

***[S5M-22561](#) Alison Johnstone: Abuse Information for Educators**—That the Parliament welcomes the new resource from Scottish Women's Aid and Education Scotland to help education staff understand the role they can play in tackling domestic abuse; believes that the document, *Domestic Abuse Information for Educators*, can prepare schools for responding safely to children and young people who have experienced domestic abuse; understands that emerging evidence shows this to have increased during the COVID-19 lockdown; recognises that for many children and young people experiencing domestic abuse, their early learning and childcare setting, school or youth work setting may be the only place they feel safe; understands that returning to schools means that many children and young people will have access to a safe space, trusted adults and peer support for the first time in months, and congratulates Scottish Women's Aid and Education Scotland for their efforts to help staff feel confident in responding to disclosures of domestic abuse in a safe and effective way, including by working closely with specialist domestic abuse services to ensure children and young people can access the support that they need.

***[S5M-22560](#) Alison Johnstone: Edinburgh Direct Aid Supporting People Affected by the Beirut Port Explosion**—That the Parliament recognises the Scottish charity, Edinburgh Direct Aid (EDA), for its vital work to assist those affected by the explosion at port in Beirut on 4 August 2020; understands that EDA deployed a team of carpenters and other construction workers made

up of Syrian refugees trained in EDA's vocational training centre in Arsal, Lebanon, to repair windows and doors destroyed by the blast, and to carry out other repairs to ensure the traumatised local people have shelter; understands that working conditions have been particularly challenging given the need for precautions against COVID-19, the midsummer heat and patchy access to supplies and communications in the city, and notes that people can find out more about EDA's efforts, and its emergency appeal for support, at edinburghdirectaid.org.
