### Other new and altered motions and amendments

**\*[S5M-22025](#) Alasdair Allan: Remembering the 51st Highland Division at Saint Valery 80 Years Later**—That the Parliament remembers the surrender of 10,000 men of the 51st Highland Division taken prisoner near Saint-Valery-en-Caux near Le Havre, six days after the Dunkirk evacuations, after being attached to French defence forces, facing the onslaught of the invading Germans; remembers those that tragically lost their lives; recalls also that the men were marched to Stalag XX-A prison, north west of Warsaw, to be there for the duration of the rest of the war; highlights that, of the 219 returned escapees to Britain in 1941, 134 had been from the 51st Highland Division; notes that three of these escapees were from Ballachullish, who used Gaelic to confuse the Germans to convince them that they were part of the Ukraine and then friendly forces of Stalin; recalls their 1,300 km march at the end of the war from the east of the oncoming Red Army, marched by German forces, to the west where they eventually met the Americans, and pays tribute to their sacrifice and heroism, remaining in France after the Dunkirk evacuations, and most notably captured in Scots Gaelic on the memorial in Saint-Valery-en-Caux, “La a bhlair is math na cairdean” (On the day of battle it is good to have friends/relations).

**\*[S5M-22024](#) Stuart McMillan: Hour Crafty Clocks Wins Double at Festival of Youth Enterprise Awards**—That the Parliament congratulates Hour Crafty Clocks on its success at the Festival of Youth Enterprise Awards, which celebrate the achievements of young people participating across a number of Young Enterprise Scotland programmes; notes that Hour Crafty Clocks is an Inverclyde-based student company made up of pupils from St Columba’s High School in Gourock, which produces a variety of stylish clocks from upcycled vinyl records, sweet tin lids and discarded tartan; commends the young people on their ingenuity and for promoting sustainability as part of this project; understands that the team was presented with the Best Presentation Award and the Digital Presence Award, and wishes the students well for the future.

Service, which has ensured that blood donating is accessible for people during the COVID-19 crisis, meaning that lives can continue to be saved with crucial blood transfusions; acknowledges that sustained blood donations are crucial during this time of crisis and that donations of convalescent plasma from recovered COVID-19 patients can potentially help COVID-19 patients; notes that the FAIR (For the Assessment of Individualised Risk) steering group, set up by the Department of Health and Social care, which includes the Scottish National Blood Transfusion Service, Stonewall, Terrence Higgins Trust, clinical specialists and patients, is working to complete its report into evidence on gay and bisexual men and blood donation by the end of 2020 despite delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that the current restrictions can be discriminatory against gay and bisexual men, many of whom feel that they are being denied to opportunity to help save lives; resolves to continue to strengthen and sustain blood donating services in Scotland by encouraging more people to donate blood when they can, and thanks all blood donors across Scotland for their continued contribution to helping save lives.

**\*S5M-22022 Angus MacDonald: Ashley Nicholson, New President of the UK Harbour**

**Masters Association**—That the Parliament congratulates Ashley Nicholson on being named the new president of the UK Harbour Masters Association (UKHMA) at the Executive Council meeting of the association on 10 June 2020; understands that Ashley is the first female to hold the position since the UKHMA was founded in 1993; notes that it is the world's oldest and largest such professional body, with around 500 professional and commercial members, and that its objectives include exercising and promoting the safe and efficient conduct of marine operations in ports and encouraging and facilitating the qualification, certification and continuing professional development of harbour masters in the UK and other territories; understands that Ashley, who has worked at Forth Ports for nearly 12 years, took on her current role of senior harbour master in 2017; notes that she manages all the ports on the river, focusing on Grangemouth, Rosyth, Kirkcaldy and Burntisland; recognises that Ashley won the Women in Industry title at the 2020 Centre for Engineering, Education and Development Awards and the prestigious Scottish Engineering/Incorporation of Hammermen of Glasgow Award for her role in managing marine operations during the construction of the Queensferry Crossing; commends Ashley on her new role, and wishes her continued success.

#### **Powers under this Part: requirement for dynamic alignment with EU regulatory standards**

- (1) A power under this Part to make regulations may only be exercised by the Scottish Ministers in a manner compatible with the principle in subsection (2).
- (2) The principle is that the modifications of retained EU law made by the regulations must result in the retained EU law containing regulatory standards in relation to the matters listed in subsection (3) that are at least the equivalent standard as corresponding provision in—
  - (a) an EU regulation,
  - (b) an EU directive,
  - (c) EU tertiary legislation,
  - (d) an EU decision,
for the time being in force in relation to agriculture.
- (3) The matters are—
  - (a) environmental standards,
  - (b) animal health and welfare,
  - (c) food safety,
  - (d) the sustainable management of natural resources.
- (4) Subsection (2) does not apply to a provision which has no practical application in relation to Scotland or is otherwise redundant.
