*S5M-21358 Mark McDonald: Scotland's Charity Air Ambulance Takes Off in the North East—That the Parliament congratulates Scotland's Charity Air Ambulance (SCAA) on the launch of its north east operations; understands that its aircraft, Helimed 79, will start flying missions from Aberdeen Airport at the beginning of April 2020; notes that it is the SCAA's second aircraft, joining its already successful Perth-based helicopter; believes that the north east's most seriously ill and injured people will benefit hugely from this new service as it aims to dramatically increase the reach of Aberdeen's major trauma centre; recognises that Helimed 79 is charity-funded, with each call out costing in the region of £2,500, and encourages any and all fundraising support for this exceptional service.

*S5M-21357 Mark McDonald: Aberdeen Royal Infirmary Leads the Way in COVID-19 Onsite Testing—That the Parliament congratulates Aberdeen Royal Infirmary on becoming the first hospital in Scotland to offer onsite testing for COVID-19; notes that laboratory staff are currently capable of testing 160 cases per day and that test results are returned within seven hours; celebrates the anticipated arrival of a second machine capable of processing up to 600 tests per day; understands that increased testing carried out locally will dramatically reduce waiting times with less packaging and transportation required; acknowledges that onsite testing will allow patients to be processed more quickly, thereby maximising efficiencies, and celebrates the hard work of all NHS staff working on the front line of this global health crisis.

*S5M-21356 Edward Mountain: Carlton Bingo Inverness Car Park—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the excellent gesture by Carlton Bingo Inverness during the COVID-19 outbreak, which has made its car park available, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, free of charge for the use of NHS staff, visitors and contractors at Raigmore Hospital; welcomes how helpful this measure will be, and encourages other companies to consider adopting similar measures during these difficult times.

*S5M-21355 Kenneth Gibson: 100th Anniversary of the Birth of Edwin Morgan—That the Parliament commemorates the 100th anniversary of the birth of the Scottish poet, Edwin Morgan, who was born in Glasgow on 27 April 1920; understands that Morgan grew up in Rutherglen,

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which inspired his first book of poems, *The Vision of Cathkin Braes*, in 1952, before becoming a teacher at the University of Glasgow; considers that Morgan worked in a wide range of forms and styles and also translated from a wide range of languages, including Russian, French, Italian, Latin, German and Old English; notes that Morgan ultimately became Glasgow's first Poet Laureate and Scotland's first Makar, and is widely regarded as one of Scotland's greatest and most influential poets, as well as being remembered for his work as a teacher and playwright; recognises the vast legacy that he left behind, not only his magnificent contribution to the literary world, but the financial legacy of £918,000 left with the aim of allowing the people of Scotland to consider and vote for Scotlish independence, a cause close to his heart, and a further £1 million left for the creation of an annual award scheme in his memory for young poets in Scotland; notes that his wide and varied work included the poem, *Open the Doors!*, for the opening of the Scotlish Parliament building in 2004, and believes that this important centenary anniversary should be used to celebrate the life and legacy of such a talented and influential Scot.

*S5M-21354 Keith Brown: Alloa, The Beatles' Home in Scotland—That the Parliament notes the 60th anniversary of The Great Ballard Show at Alloa Town Hall, featuring Johnny Gentle and The Silver Beetles, a band that would later become The Beatles; agrees with Ken McNab, author of *The Beatles in Scotland*, that this gig represents a pivotal moment in music history, kickstarting The Beatles' rise to international fame; believes that this event puts Alloa on the map as The Beatles' home in Scotland; understands that 17-year-old Paul McCartney had to ask his father for permission to leave school to tour; notes that this was one night of a seven-date tour that left the band with less money than they started with, resulting in the band having to sleep in their van in Forres; believes that this tour was the start of Paul McCartney's love affair with Scotland, which saw him and his wife, Linda, move to the Mull of Kintyre, and thanks The Beatles for their outstanding and record-breaking contributions to music.
