***[S5M-21870](#) Monica Lennon: NSPCC Scotland's Fight for a Fair Start Campaign**—That the Parliament notes that 7 to 12 June 2020 is Infant Mental Health Awareness Week, which will have the theme, 20:20 Vision, Seeing the World Through Babies' Eyes; acknowledges that early experiences can impact on long-term health and socioeconomic outcomes; welcomes NSPCC Scotland's Fight for a Fair Start campaign, which seeks to secure investment in infant mental health services to support the bond between vulnerable babies and their families; accepts that preventing longer term damage to inequalities in Scotland is possible, if the country provides preventative support to families that are experiencing mental health difficulties during the perinatal period and properly funds interventions that support the parent-infant relationship; recognises the unique vulnerabilities of women and their babies in the context of the COVID-19 outbreak and is concerned about emerging evidence, which suggests that the pandemic is likely to have more adverse effects for vulnerable parents and children, and believes that it is now more critical than ever to ensure that infant mental health services are available and adequately funded in the long term so that all women and their babies can access the services and support they need wherever they live.

***[S5M-21869](#) Bruce Crawford: Crucial Role of Seafarers**—That the Parliament recognises the crucial role that seafarers play in national supply chains and the wider economy; commends the hard work and dedication of UK seafarers in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic, doing their utmost to keep their cargo, shipmates and passengers safe; notes that some UK crew members remain stranded abroad, and international efforts to provide relief remain ongoing; supports work to safeguard the safety of seafarers, at home and overseas, to ensure safe operations during the current coronavirus crisis, and believes that the UK Government should seek to facilitate a co-ordinated international effort to ensure seafarers can travel to return to their home countries safely and as early as possible.

***[S5M-21868](#) Iain Gray: Key Workers at Torness Power Station**—That the Parliament notes the vital work that has continued throughout lockdown to keep Scotland's utilities and other essential public infrastructure operating during the COVID-19 pandemic, including at Torness power station near Dunbar; understands that Torness, with a workforce well used to putting health and safety first, has adopted stringent measures to remain fully operational, ensuring that, during the current

***S5M-21865 Kenneth Gibson: UK Government Must Not U-turn on Promised £70 Million for Scotland**—That the Parliament notes that, on 2 May 2020, the UK Government announced a £617 million extension to business grants, which it advised would generate £60 million of funding consequentials under the Barnett Formula to help businesses across Scotland weather the COVID-19 crisis; recognises that such funding was then duly committed by the Scottish Government to its COVID-19 business response; understands that the UK Government subsequently informed the Scottish Government in the week of 18 May that this additional £60 million of funding would not now materialise, increasing the pressure on the Scottish budget; considers that this outstanding £60 million is in addition to another £10 million of consequentials that remain unpaid from when the UK Government announced £35 million for Scotland in respect of charity support direct grants, which then reduced to £25 million; expresses great concern at what it sees as the UK Government's pattern of behaviour of not paying Scotland the funds it is entitled to while equivalent funding is being spent elsewhere in the UK, as well as what it
