#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*S5M-22929 Mary Fee: Lupus Awareness Month 2020—That the Parliament notes that October is Lupus Awareness Month; understands that lupus is a complicated condition that is still very poorly understood by the public and many within the medical profession; calls for better and earlier diagnosis for people with lupus; supports Lupus Awareness Month, particularly in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, as many people shielding will be living with lupus, and supports the organisations and charities supporting and providing advocacy to people living with the condition, in the hope that a cure can be found.

\*S5M-22928 Gil Paterson: Clydebank-based Kilpatrick School Wins Social Enterprise Award—That the Parliament congratulates pupils at Kilpatrick School in Clydebank who have been awarded a Social Enterprise World Forum Education Award; recognises the efforts undertaken by the school, which has run a craft-based social enterprise that empowers young people to understand local and global issues, encourages them to become active promoters of more inclusive and sustainable societies, and seeks to provide skills training for people with additional support needs, and commends the work that done by the school in this regard.

\*S5M-22927 Andy Wightman: Edinburgh Poverty Commission—That the Parliament recognises the work of the Edinburgh Poverty Commission, which is an independent group that was set up in November 2018 and supported by the Edinburgh Partnership and the City of Edinburgh Council; welcomes the launch of its final report, *A Just Capital: Actions to End Poverty in Edinburgh* in September 2020; understands that almost 78,000 Edinburgh residents are living in relative poverty, representing some 15% of the population, and as many as on-in-five children; understands that 29% of the households in poverty are experiencing this due to high housing costs alone; notes that the Commission has laid out seven actions, including ensuring accessible community spaces, secure incomes and decent, affordable homes; welcomes the development of a new network, which has been provisionally named End Poverty Edinburgh, which will carry on the work begun by the Edinburgh Poverty Commission; sends its best wishes to this network, and commends everyone who was involved with the Commission.

\*<u>S5M-22926</u> John Mason: International Day of Older Persons 2020—That the Parliament acknowledges that 1 October 2020 is the International Day of Older Persons; understands that this

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is a day that seeks to raise issues facing older people, particularly in relation to their special health needs and their contribution to the functioning of society; supports the decision of the Second World Assembly on Ageing in 2002 to promote the development of society for all ages; recognises that COVID-19 has increased the difficulties faced by many older people, such as social exclusion, health risks and lack of access to goods and services; further recognises the financial vulnerability of older people; notes the very worrying statistics from the older people's charity, Independent Age, relating to the uptake of pension credits, which it understands show that, in Scotland, people of pension age are missing out on £300 million that they are entitled to, and calls on the Department for Work and Pensions to generate better awareness of pension credits and ensure that those in need are receiving the help they require.
