*S5M-23029 Neil Findlay: Amnesty International Report, As If Expendable—That the Parliament notes with concern the Amnesty International report. As If Expendable, which explores what it sees as the care home crisis throughout the continuing COVID-19 pandemic; understands that the report, which focuses on care homes in England, makes a series of damning conclusions about deliberate policy decisions by the UK Government, and other bodies, that consequently threatened the human rights of older people, most specifically the right to life, the right to health and the right to non-discrimination; further understands that the report states that the policy failures by the UK Government, and other bodies, were the failure to provide adequate and good quality PPE at the beginning of the crisis, the imposition of blanket DNR orders on care home residents and older people outwith care homes, mass discharges of older people to care homes at the beginning of the crisis, many of whom were either untested or had a positive COVID-19 test result at the time of their transfer, a failure to ensure regular testing for both staff and residents, a lack of transparency around statistics pertaining to care home deaths and a failure to enable care home residents to access NHS services; believes that the policy decisions outlined in the report have caused a significant amount of unnecessary deaths among residents in care homes; considers that the pandemic, and what it sees as the deprivation of visitation, have also detrimentally impacted care home residents who have survived with, it believes, many having lost some cognitive functions and their ability to move, in addition to the impact on their mental health; further believes that, despite Amnesty International's report focusing on the UK Government's approach to care homes, most of the policy failures identified also occurred in Scotland, including in the Lothian region, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to implement the recommendations set out in the report, in particular the need for an urgent public inquiry into the what it considers the crisis in care homes, at the earliest opportunity.

its launch in November 2017, it has been sending a letter to every newly-diagnosed cancer patient, offering them a meeting to discuss any practical, emotional or financial needs that they might have with a dedicated one-to-one support worker; notes that, since the COVID-19 pandemic began, the service has adapted one-to-one discussions with patients to now take place over the phone or via a video consulting service that enables people to have health and social care appointments from home or wherever is convenient; welcomes the news that the ICJ has provided over £500,000 in support and benefits for over 300 people since January 2019; understands that a recent study by Macmillan found that one in three people with cancer in Scotland are severely financially impacted by their diagnosis; notes that having cancer can bring all sorts of financial pressures, such as loss of income due to being off work, increased household bills and travel to and from hospital appointments; encourages people to get in touch with the team if they require any support, and congratulates Macmillan and the Dundee Health and Social Care Partnership for rolling out a service that places people at the centre of their care and support.

*S5M-23045 Miles Briggs: Charity Funding of Medical Research—That the Parliament recognises the vital role that charities play in funding medical research in Scotland; notes the impact that the COVID-19 pandemic has had on charity fundraising; understands that Association of Medical Research Charities (AMRC) invested over £146 million in medical research in Scotland in 2019 and that these charities are planning for an average 41% decrease in their research spend next year, which is a shortfall of up to £368 million UK-wide; further understands that it has been estimated that it will take four and a half years before charity spend on research in universities recovers; believes that it is crucial for all medical research in Scotland that the vital role of charity research funding is protected until that time; supports the call from the AMRC and its 151 member medical research charities, including the British Heart Foundation and Cancer Research UK, for the UK Government to invest in a life sciences charity partnership fund to protect medical research and development capability, and calls on the Scottish Government to urgently support the Scottish medical and life sciences research sector, which it considers contributes to major advances in scientific discovery and patient care, as well as the wealth of the nation.
