Members' Business motions that have achieved cross party support

*S5M-22736 Rona Mackay: National Adoption Week 2020—That the Parliament acknowledges National Adoption Week 2020, which runs from 14 to 20 October; understands that there are a range of events being held online, including fun family activities, as well as information sessions on foetal alcohol spectrum disorder and sibling relationships; commends the organisers for raising awareness of the benefits of adoption, including Adoption UK, which recently published the results of its April 2020 survey into the effects of lockdown on care experienced children, which highlighted that young people are experiencing increased anxiety and emotional distress, while many families reported enjoying spending more time together and some children appearing calmer than when attending school; acknowledges other research that highlighted that adopted children are 20 times more likely to be excluded than their peers, and notes the importance of these findings in tackling this inequality so that all children may have an equal start in life.

*S5M-22740 Neil Findlay: S5M-22731 —That the Parliament believes that it is essential for rail passenger and rail worker safety that Scotland's railway infrastructure is properly renewed and maintained; is therefore concerned at reports that the publicly-owned rail infrastructure manager, Network Rail, is carrying hundreds of vacancies in Scotland while private rail infrastructure companies contracted to Network Rail, such as Babcock Rail, SPL Powerlines, AMCO and Story Plant are implementing and planning redundancies; is alarmed that these reported rail infrastructure redundancies and unfilled vacancies will adversely impact on the quality of the rail network and passenger safety; is further concerned that reported redundancies being introduced by some of the private contractors could be used as a mechanism to introduce new employment models such as zero-hour contracts, which it considers are less safe and less fair; believes that it is wholly unacceptable that this is taking place on publicly-procured contracts; further believes that this breaches the Scottish Government's Fair Work principles, and calls on the Scottish Government to protect rail safety, services and skills by urgently intervening to prevent job losses in the rail infrastructure sector and ensure that all vacancies are filled.

*S5M-22739 Bruce Crawford: World Cleanup Day—That the Parliament recognises that 19 September 2020 is World Cleanup Day; acknowledges the valuable work of Let's Do It World in organising and coordinating this globally important green civic action; endorses the five key principles that underpin the environmental work of Let's Do It World, including cooperation, positivity, leadership, technology and fun; recognises the need for Scotland to play its full part in tackling the global waste crisis, and supports further efforts to bring about more sustainable and environmentally conscious attitudes towards consumption and waste.

*<u>S5M-22737</u> Graeme Dey on behalf of the Parliamentary Bureau: Approval of SSI—That the Parliament agrees that the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) (Aberdeen City) Amendment Regulations 2020 (SSI 2020/253) be approved.

*S5M-22735 Jackie Baillie: The Drop the Tariffs Campaign —That the Parliament believes that the imposition of the 25% tariff by the United States on single malt whisky adversely affects the whisky and spirits industry in Scotland and creates significant barriers in UK-US trade relations; understands that this is costing the sector £30 million per month with the total cost so far being £300 million; notes the 30% decrease of whisky export to the US, which was recorded shortly after the introduction of the tariff; understands that this puts at risk around 20,000 jobs in the UK and threatens the wellbeing of many families across Scotland; believes that, coupled with the post-Brexit context and COVID-19 pandemic, the tariff might cause even greater harm to the sector, and calls on the UK Government to support the Drop the Tariffs campaign, which has been initiated by GMB Scotland, and to cooperate with the Scotch Whisky Association to demand that the US ends this tariff.

*S5M-22734 Jackie Baillie: Scottish SPCA—That the Parliament believes that the Scottish SPCA demonstrates outstanding performance in the protection of animal rights across the country, including the rescue and rehabilitation of domestic, wild and farm animals, the provision of educational resources and ongoing advice for people; appreciates that it has reached around 50,000 children with its free educational programmes and has responded to nearly 200 reports every day from the beginning of 2020; understands that the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted on its activities; welcomes the launch of its free online educational resource, its helpline for distance support and its campaigning for the improvement of animal welfare legislation; recognises its exceptional role in the rehabilitation and rehoming of animals, at the Milton Animal Home and across Scotland, particularly during the COVID-19 lockdown measures, when the risks of domestic abuse and mistreatment of animals is particularly high; acknowledges its efforts in disruption of the low-welfare puppy trade through awareness raising campaigns and community dialogue; believes that its activities and programmes should be supported, and encourages the Scottish Government to ensure that the Scottish SPCA receives the funding that it needs and deserves.

*S5M-22733 Claudia Beamish: Scottish Water Route Map to Net Zero—That the Parliament welcomes the publication by Scottish Water of its route map to net-zero emissions as a helpful high-level statement of the components of meeting a net-zero emissions ambition; welcomes in particular commitments to recover heat from sewers, a new carbon intensity of investments measure, the requirement of necessary progress by supply partners, the auditing of land assets for their carbon storage and greater bio-diversity potential, greater energy recovery from bio-resources, the recovery of raw materials from waste and real-time control systems for electricity use reductions; looks forward to progress reports on the delivery of these ambitions, and encourages the development of firmer targets for progress within future reporting.
