Other new and altered motions and amendments

*S5M-24425 Elaine Smith: Women and the Cannongate Wall—That the Parliament recognises the skills of the women involved with the creation of the Canongate Wall at the Scottish Parliament, namely designer Sora Smithson, and the stone carving by Gillian Forbes, who, along with Martin Reilly, has inscribed 26 Scottish stones in the Canongate Wall to date; notes that the stones carry quotations of relevance to the Parliament and to Scotland, taken from poetry, psalm, and song; further notes that only one of the 26 stones carries words written by a woman, Mary Brooksbank, and urges the Scottish Parliamentary Corporate Body to commission further work to be done, which will more accurately reflect women as 52% of the Scottish population, incorporating more inscribed Scottish stones into the Canongate Wall.

*S5M-24424 Lewis Macdonald: Equally Safe at Work Accreditation for Aberdeen City Council—That the Parliament congratulates Aberdeen City Council on being awarded a bronze accreditation in the Equally Safe at Work scheme, which was piloted by Close the Gap in seven local authorities across Scotland between January 2019 and November 2020; recognises that Equally Safe at Work was developed to advance women's labour market equality through working directly with employers to ensure that workplace policies and practices take account of women's experiences of employment; understands that, as part of the Equally Safe at Work pilot, Aberdeen City Council implemented an initiative to increase the number of women participating in its leadership exchange programme, developed a new policy on gender-based violence and updated its equality and diversity policy to include information on the council's zero tolerance approach to gender-based violence; welcomes these new initiatives, which aim to advance gender equality at work, and commends the Aberdeen City Council staff on their Equally Safe at Work accreditation.

*S5M-24422 Neil Findlay: Police Scotland Disperse a Peaceful Picket by Unite Members At SAICA Packaging—That the Parliament notes with concern reports that workers from Unite the Union who were involved in a peaceful picket on the morning of 17 March 2021 at SAICA Packaging UK in Edinburgh were dispersed by Police Scotland and that anyone thought to be orchestrating the dispute was told that they faced fines and punishments; understands that Unite Scotland had conformed to all the statutory requirements with regard to the COVID-19 pandemic and had informed Police Scotland in advance of the commencement of the strike;

believes that this is an assault on the basic human right to be able to picket peacefully, and demands that the Scottish Government and Police Scotland adopt the same approach that is being applied to workers in England who have been afforded picketing rights.

*S5M-24421 Rachael Hamilton: Historic Borderlands Growth Deal Signed—That the Parliament recognises the £450 million Borderlands Growth Deal, which was signed on 18 March 2021; praises what it considers this historic agreement negotiated by the UK and Scottish governments; believes that it will create crucial jobs and investment in the Scottish Borders and beyond, and demonstrates the value of the union and of the UK and Scottish governments working together; notes the key investments in Ettrick, Roxburgh and Berwickshire, including a £10 million feasibility study into the completion of the Borders railway, the building of new business units in Coldstream, £11 million investment in the Destination Tweed project, aiming to join up an ambitious range of assets, facilities, businesses and activities along the river, the acquisition and servicing of land for business use at Hawick, £19 million from the UK Government to create the world's first mountain bike innovation centre in Innerleithen, and critical improvements to mobile and digital connections, and understands that this investment will generate around £1.1 billion gross value added to the area and play crucial a crucial role in the UK-wide post-pandemic economic recovery.

*S5M-24420 Elaine Smith: Thyroid Champions—That the Parliament notes that World Thyroid Day falls on 25 May 2021; acknowledges what it considers to be the ongoing failures in the treatment of people with thyroid conditions, the majority of whom, it understands, are women; expresses it disappointment that many are reportedly still having daily struggles to secure proper diagnosis and treatment; understands that those who can afford it have to pay privately for diagnosis and medication; acknowledges that current research being compiled by The Thyroid Trust suggests that there are currently patients in at least five NHS board areas who are reportedly being refused liothyronine; believes that the Scottish Government would understand the issues better if it undertook a similar project to the UK Government's current call for evidence as part of its new Women's Health Strategy, to better understand women's experiences of the health and care system; considers that large drug manufacturers appear to have control over the supply and reportedly inflated costs of life-saving drugs such as liothyronine in the UK, compared to other countries, and hopes that future MSPs will continue to work as thyroid champions to help progress the ongoing issues.

*S5M-24419 Fulton MacGregor: Mears Scotland Apprenticeships—That the Parliament commends Mears Scotland and North Lanarkshire Council for the creation of 20 new apprenticeship opportunities; notes that, by providing these first steps onto the career ladder, Mears Scotland is working towards its commitment to improving neighbourhoods, creating opportunities for people and developing the next generation of its workforce; understands that this intake of apprentices is an increase on previous years, due to the recognition of the challenges facing young people in Scotland as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, and highlights that Mears Scotland have now created 170 apprenticeships to date with North Lanarkshire Council as part of a shared commitment to the creation of new skilled jobs in the community.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
