*<u>S6M-00792</u> Stuart McMillan: National Eye Health Week 2021—That the Parliament notes National Eye Health Week, which it considers does great work in promoting the importance of maintaining good eye health and, in 2021, runs from 20 to 26 September; believes that it continues to be vital for people in Scotland to book their free eye health check every two years in order to pick up changes to the eyes before they affect the vision; understands that 50% of sight loss is avoidable; notes the measures put in place in optometry practices across Scotland by healthcare professionals to make attending an eye health check safe during the COVID-19 pandemic; commends the work of Optometry Scotland and RNIB Scotland to encourage people to return to practices and check their eye health; emphasises what it considers the need to not forget eye health checks, and notes the call for people in Greenock and Inverclyde, and across Scotland, to book their free eye health check if they have not attended an examination in the last two years.

Championships—That the Parliament applauds the Chryston local, Brodie Young, on winning gold with Team GB at the European Under-20 Championships in Estonia; notes that Brodie was part of a four-man team that won the Men's 4x400m Relay Final; understands that Brodie ran 400m in 47.31 seconds, and that Team GB finished the race with a time of 3:05.25, which was almost two seconds faster than second place; praises the young athlete for his hard work, and wishes him the best of luck going forward in his athletic career.

Change, which was created in 2018, aims to promote sustainability, education and accessibility, particularly in relation to the climate emergency, nature and disabilities, ensuring that people with disabilities or mobility issues are able to access areas of natural beauty, including beaches; thanks Sea the Change for its positive work in helping to increase disability inclusion and in promoting education on the climate emergency, and wishes everyone involved success for the future.

*<u>S6M-00789</u> Lorna Slater: Support for Hospitality Workers—That the Parliament notes what it considers concerning reports from the Unite trade union, which warns of a "sharp increase of verbal and physical abuse from customers" against hospitality workers; believes that low pay and insecure working conditions were endemic in the hospitality industry prior to the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that many hospitality workers are young workers; notes the recent Resolution Foundation study that found that, at the end of May 2021, 18- to 24-year-olds were 2.5 times more likely than any other age group to have been out of work or still on furlough, and that more than one in four 18- to 24-year-olds said that they were concerned about finding a job in future due to mental health issues; further notes the calls for investment in retraining and mental health services, as well as long-term plans to improve incomes and job stability as part of a new approach to hospitality, and believes that the calls from Unite for extra security for busy venues and proactive anti-sexual harassment policies should be adopted.

*<u>S6M-00788</u> Maggie Chapman: Recognising the Heroism of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution—That the Parliament recognises the heroic efforts of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI) in rescuing people at sea, particularly those fleeing war and persecution; understands what it believes is the pressure that the UK Government's so-called "hostile" immigration policies place on the services that it provides; considers that the climate and ecological crises will lead to further pressure on the lives and livelihoods of those in the Global South, and that safe routes need to be established for people seeking safety and asylum; notes that the RNLI is staffed by dedicated volunteers who put their lives on the line to rescue vulnerable people in danger and distress; recognises that the RNLI carries out its work without prejudice or judgement, and commends it for this work.
