***[S6M-00430](#) Christine Grahame: Mineworkers' Pension Scheme**—That the Parliament notes the recent report by the UK Parliament's Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy Select Committee into the Mineworkers' Pension Scheme; understands that the scheme, established in 1994, meant a 50/50 split in surplus sharing between the miners and the UK Government and that, to date, the UK Government has received £4.4 billion, with at least a further £1.9 billion due and the UK Government paying nothing into the fund; further understands, however, that many beneficiaries are struggling to make ends meet, including those in the Midlothian South, Tweeddale and Lauderdale constituency; notes that the committee therefore recommended amending the 50/50 surplus sharing arrangements in the miners' favour, and immediately giving the £1.2 billion currently held in the Investment Reserve to former miners; understands that the Welsh Government has registered support for these recommendations, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to do likewise.

***[S6M-00428](#) Ariane Burgess: Capercaillie Population Dips Below 1,000**—That the Parliament notes with concern recent reports of a sharp decline in Scotland's capercaillie population; understands that Cairngorms National Park Authority (CNPA) has said it will not reach its target of increasing the population of the bird to 1,200; recognises that the CNPA recently estimated that there are currently around 700 of the species in the park; acknowledges that a fuller picture of the population will be available in the winter; further notes that the CNPA believes that a loss of habitat and disturbance by humans has contributed to the population decline; believes that the plight of the capercaillie is part of a wider ongoing nature emergency, and urges the Scottish Government to take swift action to tackle the decline of this iconic Highland species.

***S6M-00425 Stephanie Callaghan: Biomedical Science Day on 24 June 2021**—That the Parliament recognises Biomedical Science Day on 24 June 2021; acknowledges that biomedical scientists, clinical scientists and laboratory staff play a key role in ensuring the delivery of high-quality healthcare, and thanks the biomedical profession for its outstanding contribution during the COVID-19 pandemic.

***S6M-00424 Richard Leonard: Pay Justice for Serco Caledonian Sleeper Workers**—That the Parliament commends what it sees as the essential role played by Serco Caledonian Sleeper workers throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, to ensure that rail services on the route could continue to run; understands that workers employed by Serco Caledonian Sleeper have been subjected to a pay freeze for 2021-22; is concerned that a pay freeze fails to take into account the vital role played by these workers during the pandemic, and the rise in the cost of living; believes that all workers on the Serco Caledonian Sleeper deserve a fair pay award for 2021-22; further understands that under the terms of its Emergency Measures Agreements (EMA) with the Scottish Government, Serco Caledonian Sleeper is able to receive performance and management fees; believes that, as the Scottish Government is managing the franchise via the EMA, only it has the ability to resolve the dispute, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to intervene as a matter of urgency and commit itself and Serco Caledonian Sleeper to meaningful talks with the RMT, with the purpose of reaching a fair resolution to this dispute. **R**

***S6M-00423 Kaukab Stewart: Lady Rae Makes History as Female Rector of the University of Glasgow**—That the Parliament congratulates Lady Rae on her election as rector of the University of Glasgow on 21 April 2021; notes that Lady Rae follows Winnie Mandela's election in 1987 as only the second woman elected to this Rectorship; further notes that Lady Rae's election makes history as she is the first female working rector, rather than it being a symbolic role; understands that the role of rector has existed at the University of Glasgow since 1542, and that such an appointment is therefore long overdue; acknowledges that a career spanning five decades, providing legal representation and services to the people of Glasgow, saw Lady Rae begin as a solicitor in Glasgow, become a partner in a leading criminal law practice, be appointed Queen's Counsel in 1992, serve as a sheriff in Glasgow and a senator of the College of Justice, and hold a seat as an upper tribunal judge, presiding over immigration and asylum appeals; notes that Lady Rae was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Laws from the University of Glasgow in 2019, in recognition of her contribution to Scots Law; recognises that Lady Rae's historic appointment marks a step towards improved gender representation in high office that the institution of the University of Glasgow and its constituent community should take pride and inspiration from in future; applauds Lady Rae for her distinguished career achievements and public duty, and wishes her success in her role as rector, delivering on commitments to widen participation, promote diversity, improve student safety and welfare.
