\*S6M-00005 Alex Cole-Hamilton: COVID-19 Crisis in India —That the Parliament recognises the scale of the humanitarian crisis ongoing in India as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic; acknowledges reports that over 250,000 people have died as a result of the virus; further acknowledges reports that the country's health service is completely overwhelmed and that thousands of people are being left untreated due to a lack of oxygen and ventilators; is deeply saddened by reports of crematoriums being overrun; offers condolences to all those in India who have lost loved ones; further acknowledges that this crisis will be particularly concerning for

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Scotland's citizens of Indian descent, and calls on the Scottish Government to assist the Indian government with such resources it can make available.

Rebuild lives" campaign; understands that the event runs throughout May and the campaign will raise awareness of the damaging effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on stroke research; notes that a severe drop in charitable income means that the charity's research budget for 2021 has been cut in half, putting new, innovative research at risk; further notes the charity's calls for people to donate, fundraise and raise awareness of its stroke research; considers that, in addition, Stroke Awareness Month is intended to raise awareness of strokes, their impact on people who have had them and on their friends and families, in addition to educating the general public on the signs and symptoms of strokes, what causes strokes, what happens during a stroke and what to do in the event of someone having a stroke, and wishes everyone involved all the very best in their endeavours. For each Bill, the date of the next (or most recent) event in the Bill's passage is given. Other relevant information, e.g. about lodging amendments, is given in italics.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.

# European Charter of Local Self-Government (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill (M)

Passed, 23 March 2021

# UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Legal Continuity) (Scotland) Bill (G)

Passed, 21 March 2018

Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court has ruled that some provisions of the Bill are outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament. The Bill cannot be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form.

# United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill (G) Passed, 16 March 2021
