### **Election of Members to the Scottish Parliamentary Corporate Body**

Further to the announcement in yesterday's Business Bulletin, elections for membership of the SPCB will take place this afternoon. The nomination period will open at 9.30am this morning and close at 1.30pm.

The nominating member should email the Parliamentary Business Team (business.team@parliament.scot) from their parliamentary email address confirming the name of the nominee and the name of the Member who is seconding the nomination. The Parliamentary Business Team will email the nominee and the seconder in order to confirm that the information provided is correct.

Voting procedure is below.

Where the number of candidates is equal to the number of vacancies:

The Presiding Officer will invite members to agree that there be a single vote to elect all the candidates. If all members agree that there should be a single vote, the Presiding Officer will read out the names of the candidates. After all the names are read out, members may vote for or against the candidates, or abstain. The candidates will be elected if there is a simple majority of votes in favour of their election. The candidates will be eliminated from the election if a simple majority of votes in favour of their election is not obtained.

If any member disagrees to a single question being put, a separate vote will be called for each candidate in alphabetical order. Members may vote for or against each candidate, or abstain. The candidate will be elected if he or she obtains a simple majority of votes in his or her favour.

Where there are more candidates than the number of vacancies:

Members will be asked to cast their vote for their preferred candidate. A separate vote will be called for each candidate in alphabetical order. Members must vote once only and only use their "yes" button when voting. If any Member casts more than one vote, their votes will be treated as spoiled, and none of their votes will count. Any member wishing to record an abstention will have an opportunity to do so at the end of voting for the candidates.

Once all voting has been completed, there will be a short delay of a few minutes while the result is verified. The Presiding Officer will then announce: the number of votes cast; the votes for each of the candidates; and the votes to abstain. A candidate will be elected if an overall majority is obtained. If no majority is obtained, the candidate or candidates with the smallest number of votes will be eliminated and a further round or rounds of voting will take place until the vacancy is filled.

Where there are fewer candidates than the number of vacancies:

Voting will proceed in the same manner as if the number of candidates is equal to the number of vacancies. Under Rule 11.10A.19 of Standing Orders, the Presiding Officer will announce that the

total number of vacancies has not been filled and a further election for the remaining candidates will be held. The date and time will be announced in the Business Bulletin.

## Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-00057 Daniel Johnson: Supporting Recovery in the Retail Sector—That the Parliament notes the recent figures published by the Scottish Retail Consortium indicating that retail sales remain significantly below pre-pandemic levels; remains concerned that, given retail is the largest sector of employment within the private sector, continued depressed sales levels could have major consequences on employment levels, suppliers to the sector and, consequently, the wider economy; considers that local communities rely on local high streets in South Edinburgh and across Scotland, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to extend support to the sector and to work with trade unions and retail businesses to ensure an effective recovery plan is put in place for this vital sector. \*S6M-00059 Jim Fairlie: Crieff and Strathearn Drovers' Tryst Walking Festival 2021—That the Parliament welcomes the return of the Crieff and Strathearn Drovers' Tryst walking festival, to be held over 29 to 31 May and 17 to 19 July; recognises that the festival, normally an annual event, celebrates the legacy of the people who made Crieff the cattle-droving crossroads of Scotland in the 1700s; congratulates the organisers on putting together a programme that once again offers a wide choice of guided walks at different levels of difficulty; recognises the work done in ensuring that there will be COVID-19-related adaptations, and wishes all participants a safe and enjoyable Tryst.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.

# European Charter of Local Self-Government (Incorporation) (Scotland) Bill (M)

# UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Legal Continuity) (Scotland) Bill (G) Passed. 21 March 2018

Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court has ruled that some provisions of the Bill are outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament. The Bill cannot be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form.
