*S6M-02143 Gordon MacDonald: Edinburgh Achieves Living Wage City Status—That the Parliament notes that 15 to 19 November 2021 is Living Wage Week, which is an annual celebration of the real living wage; commends Edinburgh on being awarded Living Wage City status by Living Wage Scotland in recognition of the capital's ambition to deliver on its Edinburgh Living Wage City action plan and double the number of living wage-accredited businesses across the city over the next few years; notes that around 450 businesses in Edinburgh are already committed to voluntarily paying their staff at least the living wage, a minimum of £9.90 per hour; recognises that the action plan, which aims is to see at least 500 new accredited businesses, was developed by the Edinburgh Living Wage Action Group, which is a collaboration of employers, public sector bodies, trade unions, social enterprises and business organisations, and is supported by key city institutions, including the City of Edinburgh Council and the Edinburgh Partnership; understands that this could mean that up to 40,000 workers in the capital will be protected by their employers committing to the living wage, with an estimated 10,000 receiving a direct pay increase as a result, and agrees that being an accredited living wage employer is not just about paying at least the the living wage, but also about entrenching a culture of fair work, giving staff financial security and demonstrating that their contribution is truly valued.

System, Glasgow—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the innovation of ng homes, which is Glasgow's largest community-run housing association, in commissioning Scotland's highest district heating system to serve 600 flats at its six 26-storey blocks at Balgrayhill Road and Edgefauld Road in Springburn, Glasgow; notes that the 243-foot high flats, which were officially opened by Prime Minister Harold Wilson in 1968, are the tallest residential buildings in Scotland; understands that the £25 million investment follows a 2016 survey of residents, which suggested that more than 60% were living in fuel poverty; believes that six banks of Mitsubishi airsource heat pumps have been installed on the roof of each tower block by the largest crane in Europe, with the heat generated shared among the flats below using a pumped water piping system with heat exchangers, and that the six independent district heating systems, which work even in sub-zero outside temperatures, will reduce the average cost per unit of energy for tenants by between 40% and 60%, reduce energy use by 64% and reduce overall emissions by more than a third; congratulates ng homes, supported by the Scottish Government's Social Housing Net-Zero Heat Fund, and its partners, the McDermott Group, Easy Heat Systems and M-Four, on the successful delivery of what it believes is a pioneering engineering project that will reduce fuel poverty and carbon emissions, and supports its adoption as a sustainable heating solution for high-rise residential buildings nationwide.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.

Final Proposal for a Member's Bill

Pam Duncan-Glancy: Proposed Disabled Children and Young People Transitions (Scotland) Bill—Proposal for a Bill to require the Scottish Ministers to introduce, and to implement, a statutory National Transitions Strategy to improve outcomes for disabled children and young people in the transition to adulthood; to require the Scottish Ministers to assign to a member of the Scottish Government, or to a junior Scottish Minister, special responsibility in relation to the exercise of their functions under the legislation; and to require local authorities to introduce a transitions plan for each disabled child and young person to ensure that each disabled child and young person receives appropriate care and support before, and during, the transition to adulthood. (lodged 9 November 2021)

The proposal was accompanied by a statement of reasons, which is accessible online via the website page referred to above, or in the Scottish Parliament Information Centre (SPICe).
