*S6M-02278 Richard Leonard: Role of Rail in Achieving Climate Change Targets—That the Parliament commends what it considers the essential role played by Serco Caledonian Sleeper workers throughout the COVID-19 pandemic; notes what it sees as the vital role that rail has to play in delivering a modal shift from high- to low-carbon transport, including in Central Scotland, and meeting Scotland's climate change targets; understands that, since March 2020, Serco Caledonian Sleeper has been operating under an emergency measures agreement, through which the Scottish Government takes on all cost and revenue risk, and the operator is permitted to receive payment of fees; further understands that members of the National Union of Rail, Maritime and Transport Workers (RMT) employed by Serco Caledonian Sleeper have taken industrial action across several months during 2021 in a dispute over pay; believes that the RMT has concerns relating to health and safety matters and reported bullying and harassment of staff at Serco Caledonian Sleeper, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to meet with representatives of the RMT and Serco Caledonian Sleeper, and use what it sees as its leverage to ensure there is a resolution to the pay dispute, health and safety concerns, and what it considers mistreatment of staff, in order that the service can continue to play its full part in helping to achieve Scotland's climate change targets. R

*<u>S6M-02237</u> Christine Grahame: Homecoming for Mary Queen of Scots—That the Parliament notes calls for the return of the remains of Mary Queen of Scots to the country of her birth; considers that Mary was an iconic historical figure in Scotland; believes that the return of her remains would help educate many people, from the north of Scotland to the south of England, about her significance and about this period in Scotland's history; understands that Falkland Palace, in which, many contemporary chroniclers believed, the Scots Queen spent her happiest days, was a place of sanctuary for Mary, and notes the view that this Fife palace would be a possible location, where her remains could be interred.

Elimination of Violence Against Women and Girls on 25 November and the 16 days of activism that follow, which focuses attention on the ongoing need for action; notes with concern reports that conditions created during the pandemic, including lockdowns and social isolation, are understood to have led to an alarming increase in male violence against women and girls; notes that genderbased violence encompasses acts that are likely to result in physical, sexual and mental harm, and considers that there are gaps in legislation to deal effectively with spiking, revenge porn, and other forms of misogynistic online abuse and bullying, incidents of which are all reportedly continuing to increase; further considers that, while the justice system should look at ways to use current laws and to create new laws to meet the challenges of these new types of abuse, gender-based violence is endemic in a society where sexism, misogyny and rape culture are often normalised; acknowledges the view that socio-economic factors can hinder women's access to the justice system, sometimes resulting in under reporting of crime and stigma of speaking up, and believes that true gender equality is the only way to eliminate violence against women and girls.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
