S6M-01512 Michael Matheson: Legislative Consent to the Environment Bill—That the Parliament notes the supplementary legislative consent memorandum on the UK Environment Bill lodged by the Scottish Government on 9 July 2021, and the report of the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee of 29 September 2021; calls on the UK Government to respect the devolved powers of the Scottish Parliament with respect to measures with an environmental purpose in Scotland; further calls on the UK Government to amend clause 119 (formerly 107) to adequately reflect the devolved purpose of these regulations, and calls on the UK Government to remove clause 20(4) – (6), as it is inappropriate for the UK Government to seek to impose its own environmental principles on UK ministers for decisions with respect to Scotland.

S6M-00554 Gordon MacDonald: Big Noise Programme in Wester Hailes—That the Parliament commends Sistema Scotland, an award-winning music education charity, on launching a major new music project in spring 2022 in Edinburgh's Wester Hailes; notes that the programme aims to transform the lives of hundreds of children growing up in the area; understands that the Big Noise community orchestra will gradually be created by the project, which aims to reach more than 400 participants in its first year, and will eventually involve all ages from babies to school-leavers: recognises that the charity targets disadvantaged parts of Scotland for intensive long-term programmes offering youngsters up to four after-school sessions of intervention and support a week during term time, and up to four days each week during the spring, summer, and autumn holidays until they leave school; notes that the project will be working in partnership with the City of Edinburgh Council, and with Clovenstone, Canal View, and Sighthill Primary School and Nursery, and intends to also work alongside local charities and community groups to bring additional support and value to Wester Hailes; appreciates that Big Noise has a long-standing track record of delivering high-quality music education and social change to communities that helps children improve their concentration and language skills, enhance their problem solving and decision making, increase their self-esteem and creativity, and develop strong friendships and support networks, and notes Sistema Scotland's belief that all children and young people have great skills, talents and potential, and that it has never been more important to think and act creatively to ensure that children across Scotland are given the opportunities and support that they deserve.

Motions for Debate

*S6M-01527 Angus Robertson: Scotland in the World – Championing Progressive Values—That the Parliament welcomes the internationalist vision for Scotland set out in the Programme for Government and the Scotlish Government's commitment to be a good global citizen; supports the measures outlined to promote progressive values globally and offer practical help to international partners, notably a 50% increase in the Scotlish Government's International Development Fund and doubling of the Just Transition Fund, the opening of additional Scotlish Government hubs in Copenhagen and Warsaw, and the ambition to align domestic policy objectives with the approach to international development; regrets the actions taken by the UK Government, particularly since 2016, which have reduced its standing in the world, for example the deplorable decision to cut its Official Development Assistance by a third, which will hit the world's poorest communities at a time of great need; notes the increasingly interdependent nature of the world and the necessity of cooperation between nations to address global challenges; welcomes the Scotlish Government's commitment to promote democracy, fairness and human rights across the world; recognises Scotland's distinctive profile on the world stage, and believes that Brexit, which the overwhelming majority of people in Scotland did not vote for, is at odds with that internationalist ambition.

*S6M-01512 Michael Matheson: Legislative Consent to the Environment Bill—That the Parliament notes the supplementary legislative consent memorandum on the UK Environment Bill lodged by the Scottish Government on 9 July 2021, and the report of the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee of 29 September 2021; calls on the UK Government to respect the devolved powers of the Scottish Parliament with respect to measures with an environmental purpose in Scotland; further calls on the UK Government to amend clause 119 (formerly 107) to adequately reflect the devolved purpose of these regulations, and calls on the UK Government to remove clause 20(4) – (6), as it is inappropriate for the UK Government to seek to impose its own environmental principles on UK ministers for decisions with respect to Scotland.

*S6M-01409 Collette Stevenson: Baby Loss Awareness Week 2021—That the Parliament notes that 9 to 15 October 2021 is Baby Loss Awareness Week; understands that the week aims to commemorate babies' lives and raise awareness about pregnancy and baby loss across the country; welcomes the work of the Baby Loss Awareness Alliance, a collaboration of more than 100 charities, to drive policy change, improve services and break the taboo surrounding the death of a baby; commends the activism by many people who have been affected by miscarriage, which, it considers, has led to important developments in policy; notes the view that there should be dedicated facilities for women experiencing unexpected pregnancy complications; understands that the Scottish Government's Women's Health Plan commits to establishing a dignified, compassionate miscarriage service tailored to the needs of women; thanks Sands and other organisations in the Baby Loss Awareness Alliance for supporting women and families through an extremely difficult time; supports all efforts to reduce the number of babies dying, and notes the call for everyone to remember all babies who have died too soon by joining the global Wave of Light by lighting a candle at 7pm on 15 October.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

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*S6M-01490 Fiona Hyslop: Publication of the Communiqué Setting Out the Conclusions of the Glasgow Climate Dialogues—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of the communiqué setting out the conclusions of the Glasgow Climate Dialogues, hosted by the Scottish Government and Stop Climate Chaos Scotland; understands that these dialogues were a series of online discussions, which took place between 6 and 9 September 2021, providing a forum for civil society and government departments from impacted countries in the Global South to discuss and share their positions on some of the key priorities for action at and beyond COP26, while developing a shared understanding of these key issues and identifying where collective action can advance United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) goals and objectives; notes that the communiqué includes recommendations related to ensuring equitable access, participation and voice at the talks, the need for developed countries to significantly increase the financial support available to help impacted communities adapt to spiralling climate impacts, the need to address the losses and damages created by climate impacts that go beyond the limits of adaptation, and the need to ensure a global Just Transition based on the UNFCCC principles of common but differentiated responsibilities and respective capabilities and the right to development; commends the Scottish Government and Stop Climate Chaos Scotland for facilitating these dialogues, and notes the calls for ministers to respond positively, including by placing these priorities at the heart of the Scottish Government's own activities for COP26 and encouraging support for them from other UNFCCC participants.

*S6M-01481 Sharon Dowey: Elizabeth Strachan Marks 50 Years of Service with Ayr Guides—That the Parliament congratulates Elizabeth Strachan from Ayrshire as she marks 50 years of service with Ayr Guides; recognises Elizabeth's dedication on meeting the Guides every Wednesday for half a century; understands that the girl guiding programme is designed to inspire, challenge and encourage girls to make a real difference in their community; realises that Elizabeth is helping young people in her community make lifelong friends, and wishes Elizabeth and the Ayr Guides well as they continue to meet up and take on new challenges.

*S6M-01480 Sharon Dowey: Ayrshire Records 60 Suspected Drug Deaths Between January and June 2021—That the Parliament notes with concern that the Ayrshire region recorded 60 suspected drug deaths between January and June 2021; is further concerned that there was an increase in drug deaths across Scotland last year by 75 deaths, with an overall total of 1,339; acknowledges that every drug death is a tragedy; understands that reported rehab funding reductions by the Scottish Government are having a devastating impact, and believes that the Scottish Government must start listening to frontline experts if drug-users are to be supported in their mission to recovery.

*S6M-01479 Sharon Dowey: Ayrshire Hillwalkers Complete Scotland's 282 Munros—That the Parliament congratulates Harry Kirkwood and Wallis Riddell, who are from Ayrshire, on climbing all of Scotland's 282 Munros; notes that this achievement was gained when they bagged their final Munro, the 4,000ft Aonach Mor, Near Fort William; acknowledges that this is Harry's second complete set of Munros; understands that the pair got together in 2006 with the aim of completing all the Munros, and wishes Harry and Wallis well as they continue to keep walking and climbing together.

*S6M-01478 Gillian Mackay: Alcohol Marketing During Six Nations Championship—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of the report, *Alcohol marketing during the 2020 Six Nations*

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Championship: A frequency analysis, which was prepared for Scottish Health Action on Alcohol Problems, the Institute of Alcohol Studies and Alcohol Action Ireland by the University of Stirling; notes that it highlights what it sees as the prevalence of alcohol advertising in sport; understands that it found that, in coverage of the 2020 Scotland v England Six Nations rugby match in Edinburgh, references to alcohol appeared several hundred times; is concerned that it is estimated that over 30 million children are likely to see and be influenced by alcohol advertising during tournaments such as the Six Nations, with an estimated audience of 125 million; understands that the alcohol industry's voluntary code of practice states that drinks companies must endeavour to ensure that at least 75% of the audience at such events is over 18; believes that children exposed to alcohol advertising are more likely to start drinking at a younger age and drink more heavily in later life; understands that, in 2020, 1,190 people died of a cause wholly attributable to alcohol; considers that it is incongruous to have alcohol associated with sport and physical activity, which it believes is one of the best things that people can do to help prevent many of the noncommunicable diseases to which alcohol contributes; commends Scottish Women's Football, which does not accept alcohol or gambling sponsors in recognition of what it considers is the need for young people to have positive role models and a healthier view of life; welcomes the Scottish Government's commitment to consult on potential alcohol advertising restrictions in 2022, and, as part of this consultation, encourages it to address what it believes is the anomaly of alcohol sponsorship of sport.

*S6M-01476 Liam McArthur: The Orcadian Awarded Special Chairman's Award at Scottish Press Awards—That the Parliament congratulates *The Orcadian* newspaper on being awarded the Special Chairman's Award at the Scottish Press Awards 2021 on 29 September; further congratulates *The Orcadian* on being placed as runners-up in the Journalism Team of the Year category; understands that the Orkney-based newspaper won the award in recognition of its high-quality local journalism and for its efforts to support the local community during the COVID-19 pandemic; notes that the newspaper has served Orkney since 1854 and has been crowned Newspaper of the Year, among other awards, in recent years; believes that the importance of a healthy and vibrant local press has been reinforced during the COVID-19 pandemic, as people and communities have relied even more heavily on trusted and informed sources of news and information; acknowledges the loyal readership that *The Orcadian* has built up within Orkney and well beyond, and pays tribute to all those who won and were nominated for awards after what has been a particularly challenging period for all those in the sector.

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Rousay, in Orkney, by the University of the Highlands and Islands (UHI); recognises that this award has come in recognition of Professor Mainland's multiple research achievements since joining UHI in 2009, including helping to establish archaeological science as part of the university curriculum and spearheading the growth of archaeological science masters programmes at UHI; notes the importance of Professor Mainland's work to Scotland's Northern Isles in particular, such as research into the sustainability of farming and food production in Viking and Late Norse Scotland, research into fauna from the Ness of Brodgar on Orkney, and research into the hall and farmstead at Skaill, and congratulates her on this fantastic achievement.
