*S6M-01621 Sarah Boyack: Place2Be – Celebrating 20 Years of Expert Mental Health Support in Scottish Schools - That the Parliament notes that autumn 2021 marks 20 years of Place2Be providing expert mental health support in Scottish schools; understands that Place2Be's work in Scotland started with an initial pilot in two Edinburgh primary schools; further understands that it now reaches over 22,000 pupils and their families in schools across Glasgow, Edinburgh, South Lanarkshire, Stirling, Renfrewshire, Angus, Perth and Kinross, Dundee, North and South Ayrshire and the Highlands; believes that Place2Be is a pioneer in early intervention and prevention, helping children to tackle problems before they escalate and develop into adulthood; understands that Place2Be helps schools to develop a Whole School Approach to mental health support, with the child and their rights at the centre; further understands that Place2Be works closely with education professionals across Scotland, providing support and advice through a partnership with Moray House School of Education and Sport; understands that Place2Be ensures that its services are evidence based and have a demonstrable impact on children and young people; acknowledges the reported findings that over 80% of those with severe difficulties show an improvement in wellbeing after counselling with Place2Be, and notes that Place2Be will be sharing content throughout its 20th year to showcase and celebrate the schools, counsellors, young people, parents and partners who are committed to improving the mental health of children and young people across Scotland.

*<u>S6M-01584</u> Alexander Burnett: Santander UK Partners with National Parks UK—That the Parliament welcomes Santander UK's announcement that it has joined National Parks UK in becoming a founding partner of the Net Zero With Nature strategy in the Cairngorms National Park; understands that Santander aims to be net zero by 2050 and, through this partnership, will look to use the natural environment to capture and lock in carbon by funding a new project involving the restoration of 220 hectares of damaged peatland in the Cairngorms National Park, which has the potential to capture more than 16,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions over its first five years; acknowledges that the UK's national parks contain almost a quarter of the UK's peatland, with ecologists estimating that restoring degraded peat could mitigate nearly 5% of the UK's entire annual emissions; understands, however, that these peatlands are mostly degraded, with just one fifth remaining in a near-natural state, and believes that this project will support the UK's net zero target, helping to achieve the Climate Change Committee's target of restoring 79% of the UK's peatlands by 2050, as well as the aim set out in the Scottish Government's Climate Change Plan to be net zero by 2045. **R**

*<u>S6M-01583</u> Liam McArthur: Royal Mail Begins Drone Trials in Orkney—That the Parliament recognises the start of a two-week drone trial in the Orkney Islands by the Royal Mail to help better connect remote island communities; understands that the postal network will carry out autonomous flights between Kirkwall and the most northerly island community in Orkney, North Ronaldsay, using a twin-engine, UK-built, unmanned aerial vehicle, named Ultra, which can support 100kg of post over 100km; acknowledges the ingenuity of the project being taken forward by Royal Mail and Windracers Ltd, which is in keeping with the world-leading innovation already being showcased in Orkney in areas such as renewable energy and low-carbon transport; wishes all involved with the drone project every success, and looks forward to more detail on the findings ahead of its potential deployment in the future.
