\*S6M-01144 Pam Duncan-Glancy: Challenge Poverty Week 2021—That the Parliament recognises Challenge Poverty Week 2021, which runs from 4 to 10 October; notes that activities and events are taking place across Scotland, including many in Glasgow, aimed at highlighting the realities of and solutions to poverty, and increasing public support for tackling poverty; understands that, even prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, over one million people, including one in four children, were living in the grip of poverty across Scotland; considers that governments, politicians, civil society, and communities all have a role to play in solving poverty; understands that particular groups of people, including low-paid women, lone parents, disabled people and people from black and minority ethnic backgrounds, are disproportionately more likely to experience poverty; considers that poverty in Scotland can and must be solved, by boosting incomes and reducing the cost of living; and celebrates the work undertaken by organisations and communities across Scotland to loosen the grip of poverty on people's lives.

\*<u>S6M-01153</u> Martin Whitfield: Launch of Scouts Scotland Squirrel Scouts—That the Parliament welcomes the announcement by Scouts Scotland of a brand new programme for young people who are aged four and five, known as Squirrel Scouts; recognises that the Squirrel programme builds on a successful pilot project, which was evaluated by the Centre for Research in Early Childhood and was shown to have had a positive impact on children's development, especially in the areas of communication and language skills, and life skills; congratulates Scouts Scotland for prioritising the roll-out of new groups, Squirrel Dreys, in areas most affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, and looks forward to new Squirrel Scouts learning new skills for life and earning new badges.

\*S6M-01152 Alexander Stewart: The Macmillan World's Biggest Coffee Morning 2021—That the Parliament supports the Macmillan World's Biggest Coffee Morning 2021 initiative; understands that the official coffee morning date is 24 September 2021, and that the charity is grateful for events to be held at any time; acknowledges that this charity fundraiser event has generated millions of pounds in donations in past years, which helps to fund Macmillan services across Scotland to ensure that people living with cancer are able to access the physical, emotional and financial support they need; understands that around 98% of Macmillan's funding comes directly from donations, however, that disruption caused by COVID-19 has meant that demand for its services is exceptionally high whilst fundraising remains extremely challenging, and the charity has estimated that it could see a combined £40 million drop in its coffee morning income across 2020 and 2021; considers that Scotland's cancer care system is under serious pressure, with many services and waiting times at a critical level despite the tremendous efforts of immensely hard-working and dedicated NHS staff, who are working round-the-clock to ensure that people are able to access care, treatment and support; encourages everyone in the communities who are able to do whatever they can for Macmillan's coffee mornings; commends the charity and the work of its volunteers and fundraisers, and wishes them all the very best in their tireless endeavours.

\*<u>S6M-01151</u> Alex Cole-Hamilton: Ensuring Women and Girls Can Travel Safely—That the Parliament acknowledges the importance of ensuring women and girls can travel safely, including through open spaces; welcomes the work of Councillor Hal Osler in bringing forward the motion, Creating a safer first and last mile journey for women and girls, to City of Edinburgh Council; acknowledges that Safe Cities and Safe Public Spaces is a core partnership initiative of UN Women (of the United Nations), which aims to achieve the 2018-21 strategic plan objective of

creating more cities and other settings with safe and empowering public spaces for women and girls; notes the Atkins report, *Get Home Safe*, which calls on transport planners and urban designers to take action to ensure the first and last miles of women's journeys are safer, and recommends improving visibility through a preference for low-to-the-ground planting of vegetation and the removal of walls and barriers, encouraging active building frontages to provide 'eyes on the street', and providing emergency contact and digital wayfinding apps, and encourages other councillors to consider these recommendations when they are considering town planning and the development of Scotland's spaces for the future.

Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court has ruled that some provisions of the Bill are outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament. The Bill cannot be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form.
