## Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-03957 Katy Clark: Emergency Rent Freeze—That the Parliament notes the publication of the Scottish Government's Private Sector Rent Statistics 2010 to 2021, which reportedly show that the average monthly rent for a two bedroom property rose in real terms by 6.8% in Ayrshire and 7.1% in West Dunbartonshire over the last year; further notes that the average monthly rent for a two bedroom property reportedly rose by 25.1% across Scotland between 2010 and 2021; notes the publication of analysis by the estate and letting agent, Hamptons, which reportedly found that the average private renter's household in Scotland spent 32% of post-tax income on rent in 2021; considers that these price rises are unsustainable for renters in Scotland, in light of the reported cost of living crisis and the UK Consumer Price Index (CPI) rate reportedly being 8.5%, which it understands is the highest recorded rate since this historical modelled data series began in 1989; notes with concern reports that the number of people living in poverty who live in the private rented sector has tripled over the last decade, according to the Joseph Rowntree Foundation; notes the calls for a Scottish Living Rent Commission to be set up to regulate the sector; believes that spiralling rent costs, bill costs and price rises mean that renters cannot afford to wait until 2025 for a system of rent controls to be implemented, as set out in the consultation, A New Deal for Tenants - draft strategy, and notes the view that an emergency rent freeze for all public and private sector renters should be implemented for a determined period.

\*<u>S6M-03918</u> Katy Clark: Municipal Bus Ownership—That the Parliament notes the publication of the responses to the consultation, Implementing Part 3 of the Transport (Scotland) Act 2019: Bus Services; further notes that a key provision in the Act is to give local transport authorities (LTAs) the power to establish and run local bus services; understands that a key theme across the responses was the need for the Scottish Ministers and Transport Scotland to provide financial and practical support to local authorities in order to implement this provision successfully; further understands from the publication that a significant number of respondents expressed a negative view towards Bus Service Improvement Partnerships (BSIPs), and took the view that they would maintain the perceived failed policy of bus deregulation and would not address issues such as high fares and lack of services to perceived underserved areas; understands that forming a BSIP with private operators is a condition to receiving support via the Scottish Government's Bus Partnership Fund; notes the view expressed by trade unions and campaigners that this funding

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stream coerces local authorities into the partnership model; further notes the view that equivalent levels of funding should be made available to local authorities that wish to pursue municipally owned or franchising models; notes the 2019 Transport Focus survey, which reportedly found that the municipally-owned company, Lothian Buses, was considered by passengers to be the best value-for-money service in Scotland, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to provide the necessary funding and support to enable local authorities to replicate this model with a view to reversing the reported falling passenger numbers, cutting fare costs and providing a world-class service.

#### Members' Business motions that have achieved cross party support

\*<u>S6M-03916</u> Graeme Dey: Commemorating 40 Years Since the Falklands War—That the Parliament marks the 40th anniversary of the Falklands War, which began on 2 April 1982 and lasted 74 days until the Argentine surrender on 14 June; remembers the 255 UK Armed Forces personnel who died and were among over 1,000 lives lost in the conflict; commemorates the service and sacrifice of all those involved, with 30,000 sailors, marines, soldiers, airmen and merchant mariners having taken part, and with many more civilians having supported the war effort; recognises the particular role of Arbroath-based 45 Commando and the 2nd Battalion of the Scots Guards, which between them lost 15 men to the fighting; appreciates the efforts of poppyscotland and Legion Scotland to mark the occasion, including a service of remembrance to be held in Edinburgh on 18 June 2022, and commends the work of both organisations in supporting the veterans of this conflict and their families, many of whom continue to be affected by the tragedy of war to this day.

\*<u>S6M-03899</u> Alexander Stewart: NHS Out-of-hours GP Services—That the Parliament acknowledges what it sees as the importance of NHS out-of-hours GP services; understands that, according to Healthcare Improvement Scotland, primary care out-of-hours services are a fundamental part of the healthcare service in Scotland; notes that the service provides support to those who require medical assistance outwith normal GP surgery hours; understands that this involves a number of healthcare professionals, agencies and support staff, such as drivers, working together to provide a high-quality and integrated service for patients, with many individuals going above and beyond their normal remit to ensure maximum quality of service; notes the view that Healthcare Improvement Scotland and many GPs have collectively acknowledged that the quality and safety of out-of-hours care, such as that available in Clackmannanshire, across the Mid Scotland and Fife region, and all over Scotland, is extremely important and that patients should have access to consistent, high-quality standards of care, and further notes the calls for all regions of NHS Scotland to do all that they can to maintain, sustain and retain their out-of-hours GP services.

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\*<u>S6M-03892</u> Edward Mountain: Highland PICT Wins Emergency Services Hero Award—That the Parliament recognises that the Highland Pre-hospital Immediate Care and Trauma (PICT) team received the emergency services Hero of the Year Award at the 2022 Highland Heroes event; notes that PICT teams attend scenes of major trauma incidents and help to provide advanced care; further notes that the PICT team based at Raigmore Hospital in Inverness has been deployable seven days a week since August 2020; considers that Highland PICT meets the ambitions of the Scottish Government's national trauma network programme and plays a key role in NHS Highland's major incident planning, collaborating with the Scottish Ambulance Service and other emergency services; welcomes that NHS Highland has extended its funding to Highland PICT in order for the team to continue to provide a seven-days-a-week service until September 2022; notes the calls encouraging the NHS board to secure the longer term future of Highland PICT beyond September 2022, which ensures the service's current operational capabilities are maintained; commends all members of the Highland PICT team for the essential service that they provide, and wishes the team all the best for the future.

\*<u>S6M-03887</u> Graeme Dey: Pre-payment Meters in Scotland—That the Parliament condemns the reported higher energy costs faced by people on pre-payment meters, and considers that this is a poverty premium on households on the lowest incomes; understands that 467,000 households in Scotland, including 21.3% of those in Angus, pay for their gas and electricity via a pre-payment meter; is concerned by reports that people who topped up pre-payment meters ahead of the 1 April price rise may have this taken back by energy suppliers, including by Scottish Power and E.ON; notes the calls on energy companies to halt further installations of pre-payment meters, and on suppliers to actively contact pre-payment customers with appropriate and consistent support for those who are struggling, and further notes the calls for the UK Government to cut the cost of prepayment meter energy to the level available via Direct Debit arrangements.

\*<u>S6M-03839</u> Fiona Hyslop: Celebrating the 200th Anniversary of the Union Canal and its Contribution to Scotland—That the Parliament recognises the economic, environmental and social value of the Union Canal in 2022, its bicentenary year; commends the measures taken by Scottish Canals to mark this historic occasion with a year-long calendar of events; understands that this year will feature a blended programme of community activities as well as digital and inperson events that include a flotilla on 21 May, led by Scottish Waterways for All, a 20th birthday party at the Falkirk Wheel on 28 May, the EventScotland-funded Dandelion initiative taking to the water in June, and an online event inviting everyone to sign up for the Canal Challenge 200, to walk, cycle, wheel or paddle 200 times, for 200 days or 200km throughout the year across one or all of Scotland's canals; commends all the staff and volunteers at Scottish Canals for their hard work and dedication over the years in creating flood prevention measures, undertaking regeneration and youth work and preparing for a new marina at Winchburgh; further commends the work of Linlithgow Union Canal Society, which has cared for and developed the canal in the Linlithgow constituency for modern use, as well as undertaking other work, including the Millennium Project; recognises what it sees as the joy that the canal and its routes bring to the

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local community, and the reported increasing number of walkers, cyclists and boaters, and wishes the whole team at Scottish Canals well for all its future endeavours.
