# Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*<u>S6M-04210</u> Maggie Chapman: Revitalising Scotland's Town Centres—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the importance of the revival of Scottish town centres in the North East Scotland region, and throughout Scotland; notes the view that a town centre's first principle, which it understands aims to put the health of town centres at the heart of decision-making processes, needs to be applied consistently, not only to the retail sector but also to housing, public sector administration, healthcare, education, recreation and culture, celebrating the particularity of each town's unique history; recognises what it sees as the importance of healthy town centres for people's physical, emotional and social wellbeing; considers that the commercial sector has its role in this shift but needs certainty, and that developers will only invest in town centres if it is clear that this is a long-term and reliable policy; highlights what it sees as the importance of recognising alternatives to big retail, and celebrating and supporting co-operatives, social enterprises and community wealth-building projects, and notes the view that a renewed focus on, and priority for, town centres is essential in the context of a deepening climate crisis, and for the health and wellbeing of people in their local communities.

\*<u>S6M-04187</u> Maggie Chapman: Supporting Striking University Staff—That the Parliament notes reports that staff are taking part in two sets of industrial action in two industrial disputes at a number of universities in the North East Scotland region, and across the country; understands that these are over pension cuts and falling pay, gender and ethnicity pay gaps, precarious employment practices, and unsafe workloads, known as the Four Fights; believes that cuts to pensions of an average of 35% are going ahead on the basis of an outdated valuation of the

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Universities Superannuation Scheme (USS) pension fund; understands that this valuation was made during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on the economy, and that the health of the fund has recovered significantly since then; appreciates that the trustee that manages the scheme has reportedly confirmed that a new valuation at this point could result in benefits being increased, rather than cut; notes with regret that university management has reportedly rejected proposals made by the Universities and College Union (UCU) that are deemed to be "viable and implementable" by the USS; understands that, in a recent survey of UK higher education staff, two thirds said that they were considering leaving the sector over cuts to pensions and attacks on pay and working conditions; notes the calls on the management of all educational institutions involved in both the pensions and Four Fights disputes to engage constructively with staff and the unions to resolve the disputes, and notes the view that reversals of pension and pay cuts and urgent action against casualisation, gender and ethnicity inequalities in pay and promotions, and against unsafe workloads, are in the best interests of university staff, students, Scottish universities and Scotland as a whole.

# Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*<u>S6M-04217</u> Bill Kidd: International Workers' Memorial Day 2022—That the Parliament recognises International Workers' Memorial Day 2022, which is annually marked on 28 April to pay tribute to those who have lost their lives due to incidents at work or through work-related illness; notes with concern that Scottish Hazards has estimated that 10 people die every day in Scotland as a result of work-related incidents and illness; considers that the risks were increased for key workers during the COVID-19 pandemic, who continued working on the front lines of society and accepting the risk of infection of the virus; welcomes the many events taking place on 28 April to mark this day, and notes the commitment of the STUC to raising public awareness, and commends the work of organisations championing workers' rights, and efforts in Scotland and internationally to strengthen health and safety practices to improve working conditions.

\*<u>S6M-04216</u> Alexander Stewart: Type 31 Construction Underway at Rosyth—That the Parliament welcomes the news that construction is now underway on the first of five warships at Babcock's base in Rosyth, as part of a £1.25 billion UK Ministry of Defence (MOD) contract that it understands will create 1,250 jobs across Fife; understands that the commencement of construction of the first of the type 31 frigates, to be named HMS Venturer, was marked by a keel-laying ceremony, which was held on 26 April 2022, and which included a specially-commissioned coin, designed by Josh Duffy from Lochgelly West Primary School, being placed under the keel; further understands that the ceremony was held in the Venturer Building, which was built to house two frigates for uninterrupted parallel assembly, and that, on completion of the initial ship, Josh's coin will be presented to the captain and crew; understands that Babcock's Team 31 has been contracted by the MOD to deliver five Type 31 frigates; believes that the contract has signalled another decade of shipbuilding activity for the historic dockyard at Rosyth; understands that by building on what it sees as the unique experience of the Aircraft Carrier Alliance, and its success with the aircraft carriers HMS Queen Elizabeth and HMS Prince of Wales, Babcock has brought together a highly-experienced and integrated project team, spanning several regions of the UK, to

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meet the challenging Type 31 programme; notes that this initiative, which has been described by the MOD as a pathfinder programme, is the first of its kind to be delivered under the UK Government's new National Shipbuilding Strategy; believes that, as well as re-energising the UK's maritime capability through modern UK ship design and build practices, honed by construction of the aircraft carriers, the Type 31 programme will also support technology transfer into the wider UK through the command system and will drive British shipbuilding expertise to match what it sees as the Royal Navy's pedigree as a world leader in naval platforms; understands that Type 31 will be at the heart of the Royal Navy's surface fleet; believes that this will contribute to deterring aggression and maintaining the security of the UK's interests; understands that it will also work alongside the UK's allies to deliver a warship presence across the globe and enable a forward naval presence; commends Josh on the design and selection of his coin; welcomes the creation of additional jobs in Scotland by the MOD, and wishes everyone involved with the entire project all the very best for its ultimate success. **R**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
