#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-05590 Kenneth Gibson: Adopt a Road—That the Parliament notes calls on local authorities to consider introducing the Adopt a Road initiative, which, it understands, works successfully across North America: understands that such a scheme offers individuals. organisations, companies and volunteer groups the opportunity to contribute to their community and local area by taking responsibility for a length of road, usually in the vicinity of the sponsoring group or person, from one junction to the next and that, while no money changes hands, the sponsor agrees to keep the sponsored road free of litter and reasonably clean, contacting the local authority to uplift any refuse gathered, having given at least 24 hours' notice; further understands that such a scheme recognises sponsors through the provision of signs on the sponsored road, which are designed, provided and erected by the local authority; understands that the programme originated in the United States when an engineer for the Department of Transportation sought the help of local groups to sponsor the cleaning of sections of the highway, as litter pick-up by the local authority was too expensive to undertake as often as was necessary; is aware of reports that, as of 2021, more than 120,000 California residents have participated in the initiative to remove litter and graffiti, plant trees and wildflowers, and clear vegetation along over 15,000 shoulder miles of roadside, and notes the view that such a scheme could be successfully piloted in North Avrshire and other local authorities across Scotland.

\*S6M-05623 Alex Rowley: Cost of Living Crisis and the Need for Creative and Bold Use of

**Existing Tax Powers**—That the Parliament is concerned by the continuing cost of living crisis; believes that it is clear that the need for support for people struggling is far greater than the resources that have been offered for this purpose; further believes that the cost of living crisis, coupled with what it sees as the Scottish Government's proposals for an austerity budget of significant public service cuts, is leading to a time of unprecedented hardship for people across the country; considers that urgent further action is required by both the UK and Scottish Governments to support those in need; notes that the Scottish Government has what it considers to be a wide range of tax powers that it believes could be used to ease the cost of living crisis; urges the

\*<u>S6M-05621</u> Alasdair Allan: 2022 Worldwide Gathering of the Clan Macneil—That the Parliament welcomes the Worldwide Gathering of the Clan Macneil to the Isle of Barra from 8 to10 August 2022; believes that the gathering will bring together members of Clan Macneil Associations from across the globe, including the United States of America, Canada, Australia and New Zealand; understands that the Clan Macneil, known in Gaelic as Clann Nìll, claims descent from the semi-mythical Niall of the Nine Hostages (Niall Noígíallach), an Irish king from the 5th or 6th century; further understands that the seat of Clan Macneil is Kisimul Castle in Castlebay, Isle of Barra, with associated septs from the islands of Gigha, Colonsay, Islay and the peninsulas of Knapdale and Kintyre; hopes that the picturesque and historic castle, which it understands is currently closed to the public due to ongoing remedial works, will be repaired to reopen in the near future, and wishes the Clan Macneil a successful worldwide gathering.

\*S6M-05614 Finlay Carson: Johnston Nursery Wins Scottish Forestry's Acorn Trophy—That the Parliament warmly congratulates Johnston Nursery in Kirkcudbright, Dumfries and Galloway, on being presented with Scottish Forestry's Acorn Trophy for early years settings that inspire a love of trees and woodlands in young children; understands that judges described its actions as a "superb example" of what can be done by the nursery community, and by someone with a vision; further understands that the nursery has bought a patch of woodland, allowing the children to make it their own, using the children's committee to express their wishes, for example instigating a dog-poo campaign, tree-planting, and creating a tunnel and a castle; believes that the nursery has demonstrated ingenious repurposing of wood products, aided by input from helpful grandparents and parents; understands that this venture works in partnership with Dumfries and Galloway Council's Amazing Summer Project and the Barrhill Woods Development Trust to offer children aged between five and nine-years the opportunity to meet with their friends, make new friends, and take part in fun and free activities, as well as having new opportunities throughout the school summer holidays; believes that this provides support to children and young people who may otherwise struggle to access experiences during the holiday period, while enjoying play, socialising and getting to know organisations within their local community; welcomes this initiative, and hopes that it will continue to flourish in the coming years, while acting as a role model for similar nurseries to follow within their own communities.

\*S6M-05613 Kenneth Gibson: Supporting Taiwan's Democracy—That the Parliament expresses its unequivocal support for democracy and peace in the Republic of China (Taiwan); notes with concern what it sees as the People's Republic of China's growing threat to Taiwan and security in the wider Indo-Pacific region; is aware of US House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi's visit to Taiwan on 2-3 August 2022, accompanied by five key congressional colleagues, including the Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs, the Chairman of the Veterans Affairs Committee, and the Vice Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee; welcomes that Speaker Pelosi emphasised that the United States must stand with Taiwan, which she described as an "island of resilience", to advance the common interests of both sides so that the freedom of Taiwan and its democracy are respected; is concerned that, in what it believes to be an act of deliberate intimidation and in retaliation for Ms Pelosi's visit, Chinese jets flew above Pingtan island, which lies across the Taiwan Strait from northern Taiwan, and is one of the closest points on the mainland to the island; understands that, as a result, Taiwan's President Tsai Ing-wen is reported to have reaffirmed the values that Taiwan shares with other democratic countries and asked the international community to "halt any escalation of the regional security situation", and calls for an immediate cancellation of China's military drills and what it considers to be campaigns

\*<u>S6M-05606</u> Foysol Choudhury: National Mourning Day of Bangladesh—That the Parliament marks the National Mourning Day of Bangladesh on August 15; understands that this event marks the day in 1975 when Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, who was the country's first President and is considered to be the father of the nation, was assassinated along with 18 of his family members in a military coup in Dhaka; expresses its sympathy to the living members of Sheikh Mujib's family and the people of Bangladesh on the anniversary of this event; notes what it sees as the high regard and depth of feeling of the people of Bangladesh towards their founding father Bangabandhu and his legacy, and believes that Bangladesh's continued prosperity, freedom and independence vindicates Sheikh Mujib's "Golden Bengal" vision and his values of a secular and inclusive Bangladesh.

\*<u>S6M-05605</u> Liam Kerr: Ping Petroleum UK and Cerulean Winds to Create One of the UK's First Wind-powered Oil and Gas Production Facilities—That the Parliament welcomes the reported agreement between Ping Petroleum UK and Cerulean Winds to create one of the UK's first wind-powered oil and gas production facilities; believes that this is an important milestone for the oil and gas industry as it seeks to meet decarbonisation targets set out in the North Sea Transition Deal; understands that the offshore floating wind technology to be deployed will remove up to 20,000 metric tonnes of carbon emissions every year, and was developed with grant support from the UK Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy; welcomes the agreement's reported ambition to realise up to £100 million of investment in the UK's renewables supply chain, and hopes that this initiative can successfully demonstrate what it sees as the potential of floating offshore wind to boost the renewables supply chain and cut emissions from oil and gas production.
