## Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-07352 Edward Mountain: Addressing Mental Health Inequalities in Remote, Rural and Island Areas—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the importance of access to high quality mental health treatment in remote, rural and island communities, including the Highlands and Islands region; understands that waiting lists for mental health services in some rural areas are significantly longer than the Scottish average; further understands that data from the Royal College of Psychiatrists shows that rural areas are particularly vulnerable to pressures on the psychiatry workforce, with, it believes, limited services forcing patients to travel long distances and clinicians to take on unsustainable workloads, and notes the calls for greater investment in mental health provision as a priority, and to provide what it sees as the necessary support, training, recruitment and retention of psychiatrists to reduce any backlog faced by patients in rural areas, and address anticipated future demand.

\*S6M-07345 Jenni Minto: Special Tribunal on Russian Aggression in Ukraine—That the Parliament notes the support, including among people in the Argyll and Bute constituency, for efforts to seek justice and accountability for the reported atrocities committed by Russian troops during their invasion of Ukraine, as well as for what it sees as the crime of the war itself; considers that the decision by the Russian Federation to launch attacks on Ukraine poses a grave challenge to the post-1945 international order; believes that, in line with international law, the invasion has provided for individual criminal responsibility for those who plan, initiate or execute wars of aggression; notes the support for the ongoing investigations into Russia's military invasion of Ukraine, including those before the International Court of Justice, International Criminal Court and European Court of Human Rights; further notes the calls for the establishment of an ad hoc special tribunal with a mandate to investigate and prosecute the crime of aggression allegedly committed by the political and military leadership of the Russian Federation; notes the suggestions to apply the definition of the crime of aggression based on Article 8 bis of the Rome Statute; further notes the calls for guarantees that accountability will extend to government and political officials; welcomes the reported exercise of jurisdiction by the International Criminal Court over war crimes, crimes against humanity, and attempted genocide on the territory of Ukraine; considers that Russian co-operation with such a trial may be one key metric by which we can judge that Europe is on a path towards peace; believes that a Ukrainian victory is necessary for the integrity of the international system, as are, it considers, justice and accountability for Russian

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crimes, and notes the view that accountability for the crime of aggression against Ukraine must be secured.

## Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*S6M-07350 Michelle Thomson: Slamannan Parish Church Launches Local Food Support Provision—That the Parliament congratulates Slamannan Parish Church on the launch of its new food support provision, Martha's Pantry, at the local community centre; understands that residents of Limerigg and Slamannan, in Falkirk, can access the service through a referral system or a once-a-week drop-in day; considers that it is important to have a food pantry in the Slamannan and Limerigg areas, which include rural communities within in the Falkirk district; recognises that the name, Martha's Pantry, is derived from Martha in the New Testament Gospels, and is a direct reflection of her work whereby she was said to look after others, including cooking for them; considers that the launch of food banks and food provision services is not a service that should be needed, however, due to the cost of living crisis and increasing food prices, believes that they are currently deemed a necessity by many families throughout the UK; congratulates Slamannan Parish Church on the launch of its food support service, and wishes all involved well for their future endeavours.

\*S6M-07319 Alexander Stewart: Sudanese Woman Joins New Elders for St Mark's Parish Church, Raploch—That the Parliament welcomes the news that a woman from Sudan has become an elder with St Mark's Parish Church in Raploch; understands that Eman Musa, her daughter Shere and son David have been attending St Mark's since arriving in Scotland in June 2019 and that, in 2021, to mark their second anniversary as part of the church, Eman made a public profession of faith, and Shere and David were baptised at the same ceremony; acknowledges that 18 months after making that profession of faith, Eman is one of four new elders who were ordained at St Mark's in December 2022; considers that Eman previously spent 14 years in a refugee camp in Egypt after fleeing Sudan's civil war in 2004 and has since spoken regarding the welcome she has received from the St Mark's congregation since the family's arrival three years ago, which included members of the congregation visiting the family and cooking their meals every night while they settled into life in Scotland; notes that she ordained alongside fellow new elders, Gillian Hughes, Donnamarie Totten and Shug Stewart, at a recent service that was also attended by the Clackmannanshire Silver Band; commends all the congregation, St Mark's minister, the Reverend Barry Hughes, and the Church of Scotland on what it considers their fantastic welcome and inclusivity to all, and wishes all the new elders and everyone at St Mark's all the very best for the future.

\*<u>S6M-07295</u> Russell Findlay: Help Provided by Victim Support Scotland's Emergency Assistance Fund—That the Parliament acknowledges what it sees as the significant financial impact of crime on people across Scotland; believes that many of those affected are victims of domestic abuse who require emergency provision of goods and services for their personal safety and security, as well as dignity and wellbeing; understands that emergency funding can be required for household goods, food, utilities, clothing, damaged property, security equipment, Motions & Questions Gluasadan agus Ceistean

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funerals and travel to a place of safety; acknowledges that Victim Support Scotland's Emergency Assistance Fund (EAF) provides urgent support quickly and efficiently to crime victims, who, it understands, are often among the most disadvantaged groups in Scotland; understands that the EAF is available to any crime victim who is in urgent need of financial help as a direct result of a specific crime and has no means of accessing funding from any other source; further understands that the EAF has assisted individuals across Scotland, in addition to over 200 support organisations, with awards to the value of £293,000 being made so far in 2022; commends Victim Support Scotland for its focus on assisting victims of crime and what it sees as the vital, often lifesaving, support that is provided by its EAF; notes that the EAF has received funding through the Victim Surcharge Fund, which came into being in 2019, and understands that anyone who commits a crime that results in a court fine is charged an additional penalty, which is known as the victim surcharge and paid into the Victim Surcharge Fund.

# **Members' Bills Proposals**

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.

For each Bill, the date of the next (or most recent) event in the Bill's passage is given. Other relevant information, e.g. about lodging amendments, is given in italics.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
