Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S6M-03099 Katy Clark: Precarious Employment in Further and Higher Education—That the Parliament notes the strike action announced by University and College Union (UCU) members to be taken across Scottish universities in February 2022, including in the West Scotland region; understands that a key demand of the workers is a nationally-agreed framework to eliminate precarious employment; notes with concern data published by the Higher Education Statistics Agency, which reportedly showed that 32% of all UK University staff were on fixed-term contracts in 2020-21 and 33% of all Scotland-based University staff were on fixed-term contracts in 2019-20; further notes College Staffing Data, published by the Scottish Funding Council, which reportedly showed that 13% of all teaching staff at Scottish colleges were on temporary contracts in 2019-20: notes with concern the findings of the UCU report, Second Class Academic Citizens: The dehumanising effects of casualisation in higher education, published in 2020, which found that students on temporary or fixed-term contracts felt invisible, vulnerable, lacking in agency and unable to make long-term plans; further notes surveys carried out by the UCU in June 2019, which reportedly found that 93% of respondents on fixed-term contracts in further education roles and 97% of respondents on fixed-term contracts in higher education roles would rather be on permanent contracts; understands that employers have a statutory responsibility to ensure that workers must not be treated less favourably than comparable staff; notes the calls for academic institutions not to use employment agencies to recruit staff; further notes the calls for the Scottish Funding Council to set out guidance that temporary or fixed-term contracts should not be used; acknowledges the view that academic institutions should seek to negotiate with trade unions to transition staff in precarious employment to more secure contracts, and notes the calls for the Scottish Government to work with higher and further education institutions, local authorities and trade unions to put an end to what it considers the precarious employment in the academic sector.

*<u>S6M-03091</u> John Mason: Persecution of Christians—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the persecution of Christians across the world; acknowledges the findings of the *World Watch List 2022*, compiled by Open Doors, which ranks the top 50 countries where, according to the list, Christians face the most extreme levels of persecution; understands that the top 10 on this year's watch list are, starting at number one, Afghanistan, North Korea, Somalia, Libya, Yemen, Eritrea, Nigeria, Pakistan, Iran, and India; further understands that analysis shows that, on average, every day, 13 Christians worldwide are killed because of their faith and 12 churches or

Christian buildings are attacked; understands that 309 million Christians are living in places with very high or extreme levels of persecution, with, reportedly, one in eight Christians facing persecution worldwide, and one in six in Africa, and two in five in Asia, facing persecution; sympathises with all those who face persecution for practising their faith, and notes the calls reminding Christians across Scotland, including in the Glasgow Shettleston constituency, to keep those victimised in their prayers.

*S6M-03086 Edward Mountain: Highland Pre-hospital Immediate Care and Trauma

Service—That the Parliament supports what it sees as the pioneering and life-saving work of the Highland Pre-hospital Immediate Care and Trauma (PICT) service; understands that Highland PICT is a dual clinician Medic/Advanced Practitioner rapid response team that is based at Raigmore Hospital, in Inverness, and provides enhanced frontline care to medical and traumatic emergencies across the Highlands; further understands that, since 2015, the team has successfully expanded its operations from a two-day service to a seven-day service, which has been in place since August 2020; considers that Highland PICT meets the ambitions of the Scottish Government's national trauma network programme and plays a key role in NHS Highland's major incident planning, collaborating with the Scottish Ambulance Service and other emergency services; notes, with deep concern, reports that NHS Highland's funding review for Highland PICT will result in a reduced service of four days per week, and further notes the calls encouraging the NHS board to reconsider its funding proposal for what it sees as a vital service.

*S6M-03083 Alasdair Allan: Energy Bill Crisis for Island Communities—That the Parliament notes reports of growing concerns about what it sees as the energy bill crisis, including in Na h-Eileanan an Iar; understands that Ofgem's decision to raise the price cap will increase household energy bills by an average of 54%; considers that distribution levies unfairly penalise poorer people and those who live in rural areas: believes that the rise in energy costs from April will push many island households to breaking point; further believes that island residents are more vulnerable to what it sees as the current cost of living crisis due to existing higher living costs, including what it considers to be unfair energy levies, and to weather conditions, the lack of a mains gas option for most people, and low incomes in many areas; welcomes the Scottish Government's confirmation that it will use the £290 million from the UK Treasury to directly support those who will be most detrimentally impacted by the price cap increase; considers that the power to make critical energy legislation is reserved to the UK Parliament; condemns the UK Government for, it believes, failing to step in further to prevent fuel poverty resulting from this situation; notes the calls for anyone who is struggling with their bills to contact Advice Direct Scotland for free practical advice; considers that the current devolution settlement prevents the Scottish Parliament from legislating directly on this issue, and notes the calls on the UK Government to do more to tackle what it believes to be the current fuel price crisis.

*<u>S6M-03185</u> Christine Grahame: Kurt Zouma—That the Parliament condemns the actions of Kurt Zouma, the Premier League footballer at West Ham United who it considers callously and with premeditation tormented one of his cats by throwing and kicking it, in a way it believes replicated his actions with a football, and chasing what it considers must have been a terrified animal, as well as slapping it in the head for, it believes, his and others entertainment; understands that this was then posted on social media, which alerted the RSPCA and others to his actions; expresses relief that the RSPCA has now reportedly removed the two cats from his household for welfare reasons and to pursue its own investigation; considers that West Ham United, while aware of these actions, should not have permitted him to play, and that a fine of £250,000, representing what it sees as an eyewatering two weeks' pay, is insufficient; believes that his professed remorse is wholly insufficient, and hopes that he is either banned from owning any other animal, or undertakes never to own one again.

medium that encourages 5 to 11 year olds to submit a piece of art to help raise awareness and highlight the dangers and signs of carbon monoxide poisoning; understands that every year in Scotland there are fatalities resulting from carbon monoxide poisoning that are directly attributed to combustion appliances; notes that SGN identifies risk areas that include not just within homes, but also camping sites, boats, using BBQs in enclosed areas, portable heaters, holiday accommodation, garages, and wood pellet storage areas; understands that, in addition to the reported fatalities, there is a considerable number of incidents where people are treated in hospital for the effects of carbon monoxide poisoning, and that carbon monoxide poisoning can result in serious and permanent injury to persons affected, and welcomes the amendment to the statutory tolerable standard under section 86 of the Housing (Scotland) Act 1987, which means that all houses, regardless of tenure, must have satisfactory provision for detecting, and for giving warning of, carbon monoxide present in a concentration that is hazardous to health.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
