*<u>S6M-06934</u> Alex Rowley: Major Staff Vacancies in Care Services—That the Parliament is deeply concerned by a new report from the Care Inspectorate and the Scottish Social Services

Council showing nearly half of all care services in Scotland had vacancies at the end of 2021; understands that the Staff Vacancies in Care Services 2021 report shows that the percentage of care services reporting vacancies increased to its highest level since these statistics were first published for the year 2016; recognises that the report found that at 31 December 2021, 47% of services reported vacancies, with the percentage of care services reporting vacancies having increased by 11% over the previous year alone; is worried that care homes for older people, housing support services, care at home services, care homes for adults, care homes for children and young people, secure accommodation services and residential special school care accommodation services all show as having a proportion of services with vacancies significantly above the national average for all care services; is concerned that the report shows 60% of services reported having nursing vacancies, which is an increase of 14% on the previous year; understands that 58% of services with vacancies reported having problems filling them, up 15% from the previous year, with the reported reasons given being too few applicants in general (60%), too few applicants with experience (57%), and too few qualified applicants (50%), and believes that urgent action is needed to avert what it sees as the worsening crisis in care services by delivering better terms, conditions and pay for all care workers.

*S6M-06933 Liam McArthur: Age Scotland's Keeping The Doors Open Report—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of Age Scotland's new report, Keeping The Doors Open, which, it understands, reveals the pressures facing older people's groups across Scotland following the COVID-19 pandemic; notes that the report outlines responses from Age Scotland's community member groups to a survey in June 2022 on a range of topics, including attendance levels, delivery of services and current challenges; understands that the report reveals the impact on confidence and mobility amongst older people due to the pandemic and ongoing challenges to attract new volunteers, but also the resilience of many services during incredibly tough circumstances; recognises what it sees as the importance of older people's groups, such as men's sheds, lunch clubs, sporting clubs and service providers in improving wellbeing and mental health, tackling loneliness, malnutrition and poverty, and building social connections in communities across Scotland; regrets that according to the report, more than 30 older people's community groups in the membership of Age Scotland have closed since the start of the pandemic with many more struggling to remain open due to rising costs for venues and energy; understands that the report provides a number of recommendations for the Scottish Government, local authorities and funders, including greater investment for older people's community groups, recognising loneliness as a key public health issue and establishing a national fund to support older people's community groups to help its members through the cost of living crisis; encourages MSPs across the parties to do all that they can to support efforts to make sure Scotland is a better place to grow older and to continue to support the work of older people's groups in the communities that they represent, and thanks Age Scotland for what it sees as its invaluable work to support and raise awareness of the needs of older people in Scotland.

The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
