\*S6M-05903 Stuart McMillan: National Eye Health Week 2022—That the Parliament notes National Eye Health Week, which runs from 19 to 25 September 2022 and provides an opportunity to promote the importance of maintaining good eye health, and to raise awareness of the services and support available to people on the sight loss pathway across Scotland; considers that everyone in Scotland should undertake a free eye health check at least every two years to pick up as early as possible any changes before they affect vision, and allow effective treatment regardless of where they live or what background they come from; understands that 50% of sight loss is avoidable; notes the work across the third sector, optometry, the NHS and Scottish Government in developing the provisions of the sight loss pathway; further notes the support for continued focus on improving the communication and shifting the balance of care between available services, and increasing the use of the best available technology in patients' sight loss journey; notes the support for an end-to-end sight loss pathway providing patients with the best care possible; recognises the work of Optometry Scotland and the visual impairment sector in supporting the work of the NHS and social services on the sight loss pathway; commends the efforts of Optometry Scotland and RNIB Scotland in promoting National Eye Health Week, and notes the calls for people living in Greenock and Inverclyde, and across Scotland, to book their free eye health check if they have not done so in the last two years.

country's industry, administration and education structures; understands that the German civilian government was taken by surprise by the strike action, and reacted by declaring a state of emergency and threatening strikers with instant execution; believes that when the strikes continued the Gestapo decided to react in the harshest way, by rounding up 21 men whom they believed to be strike leaders, who were subsequently summarily tried by a special tribunal before being transferred to Hinzert concentration camp where they were shot and buried in unmarked graves; understands that in total 200 Luxembourgers were arrested while numerous families, including their children, were subsequently transferred to work camps, many in Silesia, under very harsh conditions; believes that the strikes gained worldwide attention and revitalised resistance movements across occupied Western Europe; understands that an estimated 40% of the Luxembourger men drafted for service in the German Wehrmacht refused and went into hiding before Luxembourg was eventually liberated by Allied forces in September 1944, and remembers all the strikers of 1942, and everyone who has lost their life while standing up to oppressive regimes.

## **Members' Bills Proposals**

### Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
