*S6M-11607 Maggie Chapman: International Migrants Day 2023—That the Parliament acknowledges that every year on 18 December, the world marks International Migrants Day, which is a day set aside to recognise what it sees as the important contribution of migrants, while highlighting what it considers to be the challenges that they face; notes with concern reports that, due to persistent lack of safe and regular migration pathways, millions continue to take perilous journeys each year, and that, since 2014, more than 50,000 migrants have lost their lives on migratory routes across the world, including migrants headed to the UK; believes that, regardless of the reasons that compel people to move, migrants and displaced people represent some of the most vulnerable and marginalised groups in society, and are often exposed to abuse and exploitation, have limited access to essential services including healthcare, and are faced with xenophobic attacks and stigma fuelled by misinformation; highlights what it sees as the vital support that organisations, such as No Recourse North East Partnership (NRNE), Grampian Regional Equality Council (GREC) and Dundee International Women's Centre (DIWC), provide for migrants in the North East Scotland region, and believes that strengthening the contribution that migrants can make to sustainable and resilient communities requires collective effort to address the challenges that they face.

*<u>S6M-11606</u> Sharon Dowey: Gathering South Wins Club of the Year at the MG ALBA Scots Trad Awards—That the Parliament congratulates Lee McGilvary and Gathering South Sessions on winning Club of the Year on 2 December 2023 at Dundee's Caird Hallon; understands that the prestigious 21st MG ALBA Scots Trad Music Awards celebrated the very best of Scottish folk music; commends Ayrshire-born Lee for his great music passion and purpose; recognises what it understands is his desire to make music accessible with house concerts, studio sessions, and live events; applauds Lee for this achievement, and wishes him and Gathering South a very musical future.

*<u>S6M-11605</u> Mercedes Villalba: Right to Boycott—That the Parliament recognises the Right to Boycott campaign, which is defending the right of public bodies to decide not to purchase or procure from, or invest in, companies involved in human rights abuse, abuse of workers' rights,

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destruction of the planet, or any other harmful or illegal acts; understands that the UK Government intends to pass legislation preventing public bodies from exercising this right; notes the reported support of the campaign from many trade unions, including ASLEF Union, BFAWU, CWU, FBU, NEU, PCS, RMT, TSSA, Unite, UNISON and UCU; further notes the reported support from a wide range of organisations, including the Campaign Against Arms Trade, Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, Cuba Solidarity Campaign, Friends of the Earth Scotland, Global Justice Now, Greenpeace UK, Scottish Palestine Solidarity Campaign, Stop the War Coalition, Quakers in Britain, and War on Want; acknowledges what it considers to be the powerful role that boycotts have played in challenging injustice, including against apartheid in South Africa; believes that the proposed UK law presents a threat to freedom of expression; calls on the UK Government to immediately halt this bill, and further calls on civil society to mobilise in support of the right to boycott in the cause of justice. **R**

*<u>S6M-11604</u> Clare Adamson: Coltness High School Pupil Selected for Lanarkshire

*<u>S6M-11599</u> Clare Adamson: Christopher's Saving Lives Campaign Safety Ropes to be Installed in Strathclyde Country Park—That the Parliament recognises that Duncan and Margaret Spiers, of the Christopher's Saving Lives Campaign, have provided new safety ropes to North Lanarkshire Council for installation at Strathclyde Country Park; understands that Duncan and Margaret Spiers began to raise awareness of water safety in memory of their son, Christopher, who tragically lost his life after falling into the River Clyde in 2016; notes that Duncan and Margaret have been working with manufacturer Ibex Marina to produce a floating lifebelt rope, with unique colour-coding that is designed to counteract vandalism and theft of this crucial safety equipment, with purple being Christopher's favourite colour, and orange being associated with mental health awareness; recognises that the ropes will be placed on the life rings along the bank of the River Clyde, which runs through Strathclyde Country Park; commends the commitment of Duncan and Margaret, who it considers have given extraordinary efforts to improving water safety, which is testament to their incredible resilience in the face of unimaginable adversity, and believes that the rope installations in Strathclyde Country Park will be a lifeline for anyone in an emergency, but that they should also serve as a reminder of the need to be careful around water. **R**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
