\*S6M-07559 Russell Findlay: Victims Awareness Week, Championing the Rights of Crime **Victims—**That the Parliament welcomes Victim Support Scotland's Victims Awareness Week, which will take place from 20 to 26 February 2023; understands that the awareness week will highlight the work undertaken by Victim Support Scotland to support those affected by crime by hearing their voices, highlighting their experiences and championing their rights; notes that Victim Support Scotland is a charity that provides specialist support to people impacted by crimes, including murder, terrorism, rape and sexual assault, domestic violence and hate crime; acknowledges that the impact of crime is wide-ranging and can affect people emotionally, mentally, physically and financially; understands that the week will celebrate the practical assistance and emotional support, including financial support, that can be provided by Victim Support Scotland, and other organisations, to crime victims, their families and friends, and witnesses to empower them to cope with the aftermath of crime and move forward with their lives; notes that Victim Support Scotland also advocates for positive improvements in the criminal justice system and works alongside criminal justice partners, the third sector and local organisations, and further notes the calls on MSPs to commend the work of victim support organisations and raise awareness of what it considers the vital work that they do to help victims and survivors.

\*S6M-07555 Sandesh Gulhane: Chronic Kidney Disease in Scotland—That the Parliament understands that chronic kidney disease affects more people in Scotland than cancer and that there is no cure; further understands that only around two thirds of those affected by kidney disease have received a diagnosis, with many of them diagnosed too late to prevent renal failure, while others are identified by accident when tested for other conditions; believes that there are significant opportunities to address inequalities in the diagnosis and outcomes for people in Scotland, including in the Glasgow region, with chronic kidney disease, based on their backgrounds; marks the launch of the Kidney Research UK report, Changing the future for chronic kidney disease in Scotland, which it understands makes key recommendations to transform the outcomes for people in Scotland with chronic kidney disease, and notes the calls on patients and their advocates, families, clinicians, researchers, NHS leaders and policymakers to work together to devise and deliver a national approach that can transform kidney health in Scotland, prevent more people developing this potentially life-threatening disease, slow its progression, avoid

preventable complications and reduce the number of people needing dialysis or an organ transplant.  ${\bf R}$

\*S6M-07546 Ruth Maguire: Cervical Cancer Prevention Week—That the Parliament recognises that 23 to 29 January 2023 is Cervical Cancer Prevention Week, which encourages women to reduce their risk of the disease by promoting the steps that they can take to look after their health; understands that cervical cancer is the fourth most common cancer among women globally, with nine new diagnoses and two women losing their lives every day in the UK; is concerned by the reported statistic from Jo's Cervical Cancer Trust that one in three women and people with a cervix do not take up their screening invite; highlights tools such as the HPV vaccination and cervical screening, which can help screen and prevent, and, it considers, one day end, cervical cancer; notes the support for the global strategy for cervical cancer elimination, which suggests that each country should meet the 90-70-90 targets by 2030; acknowledges that these targets are for 90% of girls to be fully vaccinated with the HPV vaccine by the age of 15, for 70% of women to be screened using a high-performance test by the age of 35, and again by the age of 45, and for 90% of women with pre-cancer to be treated, and 90% of women with invasive cancer to be managed; understands that cervical cancer is preventable and curable, as long as it is detected early and managed effectively, and notes the calls for all women and people with a cervix to attend invitations to screening appointments and vaccinations.
