\*S6M-09609 Jackson Carlaw: Supporting Migraine Awareness Week 2023—That the Parliament understands that migraine is common and has an impact on more than 750,000 people in Scotland, the economy and NHS capacity, but can also be stigmatised and may not always be adequately addressed by health services and employers; acknowledges that migraine is often experienced as much more than a headache, and that The Migraine Trust describes it as a severe and painful long-term health condition, which can disrupt work, personal and family lives; recognises that, for Migraine Awareness Week 2023, from 24 to 30 September, The Migraine Trust will be campaigning for improved care pathways, consistent patient access to approved treatments, and more training for health professionals so that GPs, pharmacists and individual patients can manage cases; notes the view that improved treatment can increase the quality of life for people affected, aid the economy by making it easier for people with migraine to work productively, and ensure that more cases can be handled in the community without unnecessary referrals to secondary care, and understands that The Migraine Trust is the UK's leading migraine charity, founded in 1965, which offers information and support to people affected by migraine, and advocates raising awareness and understanding of the condition, alongside the promotion of research.

That the Parliament congratulates the Elgin Street Pastors on their 10th anniversary in Moray; recognises that Christian pastors from different churches come together to provide a calming presence in Elgin town centre and have been doing so since April 2013; understands that the street pastors show care in practical ways such as giving out bottled water, finding friends if they have been separated from others and helping people find safe ways home; further understands that the street pastors carry basic first aid equipment to help them to be suitably equipped for a

\*S6M-09647 Kate Forbes: Manipur Attacks in North-east India—That the Parliament condemns the ongoing ethnic violence in Manipur, in north-east India, which has reportedly displaced nearly 60,000 people; notes with alarm the particular targeted and sustained attacks that it understands have devastated religious communities in both the Kuki and Meitei groups, including the destruction of places of worship; understands, with great concern, that over 200 churches and at least two synagogues are reported to have been completely destroyed or damaged by mobs; believes over 80 Christians to have been killed during targeted attacks; is committed to the freedom to practice religion and belief without hinderance, and the promotion of respect between different religious and non-religious communities; considers that, when the freedom of religion and belief is under attack, often other basic rights are also threatened, and calls on the UK Government to unequivocally condemn the ongoing violence and engage constructively with the Indian authorities to seek a resolution to the conflict and provide humanitarian aid as far as is practically possible.

\*<u>S6M-09646</u> Pam Duncan-Glancy: Scottish Fire and Rescue Service Appliance Cuts—That the Parliament is concerned by the news of the decommissioning of fire appliances in the Glasgow area; considers that areas like Maryhill and Govan would face dangers if made to reduce to one appliance; understands that the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service is required to make £11 million in cuts to meet its budgetary obligations for 2023-24, and that it is expected to make further cuts in the coming years to continue balancing its budget; supports calls from concerned residents to reverse plans to reduce appliances that are considered essential, and calls on the Scottish Government to intervene and to urgently meet with the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service to discuss how best to mitigate the crisis facing it.

disaster, which changed the lives of thousands of workers and families in the North Sea oil and gas industry and, it believes, left an indelible mark on the north east; notes that 167 men were killed in the disaster, including two crewmen on a rescue vessel, following an explosion on 6 July 1988 on the Piper Alpha Production Platform, 120 miles north-east of Aberdeen; further notes that just 61 workers survived the disaster, which saw one of the world's largest oil producing platforms reduced to a burning wreckage within two hours; understands that the disaster led to the roll-out of widespread health and safety regulations, which were transformed to give North Sea oil and gas operators legislative and procedural guidelines commensurate with the demands of large-scale operations in the late 20th and early 21st century; further understands, however, that offshore unions still do not have the ability to appoint safety representatives; commends the bravery, skill and dedication of all those who work offshore, and stands with the survivors and loved ones of those who lost their lives on that fateful night in 1988.

\*<u>S6M-09637</u> Willie Rennie: Withdrawal from the Energy Charter Treaty—That the Parliament notes that a number of European countries plan to withdraw from the Energy Charter Treaty, including France, Germany, Spain, Poland and the Netherlands; understands that Italy withdrew from the treaty in 2016; is deeply concerned about the reported increasing number of legal cases from fossil fuel companies brought against countries which are pursuing policies of action on climate change; notes with concern the potential for these legal challenges to frustrate efforts to tackle climate change; further notes that attempts to modernise the Energy Charter Treaty have failed; recognises what it considers to be the need for a new global framework to incentivise global investment in renewable energy to meet global targets to reach net zero, and calls on the UK Government to withdraw from the Energy Charter Treaty and support a new framework replacement with a Renewables Treaty to drive innovation, cooperation and the greater adoption of renewable energy.

\*<u>S6M-09636</u> Alexander Burnett: Banchory Golf Club Listed in the Top 100 Sustainable Courses in Europe—That the Parliament congratulates Banchory Golf Club on its achievement in being named in the top 100 sustainable golf courses in Europe; understands that Banchory Golf Club works with a local nursery to create the Bee Club, by placing two Bombus hives on the course; further understands that the hives are positioned out of sight and away from play, in areas where the bees can live, prosper, and add to the local biodiversity by creating their own colonies around Banchory; notes that this pollination project aims to get children out on the golf course, helps to spread wildflower seeds and teaches the importance of bees and pollination, bringing the

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
