#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-08090 Douglas Lumsden: Condemnation of Aberdeen City Council Defunding Big Noise Torry—That the Parliament condemns the proposed budget decision by Aberdeen City Council to defund Big Noise Torry; notes that Big Noise Torry launched in July 2015 and was Sistema Scotland's third orchestra centre; understands that the charity works with children, from babies right up to S2 pupils, who live in Torry; notes that Big Noise uses the symphony orchestra as a community through which children can gain an invaluable range of life skills and experiences, such as developing confidence and teamwork, and considers that the loss of £738,000 of funding will have a serious impact on the outcomes of some of the most vulnerable pupils from deprived backgrounds.

\*S6M-08089 Jackson Carlaw: Maidenhill Primary School Pupils Take Action to Boost Road Safety—That the Parliament congratulates pupils from Maidenhill Primary School, in Newton Mearns, on their work to develop visual road safety designs and messaging to be put in place within the local housing development; recognises that the developer, Taylor Wimpey, organised a competition in which pupils were encouraged to create artistic designs, with the aim of encouraging motorists to be mindful of their speed, and which could then be installed on signage within two particular sections of the Maidenhill development; understands that seven of the pupils' designs have been amalgamated into a banner that is now on display, and that the winning entry features a smiling snail with the caption, "Be Slow and Happy", and notes that a new community on the Maidenhill site has been established in recent years, with builders, Taylor Wimpey and Cala Homes, creating a range of new family homes, with the primary school and a nursery at the heart of the development.

\*S6M-08088 Alexander Burnett: Ballater-based Company, Wild Discovery, Awarded Best Outdoor Adventure Experience at the Scottish Thistle Awards 2022-23—That the Parliament praises Wild Discovery for being awarded the Best Outdoor Adventure Experience award at the Scottish Thistle Awards 2022-23, delivered by VisitScotland; notes that Wild Discovery aims to provide a sustainable, green and engaging experience for people to connect with nature, with a

\*S6M-08087 Annabelle Ewing: St Kenneth's RC Primary School's Kindness in the Community Initiative —That the Parliament congratulates both pupils and staff at St Kenneth's RC Primary School in Benarty, Fife, on their Kindness in the Community initiative during Lent; understands that pupils have been collecting house points to turn into cash, which they have been using to "pay ahead" items at businesses around the local area; understands that several local businesses, including W M Stark Butchers, Benarty Community Shop, Benarty Fruits and more, are all taking part in the initiative; thanks all pupils for helping to spread kindness in the community, and wishes them all the best during Lent.

\*S6M-08086 Roz McCall: New Pioneering Recycling Facility for Fife —That the Parliament welcomes the news that up to 60 jobs are to be created in Fife, as a result of the opening of a new pioneering recycling facility; understands that the facility, which is in the Whitehill Industrial Estate in Glenrothes, aims to develop a greater plastics recycling infrastructure in the UK in order to prevent the material being exported overseas; notes that the site is co-owned by Morrisons, with the involvement of other organisations, such as Nestle UK and Ireland and Zero Waste Scotland, and will be operated by the recycling plant specialists, Yes Recycling; understands that, at full capacity, the site will recycle 15,000 tonnes of plastic packaging per year, by taking low-grade plastics, including sweet wrappers, crisp packets, salad bags and non-PET food film, and turning the plastics into flakes and pellets that can be used to make new plastic products; further understands that other pellets will be compressed into "ecosheets", a strong and cost-effective alternative to plywood that can be recycled again at the end of its life; understands that the hardto-recycle soft plastic will be sent to the 65,000 sq ft site from Morrisons distribution sites and stores, and by Cireco Scotland, which operates Fife Council's household kerbside collection service, and congratulates all involved in the establishment of the plant, which it hopes will see a vast amount of plastic packaging diverted away from landfills in the future.

\*S6M-08085 Michael Marra: Dundee Civic Trust Celebrates its 50th Anniversary—That the Parliament congratulates Dundee Civic Trust on its 50th anniversary; understands that the Trust was formed in February 1973; commends what it sees as the valuable work done by the Trust to support the protection and conservation of Dundee's historic buildings; notes that the Trust encourages the highest standards of design in new buildings and regeneration projects; welcomes the Trust's programme of events to inform the public about civic design, architecture and conservation; recognises what it sees as the importance of a quality environment and its impact on people's sense of place and identity; thanks members of the Trust for what it considers the important work that they have done for the City of Dundee over the past 50 years, and wishes them all the very best for the future.
