#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-11228 Colin Beattie: Holodomor Memorial Day 2023—That the Parliament recognises that 23 November 2023 is the annual Holodomor Memorial Day; notes that 2022-23 marks the 90th anniversary of Holodomor; considers that Holodomor, literally meaning extermination by hunger, was a man-made and deliberate campaign of starvation and violence carried out by the Soviet regime that resulted in the death of millions of people in Ukraine; believes that Holodomor was caused by a deliberate policy of the Soviet regime, as a mass murder against the people of Ukraine; recognises that Holodomor Memorial Day commemorates all the victims of the Holodomor, and expresses its solidarity with the people in Ukraine who suffered in this tragedy, and in particular with the remaining survivors of the Holodomor and their families; pays its respects to those who died as a consequence of what are considered to be these crimes committed by the totalitarian Soviet regime; expresses deep concern that the 90th anniversary of the Holodomor coincides with Russia's ongoing war of aggression against Ukraine, which, it believes, involves a blatant violation of Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity, coupled with what it sees as the aim to eradicate Ukraine as a nation-state and erode the identity and culture of its people; is aware of the longstanding relationship between Ukraine and Scotland, including the installation in 2017 of the Eternal Memory memorial stone on Calton Hill, Edinburgh, which was dedicated by the Ukrainian community in Scotland to commemorate the genocide by forced famine in Ukraine in 1932-33, and welcomes the formation of the Cross-Party Group on Ukraine within the Scottish Parliament, where Ukrainian interest groups in Scotland and elected officials come together to foster and strengthen the enduring relationship between Ukraine and Scotland. R

\*<u>S6M-11224</u> Kaukab Stewart: Immediate Ceasefire in Gaza and Israel—That the Parliament notes the calls for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza and Israel; further notes the condemnation of the loss of life in the most recent conflict, with around 1,400 people reportedly killed in a brutal terrorist attack in Israel on 7 October 2023 and more than 10,000 people reportedly killed in Gaza in the conflict since; deplores all violence in the region; notes the belief that fighting must stop in order to allow diplomatic discussions to take place that will safeguard innocent civilians; further notes the calls on the UK Government, including from communities in the Glasgow Kelvin constituency, to do its part in working with other UN nations to demand an end to deadly military action in Gaza and to bring to justice those responsible for the terror attacks suffered by Israel;

believes strongly that there is no justification for inflicting terror or killing innocent civilians, and condemns violence in all its forms.

\*S6M-11209 Ross Greer: Ceasefire in Gaza—That the Parliament supports the United Nations Secretary General's calls for a ceasefire in Gaza.

\*<u>S6M-11190</u> Audrey Nicoll: 15 Years of Future Choices—That the Parliament welcomes the 15th anniversary of the Aberdeen-based charity, Future Choices; understands that Future Choices is a voluntary-led local charity that supports some of the most vulnerable adults with social inclusion and improving mental health and wellbeing; notes that Future Choices uses two buses to transport vulnerable adults to Inchgarth Community Centre, based in Garthdee, for activities and social events; recognises that Future Choices also gives opportunities for young people to learn important life skills through the Saltire Awards scheme; commends the hard work of Future Choices' staff and volunteers for standing up for vulnerable people across all levels of government; congratulates the charity for making a difference to, it believes, so many lives over the last 15 years, and passes on its best wishes for future success.

\*<u>S6M-11189</u> Kevin Stewart: Port of Aberdeen Charitable Donations—That the Parliament commends the Port of Aberdeen for donating an additional £30,000 to local charities and community groups as part of the official opening of Aberdeen South Harbour; understands that these donations include £7,500 to support the refurbishment of the Aberdeen Sea Cadets Unit at Pocra Quay, and £2,500 to support the refurbishment of Aberdeen Cyrenians' Wernham House; considers that, since its establishment in 1136, the Port of Aberdeen has always been at the heart of the community, and hopes that the partnership between the harbour, the city and communities continues long into the future.

\*<u>S6M-11188</u> Michelle Thomson: Falkirk East Community Groups Benefit from Asda Foundation Grants—That the Parliament welcomes the £970 awarded from Asda Foundation grants in the latest tranche of funding towards causes close to the local community, with the help of local community champions in the Grangemouth and Stenhousemuir stores; understands that the grants on offer through the Asda Foundation are one of the methods that Asda uses to demonstrate its commitment to the communities around its stores; notes that the criteria for the grants means that they are open to groups helping communities to tackle the cost of living crisis, and groups supporting children and young people; understands that Bo'ness Storehouse Foodbank SCIO was awarded £470 and that Warriors in the Community was awarded £500 to support what it sees as its important work; welcomes this funding from the Asda Foundation to support Bo'ness Storehouse Foodbank SCIO and Warriors in the Community, and wishes both groups well as they continue to positively impact their communities.

\*<u>S6M-11187</u> Michelle Thomson: National Lottery Community Funding for Falkirk East—That the Parliament congratulates the groups from the Falkirk East constituency on being awarded a combined total of £32,032, in the latest funding round from the National Lottery Community Fund; notes that Westquarter & Redding Community School Project received £8,000 to support its annual programme of activities from the local community; understands that Grangemouth Stags RFC was awarded £5,000 towards its community sensory garden project; recognises that Martha's Pantry received £10,000 to support its vital work within the rural communities of Slamannan and Limerigg, tackling food poverty; notes that the Zetland Men's Shed received £9,032 towards

developing a new workspace to facilitate skill sharing and mentoring within the Grangemouth Men's Shed community; congratulates these community groups on being awarded the National Lottery Community Fund grants, and wishes them the best of luck as they progress with their respective projects.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
