\*S6M-11285 Marie McNair: Milngavie Train Station Hosts Low Vision Rehabilitation Students—That the Parliament recognises ScotRail's assistance in hosting students from Glasgow Caledonian University's Graduate Diploma in Low Vision Rehabilitation course at Milngavie train station; understands that the students utilised a stationary train in order to experience guiding long cane users on and off the platform; further understands that participants in this training course were able to learn about route planning to the train station, station services and ultimately will be able to assist their future clients with independent living and travel; commends ScotRail's initiative of hosting training sessions such as this, and hopes that more students will be able to access this training course across Scotland.

\*S6M-11284 Alexander Stewart: Dollar Academy Working with Stirling University on FIDA **Accreditation**—That the Parliament welcomes the announcement from Dollar Academy that it has collaborated with the University of Stirling in order to establish a clear understanding of acceptable qualifications from its new Futures Institute; believes that the school signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the university, enabling both establishments to work on a joint approach to exploring accreditation of new qualifications from the Futures Institute at Dollar Academy (FIDA); acknowledges that the FIDA will enable young people to generate creative responses to sustainable development challenges before progressing to further education; notes that, with this announcement, the University of Stirling has pledged its support in helping Dollar Academy to guarantee that a FIDA qualification is held in similar regard to other school qualifications in terms of further education entry requirements, which will allow pupils to go down an alternative pathway towards college and university from the standard SQA route; further notes the acknowledgement from Ian Munro, rector of Dollar Academy and founder of FIDA, that Dollar Academy is "delighted to have the support of the University of Stirling in ensuring our FIDA qualifications can enable direct entry to higher education", and that "at the same time, the collaboration will provide learners with access to a wider range of resources – including experts at the University – which will further broaden their learning experiences as well as provide valuable insight into different career pathways"; understands that FIDA was launched in May 2021, placing Dollar Academy at the forefront of educational innovation in Scotland, as acknowledged in motion S6M-10126, and that, to date, the course has given 900 young people across the country the opportunity to learn in a different way, which it believes is in line with the UN Sustainable

\*S6M-11281 Clare Haughey: LEAP Achieves Quality in Befriending Award—That the Parliament pays tribute to the charity, LEAP, which is based in Cambuslang, for being awarded Excellence in Quality in Befriending for the fourth time; notes that the Quality in Befriending Award was developed by Befriending Networks in consultation with other stakeholders in the field of befriending, and understands that it is the only award in the UK that is specifically tailored for befriending services; recognises that LEAP became the first older persons' organisation to be granted the award in 2014, and that it has held it through three subsequent reviews; notes that LEAP serves more than 8,500 members and clients in communities across Lanarkshire; understands that LEAP currently has more than 100 befriender volunteers who, it believes, have given almost 3,500 hours of their time to provide companionship to local people, and believes that this award is testament to the commitment of the organisation and its staff and volunteers.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
