#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*<u>S6M-10782</u> Mark Ruskell: Stop Climate Chaos Scotland's Climate Manifesto—That the Parliament notes the publication of *Climate Manifesto: Policies to deliver action and justice* by Stop Climate Chaos Scotland (SCCS), which is a diverse coalition of over 60 civil society organisations campaigning together on climate change in Scotland; understands that this document sets out 119 policy ideas for the UK Government, the Scottish Government and local authorities, and considers that this represents the most comprehensive set of climate change policies ever assembled by civil society in Scotland; notes that SCCS believes that "adopting the policies in this document would put Scotland on track to deliver the real reductions in emissions that the planet needs and to make our fair contribution to helping other countries deal with climate change in their own ways" and that, if adopted, would be a start to doing what the UN Secretary-General has called doing "everything, everywhere, all at once"; welcomes what it sees as this valuable contribution to the debate, and commends these ideas to decision makers at every level for serious consideration as part of addressing the climate emergency with the urgency that it considers is required.

\*<u>S6M-10781</u> Rhoda Grant: Kerrera North-South Road Project Shortlisted for 2023 SURF

**Award**—That the Parliament congratulates Kerrera North-South Road Project on being shortlisted in the Community Led Regeneration category of the prestigious 2023 SURF Awards for Best Practice in Community Regeneration, which identifies and celebrates best practice, innovation and achievement in interventions that improve Scottish communities.

\*<u>S6M-10780</u> Willie Rennie: Haydays in St Andrews is Named Age Scotland Member Group

of the Year—That the Parliament congratulates Haydays on being named Member Group of the Year by Age Scotland on 3 October 2023; understands that, for over 20 years, Haydays has provided educational, creative, and active events for people over the age of 50 in St Andrews, and its size has grown to over 170 members; notes that its offerings include running a cafe with home-baking, where members can relax and socialise, arts and crafts sessions, ukulele tuition, and tai chi practice; recognises what it sees as the vital role of Haydays and similar organisations in reducing loneliness and isolation amongst people over the age of 50; understands that Haydays overcame considerable difficulties, including the sudden closure of its original venue, and restrictions during the COVID-19 pandemic; commends the local volunteer tutors who lead

Haydays' activities, and its committee members and other volunteers for their commitment to the group's work; endorses the group's motto, that "you don't stop playing when you get old", and that "you get old when you stop playing", and wishes all members of Haydays continued success in their varied programme of activities.

\*<u>S6M-10779</u> Alasdair Allan: Action for Children's 25 Years of Service Provision in Na h-Eileanan an lar—That the Parliament congratulates Action for Children in marking 25 years of vital service to the children, young people and families living in Na h-Eileanan an Iar; notes that the charity's first two services started in 1998 on the Isle of Lewis, firstly Hillcrest, a service that provides care for children and young people who cannot stay at home and enables short breaks for children with additional needs, and secondly Eilean Siar Assessment and Therapy Unit, which offers a range of support and advice to children with additional support needs and their families to sustain the continued development of the children; understands that this service is considered to be the first in Scotland to have been fully funded by an NHS board, namely NHS Western Isles; acknowledges that, over the last 25 years, a total of seven services have been established by Action for Children to provide support to children, young people and families from Lewis to Barra; commends the lasting partnership working Action for Children has developed with Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, NHS Western Isles and the Corra Foundation to deliver these crucial services across Na h-Eileanan an Iar, and wishes the staff continued success in the future as they provide support and care for over 100 children, young people and families in the Western Isles.

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
