<u>S6M-10188</u> Paul Sweeney: Free Bus Travel for People Seeking Asylum—That the Parliament notes the calls to extend the current provision of concessionary bus travel in Scotland, including in the Glasgow region, to include people seeking asylum; acknowledges the efforts of third sector organisations that are working in the asylum sector in leading the free bus travel campaign, which was launched in December 2021, such as VOICES Network and Maryhill Integration Network; notes that free bus travel for people seeking asylum has been publicly supported by all faith leaders in the Scottish Religious Leaders Forum and also recommended by the Poverty Alliance and Mental Health Foundation; understands that people seeking asylum do not have the right to work and rely on a financial allowance, which amounts to approximately £6 per day; appreciates that asylum and immigration are reserved matters for the UK Government, but considers that there are interventions that can be made within devolved competence to improve the lives of people in Scotland who are in receipt of asylum support; notes the commitment in the Programme for Government 2022-23 to consider how best to provide free bus travel to people seeking asylum, and further notes the calls encouraging the Scottish Government to set out how it plans to deliver on this commitment as soon as possible.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*<u>S6M-10874</u> Richard Leonard: The Fire Brigades Union Firestorm Report—That the Parliament notes the publication of the *Firestorm* report from the Fire Brigades Union (FBU); understands that the report exposes the impact of what it sees as over a decade of cuts to the fire service; believes that these have resulted in the loss of over 1,200 jobs, with another 780 jobs threatened, including in the Central Scotland region, falling standards of training, the withdrawal of fire appliances and high-reach vehicles and the dedicated 24-hour River Clyde rescue boat crews, a crumbling estate, an aggressive management culture, an ageing workforce exposed to dangerous contaminants, a lack of personnel across the wholetime and retained duty systems, as well as operations control, and a service ill-equipped to respond to the impact of the climate emergency; considers that the research saw over 1,500 FBU members take part in a comprehensive survey and that its results provide overwhelming evidence of a service in crisis; believes that this can only worsen if there is no change to the Scottish Government's five-year flat cash budget settlement, and notes the calls for the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and the Scottish Government to take forward all of the recommendations in the *Firestorm* report and to engage with the FBU on their implementation. **R**

*<u>S6M-10963</u> Jackie Dunbar: Bridge of Don Boy Helps to Raise Over £10,000 for Charitable Causes—That the Parliament commends Rueben Clark, aged 12, from Bridge of Don, after he helped to raise over £10,000 for charitable causes; understands that Rueben decided to start his own charity, after his friend's dad was diagnosed with motor neurone disease (MND), in order to remodel the family's garden for wheelchair access; further understands that fundraising efforts

have included raffles, with Rueben even auctioning off his own quad bike for the cause; understands that approximately 200 people are newly diagnosed with MND in Scotland each year, and that approximately 400 people are living with MND in Scotland at any one time; understands that, as well as MND, Rueben has an interest in many charitable causes, and is now looking to launch a Christmas toy appeal for children living in Aberdeen who have been most affected by the cost of living crisis; commends Rueben for his efforts, and wishes him all the best with his fundraising events going forward.

*<u>S6M-10957</u> Liz Smith: New Perth Museum Secures £10 Million of Tay Cities Deal Funding— That the Parliament welcomes the £10 million secured for the new Perth Museum as part of the Tay Cities Deal; considers that the combined investment from the UK Government, Scottish Government and Perth and Kinross Council for the new museum will showcase the rich history of Scotland's first capital city and play a pivotal role in regenerating Perth by encouraging greater tourism to the city centre; understands that the new museum will contain the Stone of Destiny, which is returning to Perthshire for the first time in over 700 years; notes other prime exhibits of Perthshire's extensive Jacobite history, with displays including Charles Edward Stuart's solidsilver-hilted broadsword, which, it understands, was made by the Perth craftsman, James Brown, and given to Bonnie Prince Charlie by the third Duke of Perth in 1739, and believes that it will also display a rare wine glass inscribed with the Duke of Perth's family motto, "Gang warily", who, it understands, was a prominent figure in the history of the failed 1745 Jacobite rising having assembled a large Perthshire regiment.

*<u>S6M-10955</u> Roz McCall: Care Experienced Week 2023—That the Parliament recognises Care Experienced Week 2023, which runs from 22 to 29 October; believes that the week is an opportunity to celebrate the care experienced community and reaffirm the commitment as a Parliament to do all that it can to support care experienced children and young people and amplify their voices; celebrates the opportunity for the care experienced community to come together and connect at events; considers that care experienced children and young people of all ages require additional protections to access their rights, and wishes all care experienced children and young people and young people all the very best for the future.

*S6M-10947 Sandesh Gulhane: Lung Cancer Awareness Month 2023—That the Parliament recognises that November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month; notes that the month-long campaign brings together healthcare professionals, organisations and individuals to educate the public about lung cancer's impact on individuals and families; understands that lung cancer is the most common cancer in Scotland and that there are more than twice as many cases in the most deprived areas as there are in the least deprived areas of the country; notes that there are around 4,000 lung cancer deaths in Scotland every year; welcomes that Cancer Research UK spent almost £22 million on lung cancer research in 2022-23, including, it understands, continuing funding for the pioneering TRACERx study, which, since 2014, has been improving the understanding of lung cancer genetics; recognises that, in September 2022, the UK National Screening Committee (UK NSC) formally announced its recommendation that targeted lung screening is implemented for people aged 55 to 74 years with a history of smoking across the UK; understands that lung cancer screening aims to find lung cancer at an early stage, when treatment is more likely to be successful; notes the calls from Cancer Research UK for the urgent roll-out of a national targeted lung cancer screening programme in Scotland; acknowledges the commitment in the Cancer Strategy for Scotland 2022-23, to take forward the UK NSC recommendation on targeted lung screening, but notes reported concerns from Cancer Research UK, and considers that there is a lack of a clear route to implementation, and calls on the Scottish Government to make a commitment to roll out a national targeted lung cancer screening programme, including investment to tackle what it sees as shortages in the workforce and diagnostic equipment, to ensure that everyone who needs it can benefit from lung screening. *<u>S6M-10946</u> Annie Wells: Railway Children Scheme Arrives at Glasgow Central—That the Parliament congratulates the international charity, Railway Children, on its first venture into Scotland; understands that Railway Children is working across the UK rail network to make more people in the rail community aware of what to look out for and how to respond to vulnerable children in train stations; further understands that Glasgow Central was chosen due to it being one of the top five UK stations for safeguarding incidents reported to British Transport Police; recognises that in 2022-23, out of 962 Safeguarding and Vulnerability Reports for incidents occurring in Scotland involving children and young people,181 (20%) were for Glasgow Central; understands that the charity has created Safeguarding Action Groups, bringing people together to actively identify and report concerns that they have for young people at the station, on a train, depot or on the tracks; further understands that Glasgow Central will see members of its

Safeguarding Action Groups engage in various activities such as training, briefings and events at the station, challenging perceptions and encouraging discussion, which includes people from across the station and rail industry, station managers, British Transport Police officers, ticket staff, barrier staff, shop workers, cleaners and security staff; believes that by bringing these people together, it hopes to have more eyes and ears looking out for children at risk, and understands that although the focus is on Glasgow Central, the scheme will also cover young people travelling between the Gordon Street rail hub and Queen Street.
