#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-10584 Willie Coffey: Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month—That the Parliament marks Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month, which takes place in November, and World Pancreatic Cancer Day, which takes place on 17 November 2023; understands that pancreatic cancer is the deadliest common cancer in Scotland and the UK, with more than half of people who are diagnosed dying within three months; further understands that survival rates have barely changed in 50 years; considers that data on the experience of patients with this disease is incredibly scarce and poor, leading to concerns of patients' voices being lost in the system; believes that support and information for patients with pancreatic cancer is often neither readily available nor forthcoming; applauds the work of the range of pancreatic cancer charities that do provide information and support for patients and their families; notes the view that more needs to be done to ensure that all patients get immediate and easy access to such support as soon as they are diagnosed, given that, it understands, currently only 12% of people diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in Scotland are using such support channels; commends all the charities and activist organisations and their dedicated supporters for their tireless efforts to raise awareness of pancreatic cancer, and wishes everyone involved with Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month every success in their endeavours.

#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*S6M-10585 Pam Gosal: Welcoming Black History Month October 2023 – Saluting Our Sisters—That the Parliament welcomes Black History Month, which will be celebrated throughout October 2023; notes that the 2023 Black History Month will be dedicated to honouring the achievements of black women who, it believes, are often forgotten heroines; understands that Black History Month is an event that recognises and celebrates what it sees as the invaluable contributions of black people to British society; considers that it serves as an opportunity to inspire and empower future generations; believes that the theme of the 2023 Black History Month, Saluting our Sisters, highlights the crucial role that black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change and building communities, and recognises that the aim of Black History Month is to learn about the effects of racism and challenge negative stereotypes.

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\*S6M-10583 Tess White: Recognising CHAS—That the Parliament commends the ongoing support that Children's Hospices Across Scotland (CHAS) provides in assisting children with life-shortening conditions; believes that, as the single specialist provider of hospice services for babies, children and young people (up to 21 years), CHAS provides vital support to young people and their families across Scotland when they need it most; recognises that during the 2022-23 period, CHAS has supported 57 children and families across the North East Scotland region, which has included 79 admissions for hospice care, 284 hospice bed nights (planned and unplanned), 179 home visits to 30 children and accepted nine new referrals; notes with great sadness that eight children, babies and young people, who received support from CHAS, have passed away during this period; further notes that, through working in partnership with NHS and local authorities, CHAS is able to offer integrated palliative and end of life care and respite for the whole family; acknowledges CHAS's aim of bringing treasured moments of joy in what are, without doubt, very difficult times, and praises the tireless efforts of staff and volunteers in providing this much needed service in the north east and throughout Scotland.

\*S6M-10582 Christine Grahame: World Animal Day, 4 October 2023—That the Parliament acknowledges World Animal Day on 4 October 2023; celebrates what it sees as the valuable contribution that animals make to everyone's lives; believes that it is of vital importance to unite to raise the status of animals and improve animal welfare standards; thanks Naturewatch Foundation, and all of the World Animal Day ambassadors, for their work to make the day a success, and wishes everyone a happy World Animal Day.

\*S6M-10580 Sandesh Gulhane: Volunteering Opportunities - World Athletics Indoor Championships Glasgow 2024—That the Parliament recognises that the 19th World Athletics Indoor Championships is taking place in Glasgow in 2024; celebrates that the Emirates Arena will host three days of world-class sporting action from 1 to 3 March, with some of the best athletes in the world competing for medals in 26 events as part of the biggest indoor athletics championships in the world; understands that up to 650 competitors, from more than 130 countries, are expected to take part in the championships; looks forward to another major sporting event taking place in Glasgow, 10 years on from the 2014 Commonwealth Games and five years on from the European Athletics Indoor Championships in 2019, further cementing what it sees as Scotland's reputation as a world-class sporting venue; believes that volunteers play an essential role in the running of the event; notes that there are plans to recruit around 400 volunteers to assist in the areas of event operations, sport operations and spectator experience; understands that volunteer recruitment is now open until 22 October 2023, and encourages anyone who can, and wants to be part of this exciting event, to sign up to volunteer.

\*S6M-10579 Donald Cameron: Success of Oban Motorfest 2023—That the Parliament congratulates the Oban and District Classic Vehicle Club on the success of the Oban Motorfest 2023; notes that 68 classic vehicles travelled from as far as Torphins in Aberdeenshire, and the Borders, to take part in the event in Station Square, with top attractions including Duffies Albion Lorry from Islay, Donnie McGillvray's old MacBraynes bus from Acharacle, and a fantastic military vehicle collection from Oban's Hugh McNeil; also congratulates Oban FM Roadshow for providing music and announcements, and greatly looks forward to the Oban Motorfest 2024.

\*S6M-10578 Meghan Gallacher: Shining Stars ASN Theatre School —That the Parliament congratulates the staff and students of the Shining Stars ASN Theatre School in Coatbridge on

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their ongoing work; notes that they have been working extremely hard on their upcoming Christmas concert, which will take place on 3 December 2023, and further notes the hard work and dedication that has been going into other upcoming activities, such as their ASN music festival, holiday camps and ASN award ceremonies.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.

For each Bill, the date of the next (or most recent) event in the Bill's passage is given. Other relevant information, e.g. about lodging amendments, is given in italics.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.
