*S6M-10641 Foysol Choudhury: Celebrating the Importance of the School Milk Scheme in Scotland on World School Milk Day.—That the Parliament celebrates what it sees as the importance of World School Milk Day, and agrees with the view that school milk is vital in Scotland; believes that it plays an important role in children's growth and development, and that the School Milk Scheme is a key tool for combating child poverty and food insecurity in Scotland; notes the view that the Scottish Government must launch the domestic replacement to the School Milk Subsidy Scheme as a priority, and work to deliver this scheme earlier than its deadline of the end of the current parliamentary session, and acknowledges the work that the School and Nursery Milk Alliance does in promoting both the nutritional benefits of milk and helping to raise awareness of existing milk schemes in Scotland, so that more children in Scotland have access to nutritious milk.

*<u>S6M-10638</u> Alexander Stewart: Asda Alloa Staff Member Aids Diabetic Customer—That the Parliament congratulates a member of staff at the Asda store in Alloa who aided a diabetic customer whilst they were suffering from a life-threatening hypoglycaemic attack; understands that

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quick-thinking Jacqui Anderson, a checkout operator at the store, spotted the signs whilst on shift at the checkouts, noticing the signs before the customer themselves realised; further understands that she recalled that the customer was on their own and was starting to lean against the checkouts, looking unwell, and appearing to be about to drop to the floor; understands that whilst Jacqui stayed with the customer, she was aware that they were becoming weaker and not getting any better; believes that she gave the customer a sugary drink and that this began to restore their blood sugar levels, which prevented them from being in a potentially serious situation within a matter of minutes; notes that "hypo" attacks occur when a diabetic person's blood sugar levels become too low, which can cause confusion, seizures, loss of consciousness and, if left untreated, can be life threatening; commends Jacqui on her quick thinking, and expresses its delight that the customer has made a full recovery.

*S6M-10637 Alexander Burnett: One Million Trees Campaign Shortlisted at the Nature of Scotland Awards—That the Parliament congratulates the River Dee Trust and Fishery Board for being shortlisted at the Nature of Scotland Awards for their One Million Trees campaign; further congratulates the Dee Catchment Project for also making it to the finals in the Landscape Restoration category; notes that the River Dee's upper catchment is home to the threatened Atlantic salmon, which is a keystone species of the local ecosystem and relies on the trees for shade and water retention; commends all those involved in the campaign for being on track to reach the half-million planting milestone in 2024, with the aim to plant one million trees by 2035, which it sees as an incredible feat in protecting the biodiversity of the River Dee, and wishes them well in the finals of the Nature of Scotland Awards ceremony. *S6M-10636 Jackie Dunbar: Centenary of the BBC's First Broadcast in Aberdeen—That the Parliament celebrates the centenary of the first broadcast by the BBC in the city of Aberdeen; considers that, from the first live radio transmission on the evening of 10 October 1923, the BBC in Aberdeen has contributed to the creative economy and cultural life of Scotland; believes that, over the decades since the first broadcast, the BBC base in the city has become a centre of excellence for traditional music and for content specialising in the environment and rural affairs, with expert output continuing to this day; recognises that Aberdeen is the only Scottish base outside of the central belt for BBC Studios, which is the commercial and production arm of the BBC, and notes what it sees as the importance of BBC Studios continuing to make TV programmes in the north east; celebrates the content made in Aberdeen for the BBC, including Landward, Beechgrove Garden, Granite Harbour, Travelling Folk, Take the Floor, Out of Doors and Scotland Outdoors, and wishes the BBC in Aberdeen a successful future as it enters its second century.

*S6M-10635 Alexander Stewart: Alloa Great War Staff Nurse Honoured with War Grave—
That the Parliament welcomes the news that what it sees as a widely-believed injustice has been righted for a nurse from Alloa who served in the Great War and has been honoured with a War Grave; understands that staff nurse Bessie Coltman was a nurse who showed tremendous courage and bravery during her service in Malta, and that for this she was awarded the Royal Red Cross during that period; believes that staff nurse Coltman was a civilian nurse prior to the outbreak of the First World War, then transferring to the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service in which she served overseas in the Dardanelles in 1915, and then in East and Central Africa in 1916; acknowledges that, in June 1916, nurse Coltman contracted malaria,

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eventually being sent home on sick leave in 1918, and died in the November of that year, having been awarded an MBE for devotion to duty a few months beforehand; believes that, while there were documents in Bessie's file highlighting that the authorities did regard the disabilities that she had as relating to her military duties, she had initially not been granted the status of a full military casualty, which would have entitled her to an entry on the War Graves' Register with a resultant War Grave, but that this has now been rectified following her story being brought to the attention of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission; notes that, as well as her name appearing on St Mungo's Church and Alloa's War Memorials, her story has also been highlighted in a book focusing on the impact that the Great War had on Alloa, named *In the Forefront: Alloa at War 1914-1919*, by former principal teacher of History at Alloa Academy, Andrew Hunt; commends Bessie posthumously for her tireless work in the field, and acknowledges that she is buried in Sunnyside Cemetery, Alloa.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
