***[S6M-12125](#) Tess White: Celebrating 50 Years of Ninewells Hospital, Dundee**—That the Parliament congratulates Ninewells Hospital and Medical School, in Dundee, on reaching its 50th year; notes that it welcomed its first patient to the new building on 31 January 1974; understands that it was the first new teaching hospital to be built in the UK since the 19th century; further understands that the hospital blazed a trail as the first to have a school of medicine integrated into the modern build; recognises that long-serving staff, along with one of the first patients to be treated in Ninewells, were treated to a celebration event on the hospital's concourse to mark the 50th anniversary, and wishes Ninewells Hospital Board, staff and patients all the very best for the next 50 years.

***[S6M-12122](#) Tess White: City of Brechin Pipe Band, Scotland's Oldest Civilian Pipe Band**—That the Parliament recognises the City of Brechin Pipe Band as Scotland's oldest civilian pipe band, which dates back to 1878; notes the recent recovery from damage to its hall, as a result of Storm Babet; understands that the storm caused significant damage to the building, instruments and band kit; appreciates the effort of the band to set up a Crowdfunder page to raise vital funds to help the band recover; understands the 20 playing members are hoping to return to the competitive circuit for the first time in nearly a decade; recognises the strong local connections that the band has from playing at annual events across Brechin and Angus, such as Glamis Extravaganza, and wishes it well for the busy summer calendar ahead.

***[S6M-12117](#) Liam McArthur: 200 Years of RNLI**—That the Parliament thanks the Royal National Lifeboat Institution (RNLI) for 200 years of life-saving work; understands that the charity was founded on 4 March 1824 by Sir William Hillary, and that, throughout the past two centuries, it has worked across the UK and Ireland to save lives at sea; recognises that the charity has saved over 140,000 lives since its founding; pays tribute to the RNLI crew who volunteer to face challenging and sometimes dangerous situations, in an act of charity, and in particular to those more than 600

RNLI crew members who have lost their lives in service since 1824; notes the reliance of RNLI on community fundraisers, which play a vital role in the functioning of the organisation; believes that the organisation represents some of the best of the humanitarian spirit in the country, especially in coastal and island communities, and hopes for many more years of bravery and service from RNLI.

***[S6M-12116](#) Michelle Thomson: Strathcarron Hospice Fundraising Efforts Raise £7,000—**
